I love the hands on the front of this issue of “Chiming In.” I love the hands on the banner outside of our church which illustrates who we are “A diverse, loving Christian community accepting of all.” I love the hands that appear on our website....because of what they symbolize...because of what they remind me of from some 35 years ago.

It was May 25, 1986—the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend, when a lot of people weren’t home but somewhere else. After all, summer was beginning and the weekend has three days, so...why not? People got on planes and trains. People hit the highway. They went to beaches and campgrounds and to see grandpa and grandma or longtime friends from years gone by. They weren’t at home, they were well, somewhere else.

Except that day, in Sherman Oaks, California there were a lot of people who weren’t somewhere else, they were here. Right here—on the corner of Magnolia and Hazeltine at Congregational Church of the Chimes. At least we started out here and then, yes, we went somewhere else. We walked from here to Ventura Boulevard; where we were not alone. We joined a party of sorts.

May 25, 1986, was the day that there were “Hands Across America,” and since I couldn’t quite remember who started it, I looked it up (What did we do without Google?). I do remember standing on Ventura Boulevard, with people holding hands as far as I could see to the east and to the west...holding hands.

A man named Ken Dragen thought of it and created it. And it raised almost \$100,000,000 to fight famine in Africa and hunger and homelessness in the United States. We held hands and we sang. We sang “America the Beautiful” with Stevie Wonder whose voice bellowed from a loudspeaker. We heard a chorus singing, “We Are the World.” We stood and held hands in wonder and awe that we were, at that moment, with millions of others holding our hands all the way across the country.

So I love the hands on this cover, on our banner and on our website. Hands are instruments of our faithfulness. Hands work to help. Hands shake each other to welcome. Hands upon our hearts make promises and pledge our love and loyalty to our country. And when we hold hands with each other in affection and support, well, God is holding on too. 



A MISSION MOMENT: Hope of the Valley's Tiny Home Project

A Key to Someone's Future.

Fourteen of our church members were privileged to visit Reseda's Tiny House Village on May 29th. This is the 3rd village to open in our SFV under the combined efforts of the City of Los Angeles and the Hope of the Valley Rescue Mission.

The Tiny House Villages provide a house to those without shelter.



Each Tiny House is 64 sq.ft, has four windows, air conditioning, heating, two beds, a desk, storage, and a door that locks. The Tiny Homes sit in a village with 24/7 security guards, hygiene stations, showers, laundry rooms, 3 meals a day with outdoor eating areas, and even a dog park (they want to help both ends of the leash).

When a person is presented with the option of the Tiny House Community, they meet with a Case Manager who will guide them to receive the help they need to give them a fresh start in society. This includes Job Training, Job Placement, and equally important, a promising future full of hope.

So far we have received enough donations to support one Tiny Home (\$3,000), and we are on our way, as a congregation, to support a second one. It is all because of your generosity! Our goal is to receive enough money for this second home.

Both houses will be in the new Tarzana Village due to open this June. If you are interested in contributing towards a key to a home for one of God's struggling children, you can do so through the church (just note the donation is for the Tiny House Village).

Together we can help give a new life to those who want it.
