THE LENTEN SEASON BEGINS

After He was baptized in the River Jordan, Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness where he was tempted by the devil. It was a time of prayer and strengthening.

The season of Lent is the forty days before Easter, as we too have a time of prayer and strengthening and repentance. The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday, when we are invited to come before God to ask God's presence, God's love and God's forgiveness. Often people "give something up" as a reminder of the sacrifice of Jesus and the presence of God in our lives.

The tradition of our church has been to celebrate communion on Ash Wednesday, and to have times of study and reflection as we anticipate the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ.

PROMISES KEPT!

But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

~2 Peter 3:8-9

Have you ever prayed for something with such an immediate need, only to feel like you waited forever to see the answer? Things don't happen when we expect them to. We might experience doubt and even try to control things on our own when we don't see God at work in our time frame. Peter tells us that the passing of time is very different for God. God is not limited by hours in a day or by the number of days in a year. 2 Peter 3:8 says that to God, "A day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day."

Peter goes on to say that God, "is not slow in keeping his promise as some understand slowness." It may seem like time is going by slowly and our situation isn't changing, but in reality, God may be doing something that we simply can't see from our human perspective. God tells us that He is patient with us, wanting every one of us to know Him (2 Peter 3:9). In moments when we feel like God is not responding to our circumstances, He may be showing His patience with the people He so dearly loves.

God's ultimate goal is for us to know Him, not necessarily to know the answer to our prayer. God will always keep His promises in His perfect, patient timeline. Let us pray:

Dear Lord, you promised never to leave me alone nor to abandon me in my time of need. Even when I can't feel your presence, I know that you are near. Thank you for your faithfulness Lord. Teach my heart to rest in you. Let me learn to be patient and anxious for nothing. I trust you, God, even when I can't trace you. In Jesus Name. Amen.


⇒ SUPER BOWL—Chiefs vs Buccaneers— FEBRUARY 7 at 3:30pm

TRUSTEE NEWS

Greg Abbott, Chair

By now COTC members should have all received a copy of the 2021 budget that will be discussed and voted upon at the **ZOOM** Congregational meeting on February 6 at 12:00 noon. I'd like to go over a little bit of where we were and where we believe we are headed.

For 2020, we were looking at operating loses of just over \$368,000. Due to better than expected income from the pre school and film industry, plus the Payroll Production loan, we ended up with a loss of just over \$221,000.

For 2021, we have made cuts to, among others, budgets of several boards, reduction in the maintenance budget, as well as to our annual contributions to Cal West. Most significantly we instituted an across the board 5% payroll cut. We are anticipating a second Payroll Protection loan of \$40,000. This will leave us with an anticipated deficit of just over \$150,000. Needless to say this leaves us more than ever dependent on keeping up with the estimates of giving. Thank you to each and everyone of you for your gifts.

Let us all pray for a recovery that allows the 2022 budget to be balanced and to restores the cuts we made this year.
