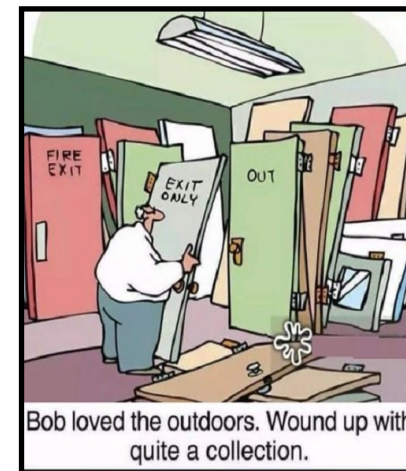

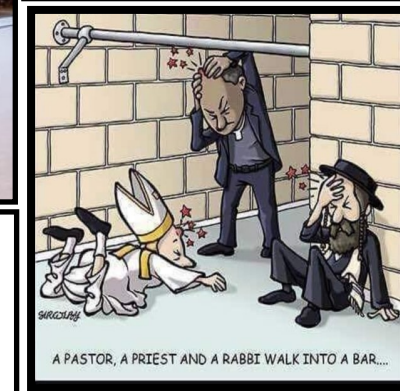
## GET AMUSED...

Bob loved the outdoors. Wound up with quite a collection.

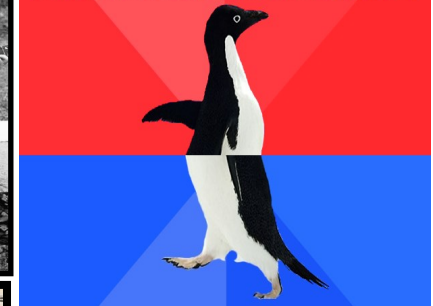

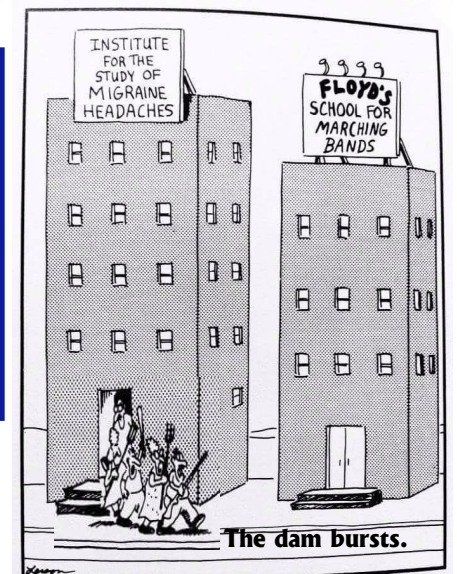
This little boy next door just opened his window and yelled what is 32 plus 7 so i yelled back its 39 and he said thank you god

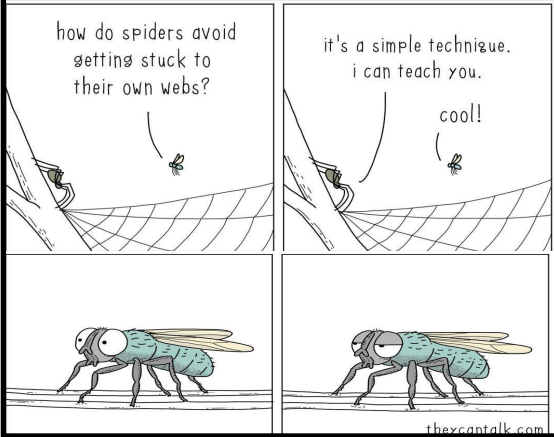
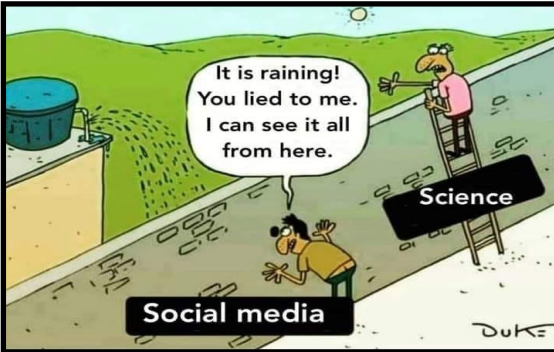


THINGS TO PONDER...

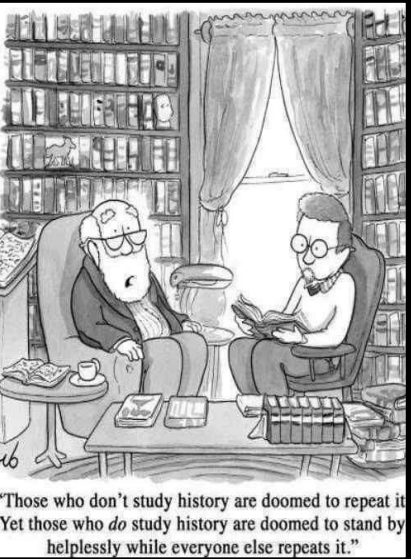

STAVES CHAPEL ~ STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

The Chapel's stained glass windows depict Congregationalism from our roots in England to the founding of Church of the Chimes in 1950. Pictured below with a description of its significance is the tenth of the Chapel's fourteen stained glass windows which is entitled "Anti Slavery". To the right of this and at bottom are the previous 9 of these windows which were detailed in earlier editions of Chiming In.

10 ANTI-SLAVERY:

Congregationalists, like the Beecher family and schools like Ohio's Oberlin and Lane Seminaries also led the way in social reform, especially women's rights and abolitionism. The American Missionary Association, formed in 1846, joined the denomination's anti-slavery zeal with its commitments to education and evangelism, and in the post-Civil War years established elementary schools, colleges, and theological seminaries across the South for the newly freed slaves.

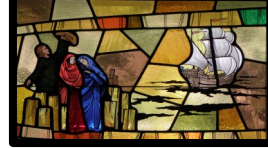

Back in the 1980's when I was furiously writing spec scripts in hopes of landing a career "in the industry," my father, a producer in television (and probably the only one around who didn't believe in nepotism - ARGH!) thought he'd give writing a try himself. I started reading one of his scripts once, but I had to give up. This time I wasn't reading to assess its value as a screenplay - I was just reading it as something that my father wrote. And the result was wonderful! I felt like I'd spent the entire afternoon with him, like I'd just gotten one of his much needed big bear hugs!

So write! Write your memoirs! Write your stories! Write your screenplays! Your essence will come through and linger in the words, and may even comfort some of your close friends or loved ones after you're gone.
