



STAVES CHAPEL ~ STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

From our roots in England to the founding of our Church of the Chimes, the history of Congregationalism is depicted in the Staves' Chapel's stained glass windows. The fourteenth of the Chapel's eighteen stained glass windows is pictured below with a description of its significance, and below it are the thirteen windows that were presented in previous editions of Chiming In.

"14: SPREAD OF MISSIONS TO THE WORLD"



Congregationalists and Presbyterians sponsored an impressive array of voluntary organizations, including some of the earliest on the behalf of foreign missions. Within a few years, the American Board of **Commissioners for Foreign** Missions (ABCFM) was formed (1810) and sent some of the first American Protestant missionaries to

other lands. Quickly following, the American Home Missionary Society (1826), the American Education Society and similar groups began as cooperative efforts with other Protestant churches, but were spearheaded primarily by Congregationalists.
