#### ST. NICHOLAS AND CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS


Did you know that St. Nicholas was a real person, a bishop who lived in Turkey in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century? He was renowned for his generosity, particularly toward children. One of the most famous stories about him was his secret gift of a small amount of gold to three very poor sisters so that they each had a dowry and could marry and avoid being sold into slavery. St. Nicholas threw gold into their home that landed in stockings they were drying by the fireplace.

A tradition started in Europe and the night before his feast day children would leave a pair of shoes filled with carrots and hay outside their front door. The carrots and hay were a present for St. Nicholas' horse as he made his rounds. These generous children woke the next morning to find St. Nicholas had left them a present which frequently included a piece of citrus fruit which symbolized the original gift of gold. Today's candy canes represent his Bishop's staff.

In Holland St. Nicholas was known as Sinterklass. When the early Dutch settlers came to New York in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century they brought their holiday traditions with them, and Sinterklass became known as Santa Claus. A kindly old man delivering presents to children via a sleigh. Christmas stockings, oranges in the stockings; leaving milk and cookies for Santa Claus and candy canes are all traditions which stem from the original St. Nicholas.


#### **Hayley Cabral**

#### **STAVES CHAPEL ~ STAINED GLASS WINDOWS**

The Chapel was dedicated on February 1952; at that time, the windows were of plain glass. The stained glass windows depicting the history of Congregationalism from our roots in England to the founding of Church of the Chimes replaced the plain glass over the years through designated memorial gifts.

Below is the 16th of the Chapel's eighteen stained glass windows with an overview of its significance. On the opposite page are the previous fifteen windows that were featured in the last fifteen editions of Chiming In.



#### **16: FOUNDING OF THE CHURCH OF THE CHIMES:**

On Sunday morning, June 4, 1950, twenty-four Congregationalists gathered at the Encino Theater (16342 Ventura Blvd.) for the first service of the Church of the Chimes. The church had been organized earlier at the home of its minister, Rev. Walter H. Staves. Services were held in the theater for several months while the growing church searched for a property that would provide a permanent home with a potential to expand. The window pane shows founding Minister Rev. Walter H. Staves (1950 to1978) and the church's first Associate Minister Glenn A. Rowles (September 1954 to May 1964).
