
David's life was not trouble free and neither will yours or mine be. The key is "faith" in God.

What's red, green, leaves before Thanksgiving, and arrives before Christmas? If you guessed the Samaritan Purse Shoeboxes, you are correct! Yes, it's that time of year again. The 2023 deadline to fill the shoeboxes is Sunday, November 19th, so we can take them to be shipped on the 20th.

After describing how the Samaritan rescued a hurting man whom others had passed by, Jesus told His hearers, Go and do likewise. Our goal again this year is 100 boxes, but we're changing things up a bit on how you can participate:

JANE'S CORNER

Helping Hands... Fueled by Food, Fed by Compassion" "Each one of us can make a difference. Together we make a change." ~Barbara Milukski, Social Worker

Each Friday I am part of a team of volunteers who help unload between 4,000 and 10,000 pounds of food for the North Hollywood Interfaith Food Pantry into the basement of Temple Beth Hillel, where the Pantry packs the bags of food we distribute to those in need in our area. As the person who purchases the food, I am hyper aware of what needs to be done weekly. I manage the process of getting food from the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank as well as purchasing from a wholesaler. It's a weekly juggling act as we have seen the numbers of people coming to our distribution site increase exponentially. We used to average roughly 340 bags per week, we are now at roughly 450 per week and the numbers keep climbing higher. On top of that, the cost of food for the bags has gone up from about \$9.50 per bag, to about \$13.50+ a bag.

The NHIFP serves people without judgement and as our tagline so aptly states, we are fueled by food, and we feed with compassion. Our clients and neighbors are so grateful for all the Pantry does for them. Seeing the faces of relief and gratitude when our clients are handed a bag is a very humbling experience. After working the distribution line, I'm both exhausted and energized knowing we have helped put food on the table for some, and for others who are unhoused, we have provided much needed nutrition as they navigate the streets to exist.

I write this article requesting a couple of "asks" – for monetary donations to help purchase the food, donations of food and for people power to help at the distribution site and pack bags at the temple. If you are so inclined to help, reach out and we can talk. I guarantee you will personally benefit from what you do more than you can even imagine! As the saying goes, it takes a village, and it's heartwarming to help our neighbors in need!
