"So on the first Sunday after 30+ years of being a working girl I found my way here. I immediately felt welcomed and decided this was the church for me." That was just over ten years ago, and she still feels the same.

Though Sylvia had not been to church in a long time, she never stopped believing. She is very active in the church and has served on deacons, trustees, and helped in the lectern. An avid knitter, she helps supply some of the "prayer cloths" available for free in the narthex and church office. She also attends Beth's Brown Bag Bible Study on Tuesdays. Sylvia is in charge of our church's "Band of Prayer," a phone ministry used to keep people in prayer (feel free to ask her details about this important ministry).

Sylvia has been blessed with three children, plus in-law children, thirteen grandchildren, and seven great grandkids. Sylvia often sits in church, looks at the beautiful stained glass windows, and thinks about how blessed we all are to have God watching over us.

#### **VISION RENEWED**

And Hannah prayed, and said, "My heart rejoiceth in the Lord, mine horn is exalted in the Lord: my mouth is enlarged over mine enemies because I rejoice in thy salvation. There is none holy as the Lord; for there is none beside thee; neither is there any rock like our God." - 1 Samuel 2:1-2

A certain gentleman explains "After a painful minor surgery on my left eye, my doctor recommended a vision test. With confidence, I covered my right eye and read each line on the chart with ease. Covering my left eye, I gasped, "How could I not realize I'd been so blind?"

While this man adjusted to his new glasses and renewed vision, we are reminded how daily trials often cause us to be spiritually nearsighted. Focusing only on what we could see up-close—the pain and ever-changing circumstances—we sometimes become blind to the faithfulness of our eternal and unchanging God. With such a limited perspective, hope can become an unattainable blur.

First Samuel 1 tells the story of a woman who failed to recognize God's trustworthiness while focusing on her current anguish, uncertainty and loss. For years, Hannah had endured childlessness and endless torment from Peninnah, another wife of her husband, Elkanah. Hannah's husband adored her, but she was not able to find contentment. One day, Hannah cried out and prayed with bitter honesty. When Eli, the priest, questioned her, she explained her situation. He assured her that God would "grant her request" (1 Samuel 1:17). Though Hannah's situation didn't change immediately, she walked away with confident hope (v. 18).

Her prayer in 1 Samuel 2:1-2 reveals a shift in Hannah's focus. Even before her circumstances improved, Hannah's renewed vision changed her perspective and her attitude. She rejoiced in the ongoing presence of Godher rock and everlasting hope.

Today I want to encourage you to "look again"; God has not forgotten you. Your situation is not beyond repair. It only appears that way, when we can only see the problems we are facing. I challenge you to begin to tell your problems to your God. Change your focus to the things that are positive in your life. The enemy thought he was going to knock you out of the game. BUT GOD has a different plan, and you are still here!

God promises that He will see you through this. And you will live to see it happen. Command yourself to LIVE, LIVE, LIVE, LIVE, LIVE! *Believe it! Curtis*Reprint from July 2021 Chiming In



#### **RECIPE of the Month**

Evelyn Staves' POTATO SALAD (Walt's Favorite)

#### Ingredients:

2 pounds potatoes, peeled and diced (5+/- cups)
14 crips dill pickles, chopped
5 hard-boiled egg, chopped
1 cup celery, finely diced
½ cup onion or scallions, finely chopped

½ cup mayonnaise 5 Tablespoons dill pickle juice

1 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon white pepper

#### **Directions:**

Place potatoes in a large pot and add enough water to cover potatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat.

Cook 13-15 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Drain.

In a large bowl, combine mayonnaise, pickle juice, salt and pepper.

Add potatoes, pickles, hard-boiled eggs, celery, and onions.

Toss to coat thoroughly. Chill and then Serve.


