## MAY 2023 HAPPENINGS

## FAITHFULLY YOURS

Do you ever have thoughts that swirl in your head, stuff that worries you or annoys you or angers you? Have you ever lain awake at night not able to sleep because of everything that you didn't do that you should have done, or even the things you did that you shouldn't have done? I know I have...

It is called, I understand from psychology "Rumination." Rumination is what cows do, chewing something over and over again...for us chewing over things without ever coming to any peaceful understanding. There is hope however!

A friend pointed out the other day that in our lives of faith, our ruminations can be what St. Ignatius would have called "desolation." Desolation comes in those times and places in our lives which keep us from being close to God, being one with God, being swaddled by God.

What we seek then is "consolation," those moments of depth and calm when we understand God really is with us-not that God isn't always with us but we understand that God is close and near. For we have reconnected with the Holy Spirit, we have walked upon the path that Jesus set before us, we have once again touched our faith which is so much deeper and so much more powerful than all the annoyances and distractions and anxieties and worries which keep us awake at night and disrupt our hearts and minds in the day.

How does that happen? Perhaps as simply and quietly as going back to a time when God was close, when we felt so deeply God's love. Maybe then we begin by looking back to find that time, that place and hold on to it, cherish it.

Because wondrously, when we reconnect to God, when we welcome the Holy Spirit into our lives we are strong again. We can face the challenges, the problems, the difficulties with a clearer mind and a fuller heart and the strength and determination to live through even the most difficult consequences. Because we are not alone. The One who watches over us is with us.

And the words of Jesus to his disciples the night he was betrayed echo in our hearts:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives, give I to you.
Let not your heart be troubled; neither let it be afraid.

## THE BEAUTY OF OUR SANCTUARY

The magnificent stained glass window at the front of the Sanctuary was donated by church members as a memorial to Dr Walter Staves. In front of it is a 17 foot tall silver cross, designed by silversmith Allan Adler. Fabricated from treasures contributed by the members, it was worked into a gleaming symbol, representing the faith of the congregation.
"I AM ALPHA AND OMEGA..." ~ Contributed by Stan Dong
The beautiful stain glass panels that bracket the Magnolia Doors contain the symbols alpha and omega, i.e., the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet. In physical and biological sciences, alpha is associated with names such as alpha rays, alpha particles or alpha dog; and omega is the unit of resistance in an electric circuit or the unit of circular frequency of natural vibration. For us Congregationalists, these Greek letters refer to the Book of Revelation (verses 1:8, 21.6 and 22.13). It relates to the phrase "I am Alpha and Omega," an appellation of Jesus meaning that He is the beginning and end of all things. Another way of saying this is that God is forever.

These stain glass panels were a gift from Fred and Anita Young, in loving memory of their one and only grandchild, Monique, who unfortunately perished very soon after her high school graduation in Vancouver, British Columbia in an auto accident.

Fred and Anita emigrated to the United States from Canada after his service in the Royal Canadian Armed Forces during WWII. This writer recalls the romantic story of their wedding at the historic Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel in Alberta. Fred came to Southern California and was in Real Estate most of his career. Anita was a teacher in LA Unified School District. At COTC they served with love and distinction on the Board of Deacons; the two were very devoted to the spiritual life of our church. Fred and Anita were also quite prominent at our annual Golden West Fair. They ran the garden booth. All year long, they would grow and nurture impatients, vincas and red foliage perennials for the fair. Fred also acquired exotic items such as banana trees. Their booth was quite lucrative, grossing over 1000 dollars in many years. Many of us (elders!) enjoyed working in their booth because it was always under the majestic oak tree beside the pool, obviously for its shade during the two hot September days of the fair.

It was not too long after their gift that they decided to move back to Vancouver, BC (around the turn of the century) to be closer to their only son and daughter-in-law in their retirement.

The dedication to the stained glass window at the front of the Sanctuary will be presented in next month's edition of Chiming In.
