June 20 is coming—and it is the longest day in the year. Sunrise at 5:43 a.m. and Sunset at 8:09 p.m. It is the summer solstice which is marked and sometimes celebrated around the world. When we moved to Alaska we looked forward to that long sunshine day because we had lived through the short dark days. Since we weren't at the very top of the world we didn't have 24 hours of dark, but the sun on December 21 would rise a bit after 10 a.m. and set a bit after 3:30 p.m. On that first June solstice day for us it was light all night long, at least light enough for me to read a book outside at midnight. While people didn't exactly dance in the streets there were celebrations and road races...

What surprised me though was that as difficult as the long dark winter days were for so many, the long summer days were difficult too. There was so much light people didn't rest and sleep. They were tired enough that found themselves without the energy to enjoy the sun and the light as they had expected. It occurred to me, think about this that we really do need both. We need the light, but we also need the dark. We need to light to brighten the day, to shine hope upon us, to awaken us to all the possibilities which just might be in our future. We need the light of God's love and God's grace to remind us of the light of Easter morn, when Jesus rose from the dead.

But I think we need the dark too. We need to be swaddled in quiet, we need to have relief from all that the light of day brings to us. We need to be able to close our eyes against a sun whose light glares at us. We need to be able to be swaddled in the dark without distraction so that we can think, and wonder and pray. We need to be able to rest our bodies and our hearts and our souls if only so that when the new day comes we are ready to become all that God has called us to be. We need to see the moon rise in the night so that we can rejoice when the sun rises in the morning. This year I will be in St. Louis at our NACCC annual meeting on June 20, and I think I will make a point of being somewhere outside so that I can catch the last hours of light, and welcome the evening dusk. You might want to do the same wherever you may be, and let the splendor of the solstice bring you close again to our Creator.
