

This year there is one of those remarkable synergistic moments in our life as a church—that is when two great things come together in "perfect harmony."

May 19 is Pentecost Sunday---the Sunday when we celebrate the birthday of the church. Pentecost was a harvest festival 50 days after the Passover, and many people came to Jerusalem to celebrate. It was also the first time that all those who were Christian were together in the same place at the same time. The Holy Spirit swept upon them and they were united into a community of faith and began meeting in smaller groups—the first churches.

May 19 is also the day of the 73rd Annual Meeting of the Congregational Church of the Chimes. 

Is it Okay to Pray Boldly?

"Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, pray. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns. Before you know it, a sense of God's wholeness, everything coming together for good, will come and settle you down. It's wonderful what happens when Christ displaces worry at the center of your life." Philippians 4:6-7

When I was young, I only prayed before I went to sleep. It was a prayer my mother said when she was young, passed down from her mother who said it with her mother. There is something special about prayers passed down from generation to generation and I felt good reciting this prayer over and over. But as I got a bit older, I realized there should be more to prayer than just the "nighttime, kneeling at the side of my bed prayer", but I didn't have a clue as to how to pray more. Then the Bible came into my life and things started to fall into place. Although I was still reticent as to how to pray, I figured whatever I said to God would be ok, even really big asks. And you know what? This was, and is, OK!

I was reading my devotional the other day and the daily story was about a three-year-old who was in thoughtful prayer witnessed by her grandmother. In the little one's prayer she asked God for unicorns to be made real. Now we might laugh at this little girl asking such a prayer. But if you think about it, she was uninhibited in her relationship with God, and asked boldly from her heart for something she really wanted!

What faith the little girl had. With all our daily comings and goings, it's not difficult to lose our joyful, trusting, and wide-eyed faith. The world around us is spiraling, and unicorn prayers might seem inappropriate. I ask though, why not pray boldly with a childlike faith asking God for big, bold things? Let's be honest, we all experience times when our faith feels small, when we don't dare hope and ask God for really big things ~ like big-time healing or full understanding of a difficult situation. We need to be cognizant in these times, God is the God of the impossible! SO, let's take a page from the unicorn praying toddler and not hesitate to pray to God for the big, seemingly impossible things. Remember, God will always be there for you. Let's all have a unicorn childlike faith and pray boldly! Blessings and hugs, Jane
