I REMEMBER The Church Truck Walt Staves

Almost immediately after the church property was purchased, it became obvious that a truck was needed to use both on and off campus. Money was tight (or else the Staves family wouldn't have been living in Hamilton House!), so buying a truck, even used, was out of the question.

Instead, Andy Miller, the male half of the new on-site custodian couple, Andy & Alice Miller, along with the help of his son-in-law, created one!

Starting with a 1935 Plymouth 4-door sedan, they cut off most of the body, including the doors, rear fenders, and the back half of the roof. What remained were the front seat, floor, front fenders, hood, and the front half of the roof, ending just behind the front seat.

A wooden partition was built behind the seat to support the remaining roof, with a rectangular cutout, to provide a 'rear window'. In place of the rear seat and trunk, a wooden bed with low sides was constructed.

Today, besides being illegal, such a vehicle would certainly stand out. In the early 1950s, the days before tougher vehicle safety laws, in the rural setting of the Valley, the 'truck' fit right in; and it was licensed and insured without any problems.

Most of the driving was done by teenage boys (insurance coverage was different then), in a style that you would expect. I frequently rode along, and it was much more entertaining than most carnival rides of the day! No doors or seat belts, no handholds, lots of wind, few cops, and a young male driver, made for a wild ride!

Turning left was especially exciting for the passenger, since there was nothing to keep you from flying out during the turn. It was best to plan ahead, and grab something sturdy (not the gear shift), to remain in your seat. Thankfully, no one rode in the bed, but only because it was too small to do so, and carry cargo at the same time.

The truck got used on campus quite a bit as well. When it was moved from place to place, you never knew who would jump in and drive, or if they were paying any attention. I once had my foot run over (with no consequence — it was a light truck, even loaded), by an inattentive driver, who was busy flirting with the girls.

This primitive era ended nine years later, when Fred Young, a member of the church, and a partner in Wray Brothers Ford, helped the church buy a new 1959 Ford pickup. What a difference!

I learned how to drive a stick shift on the new truck. It was stored at our house, which was only a block down the street from the church. Vehicles were ridiculously easy to hotwire back then, so when no one was home, I would drive it up and down, up and down our long driveway.

By this time, there were insurance restrictions on under 25 year old male drivers, so I couldn't drive it on the street very often; only when Dad and the Trustees deemed it important to the church. Being a teenaged male and car crazy, I was always available!

At one time the national church of the Hawaiian Kingdom and chapel of the royal family, Kawaiahao is popularly known as Hawaii's Westminster Abbey. It is built of coral blocks many feet thick, which were quarried from an off shore reef. The first service of this famous and historic church in Hawaii was held on April 24, 1820.

Church of the Chimes has had a long relationship with the Kawaiahao Church, because of the close friendship of their ministers. Dr. Abraham Akaka and Dr. Walter Staves.

In late June of 1964, Dr. and Mrs. Walter Staves and three of their children escorted 36 teenagers and their chaperones to Hawaii, to help refurbish parts of the church, and to visit many sites of historic interest. The youngsters had worked to save money for the trip, while studying the



history and culture of the islands in preparation for this excursion.

On August 14th and 15th of the same year, 45+ members of the Kawaiahao Church Choir presented concerts of sacred anthems, in both Hawaiian and English, in Fellowship Hall. This performance was part of their cross-country tour that would include performances at New York's World Fair, and the White House, to entertain President Lyndon Johnson and the first family.

The pageantry of the concert was woven with narration, chants, songs, dances and instruments, which portrayed the culture of Hawaii and its native people. The compositions were enriched and sung with great ease and much clarity, by vibrant and pleasant Hawaiian voices.

The choir had its beginning in the days of royalty, when Queen Liliuokalani, then a princess, directed the choir. The present Kawaiahao Choir is organized with officers and music staff members, all working toward developing the highest standard of Christian worship through music. Mr. Daniel Akaka, the Church's Minister of Music, is the Choir Director.

An interesting note is the fact that almost none of the choir members have had any specific voice training, other than the vocal exercises in their weekly rehearsals. The quality of their tones is sou -expressed, a rare gift that this group strives to maintain. The wonderful music of these devoted Christian lay people does much to Glorify God in the Highest.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH

Jeanette Barnes'
Chocolate Caramel Nut Delights
(Soda Cracker Cookies)

40 Soda Crackers 1 ½ Cups Packed Light Brown Sugar

1 ½ Cups Butter 1 ½ Cups Semisweet Chocolate Chips

1 Cup Walnuts (generous), Chopped Fine

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Line a large rimmed cookie sheet with aluminum foil and grease it well. Line pan with soda crackers.

In a medium saucepan, melt the butter. Add the brown sugar and cook, stirring until it dissolves. Bring to a boil and cook for about 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Immediately pour the mixture over the soda crackers.

Bake for 3 to 5 minutes, or until the mixture bubbles to the center.

Spread the chocolate chips over the hot cookies. Let sit for a minute or so to melt the chocolate, then use a knife or spatula to spread the chocolate evenly over the top. Sprinkle with chopped walnuts. Let cool, then cut into cookie size bars. Makes 40.

DECEMBER MEETING REPORT

Good news from Trustees - we are solvent. This has a lot to do with the income we receive from the entertainment industry, with parking and on-site shoots (thank you Joi). Without that income, we would not be making ends meet. The fact is, most independent Protestant Churches need outside income to balance their budgets. It's not like the old days when the giving from the congregation made up the major part of the budget.

I am encouraged by the fact that our stewardship campaign has yielded an increase in both the number of people and the amount. If you haven't yet submitted an *Estimate of Giving Card*, please do so ASAP as we will be submitting our budget to the Congregation, following church on January 26.

In other news, we have decided to bite the bullet, and submit a zoning variance, so we can proceed with the installation of our new sign. Also we have voted a cost of living adjustment of 4%, for the staff. This covers two years, as they did not get a COLA last year. We will review merit increases once we have input from the Personnel Committee.

The roofs over Dreier Hall, Bower Hall kitchen, and the school rooms have been repaired.

The Trustees will be hosting hospitality receptions in January.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD: Stories from the Field

Two young boys named Arjun* and Vihaan* were at their daily task of selling milk and bread when Aparna* asked them their names. As the three began a conversation, the boys smiled and Aparna invited them to her home. There she surprised the boys with *Operation Christmas Child* shoeboxes, and told them about Jesus Christ. (*Names changed for security)

The boys were so happy to listen to her Bible stories that they asked if they could bring their friends to hear them too. When the boys and girls came, Aparna offered them shoebox gifts and the Gospel as well. Excited, the children



kept coming back to learn more about Jesus. This was the beginning of a class of *The Greatest Journey* discipleship program. Thirty students from non-Christian backgrounds initially attended, and some began going to church services, bringing their parents to worship with them as well. Neighbors of another religion began asking them not to attend *The Greatest Journey*, but many of these children now believe in Christ and worship Him secretly.
