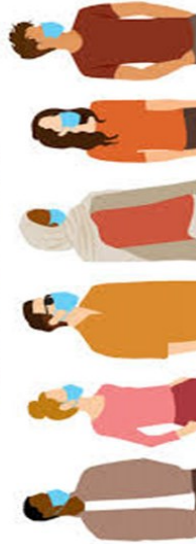

FAITHFULLY YOURS

Suppose you were one of the original Congregationalists this month. Suppose you had moved from England to Holland so you could worship God freely, as you felt the Scriptures called you to worship. Suppose you joined the group who decided that they longed to be in a land of their own, where they could speak their language and worship God, and live within a culture they knew. If you were, do you know where you would be this month?

You would be on a ship called the Mayflower in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean hoping and praying that the rough autumn seas were not too rough, and that you could survive being stuffed inside with over 100 other people. You would be watching the horizon for the sight of land, not wanting to realize you were weeks away from a New World where you were all going to live together in faith, fellowship and freedom.

You were taking your past, the world that you knew and bringing it to a new time and place. You would be facing challenges you had never imagined, which would threaten all you knew and all you were, but you were also on the brink of the freedom your faith had longed for, for so long. You would be bouncing around in the middle of the ocean, not sure where this bumpy voyage would end.

Somehow it feels as if we are on a ship like that these days. The world we knew seems farther and farther behind us, and our future is still hard to see. We have learned from our past, certainly, but now we are aware that there will be major changes in how we live—as citizens of the nation, as citizens of the world, but most deeply as faithful followers of Jesus.

And, it is true that the ship did not land where they expected it to land. Instead of in British territory the first land they saw was the very tip of Cape Cod, hundreds of miles north of their destination. Yet they survived. They survived by their courage, their determination and their faith.

Let us remember them. Their journey took them to unexpected places, with tough and difficult challenges. But they survived.

So can we. So will we. As citizens of our nation, and as citizens of the world, and as followers of Jesus, we will not simply survive, we will flourish with a faith grown stronger by wild seas and strong winds, and a God who will watch over us always.

**PRESCHOOL NEWS**

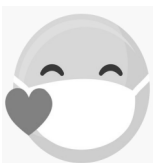

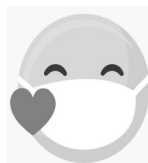

**DEACON NEWS**

Although the Deacons have not met in person, we do connect by email, text, and phone. Since I couldn't attend the Council in September, Martha Smyser went in my place. She reported about her job as Corresponding Secretary sending out birthday cards to members and about donations given to support the Angel Fund. There were questions about what the Angel Fund is for, so she explained its purpose.

Here is the background and how it functions. It was originally called the Deacons Fund, but in about 2014, the name was changed to the Angel Fund to distinguish it from regular deacons' expenses which come from the General Fund of the church. This fund was set up many years ago to help members and friends of the church and our local community in times of emergency or crisis.

The distributions are kept confidential by the pastors who grant needed amounts to those in need. Only a record of amounts is kept by the Deacons' treasurer. The money comes from donations placed in the communion envelopes on communion Sundays or by specified donations given to the fund at other times. This money is not to be used for any church expenses by any group. It is a source of charity for those in need.

The money is paid directly to whom the money is owed, such as rent, utility bill, and/or medical bill, and not to the person requesting it. No records are kept of people's names. Money from the fund is also used to purchase groceries, gas cards, and bus passes that are kept in the church office for smaller immediate needs. We are grateful for the donations that are still being made to the Angel Fund.

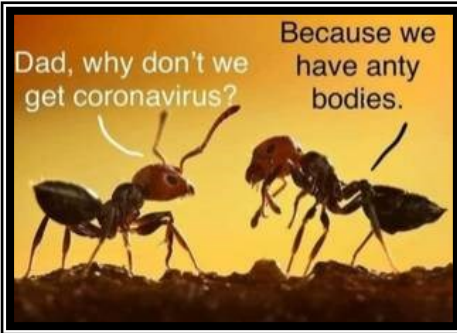

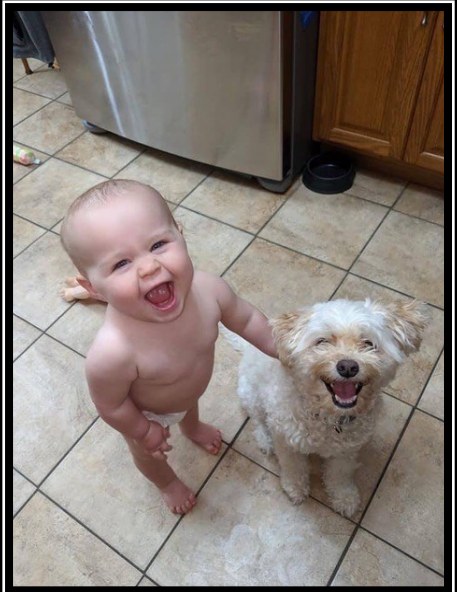

TRUSTEE NEWS

The Trustees met on September 29. Funds to repair a number of sections of sidewalk were approved, plus the installation of an additional drain on the walk way east of Hamilton House. This will hopefully prevent the occasional water intrusion that has occurred at the North door of the Sanctuary. The chapel roof replacement project will begin the second week of October.

Needless to say, our biggest item of discussion was our current financial situation. Our biggest single source of revenue, facility rental, has all but evaporated. AquaBuddies continues to rent the pool. The Preschool is back in session albeit with limited enrollment. We are now beginning to see some activity from the film/advertising industries.

As we are allowed to reopen the campus for worship and other activities, we will be able to begin rentals on a limited basis. Obviously, none of this will come close to balancing our budget. Therefore, Jack Hendershot and Curtis Leseman have been assigned to work with Treasurer, John Van Veen, to go over the budget to identify ways to save money. The goal is to minimize the impact on services and personnel, while limiting the intrusion into our Endowments.

As I have said in the past, we need to increase the proportion of our income that comes from the congregation. As you are able, please consider giving a little extra. Till next month, **Greg**

ZOOM Discussion: The Church and Racial Equity
Sunday, November 8, 1 p.m.

We had a terrific ZOOM discussion in September when we talked about our own backgrounds, and also how we as Christians, and we as the church can be instruments of racial justice. An interview with Dr. Bernice King, youngest daughter of Dr. Martin Luther King sparked our conversation.

We want to continue the discussion and would love to have everyone be a part! We will meet again by ZOOM on Sunday, November 8th at 1 pm. There are two books which some are reading. Why are the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria by Beverley Daniel Tatum, Phd.; She is an active Congregationalist and psychologist, and she hopes her book will help people talk about racial identity as a beginning of healing. Where do we go from here? Community and Chaos by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; This book addresses how we as a church can be transforming.

We have copies of the books if you would like to read them. Regardless, let us know if you are interested in participating in the discussion and we will send you the ZOOM link that week.

A Moment in Time ~ Time Capsule 2020

All COTC kids, church members and friends, one and all: Create your time capsule stories! Document your feelings in this extraordinary time of our lives. Write short letters and stories that will include; notes of how we are feeling and a note to your future self, in a sealed envelope for your eyes only! Put everything in a baggie and bring it to the church to put in a collection box set up right outside the church office door. Or, if you'd like, we can pick it up from you. Start thinking and crafting your stories! We'll finish the collection at the end of October. Once we can all be together again, we'll put all of them in a large container and have a ceremony to read the time capsule letters from 1997 and dig a hole to bury the new one.
