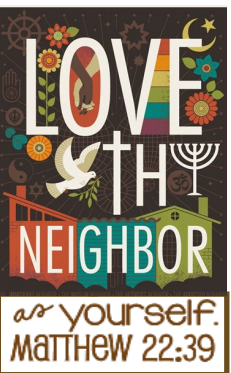

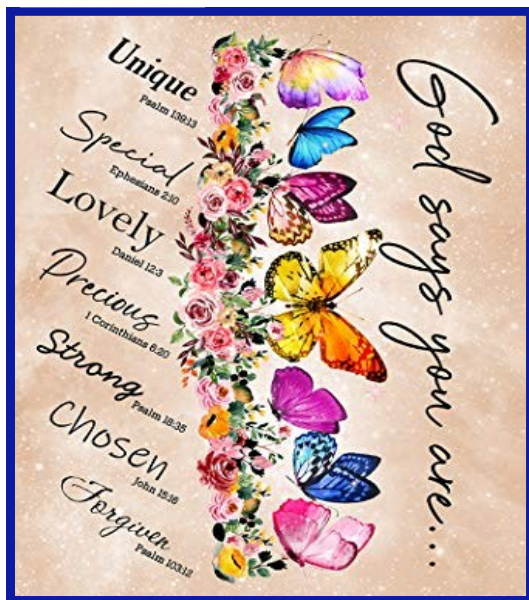

LENTEN SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues for 40 days. Our worship services will observe the season as a time of preparation for the cross and the empty tomb. Below is the upcoming schedule of events leading to the Easter celebration in April.

- April 10 :** On **Palm Sunday** we will have palms and hear the story of Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem. Our youth will host the Stations of the Cross after the Worship Service.
- April 14:** During the **Maundy Thursday** evening service we will share the Lord's Last Supper and, in a darkening sanctuary, the words of the betrayal and arrest of Jesus will be heard.
- April 15: Good Friday Service** will be at noon as we hear the solemn and dark words of the crucifixion of our Lord, and have the opportunity to reflect in both spoken word and in silence on His death.

We enjoy creating seasonal as well as timely crafts: Check out this collection of rocks that we recently painted, with sunflowers, and placed around campus in support of Ukraine!

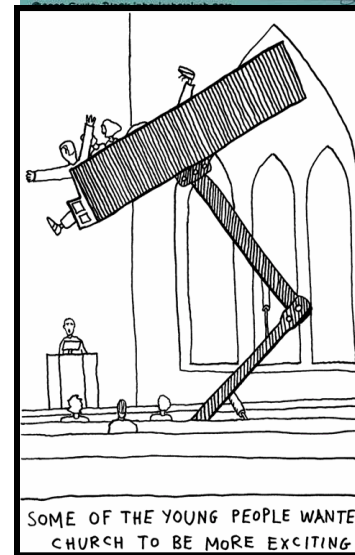
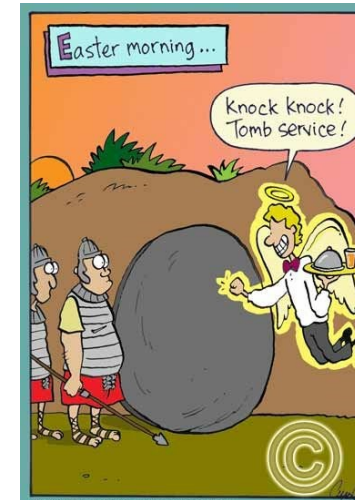

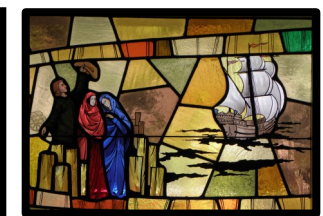

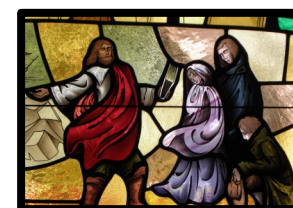
