STAVES CHAPEL ~ STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

When the Chapel was dedicated in 1952 the windows were of plain glass; the stained glass windows depicting the history of Congregationalism from our roots in England to the founding of Church of the Chimes replaced the plain glass over the years through designated memorial gifts. The fourth of the Chapel's fourteen stained glass windows, entitled "Mayflower Sails" is featured below:



4: MAYFLOWER SAILS:

Around August of 1620, 102 brave men and other determined people, Pilgrim and non-Pilgrim set sail from Plymouth, England on the merchant ship, Mayflower. The trip lasted 66 days.


