## **FROM OUR SENIOR MINISTER**

### **FAITHFULLY YOURS**

I love baseball, and it was really hard for me to start a spring without it. I have loved baseball since I was a kid and it was inevitable that our son would love baseball too. For a while, before it got too expensive and our schedules got too crazy, we had part of a season ticket package to the Anaheim Angels.

Going to games was a family delight. We had seats near enough to the field that Teddy could get autographs nearly every game (this was when attendance was hovering below the 20,000 fan threshold). We loved yelling and screaming. The greatest moments were, not surprisingly during the 2002 World Series. We had some tickets for some games. I lost my preaching voice the Saturday night when the Angels came back in the 7<sup>th</sup> inning overcoming a Giants' lead to win the game and play for the championship the next night. My husband and son lost their voices when the Angels won the Series (while I was at the church Halloween party.) There was nothing like being in a loud, crazy happy screaming winning crowd.

Which means that although baseball is back, and nine men take the field and pitch and hit and catch, the other half of the game is gone—the fans. Oh, in some stadiums there are cardboard cutouts of fans which pretend to be real. In fact in one game a staff person replaced the poor guy who had been hit and knocked over by a home run ball. And there are loudspeakers with someone playing recordings of fans yelling appropriately for a good play or a bad play or a strikeout or a home run.

But the strangest thing has happened the more games I hear. I am beginning to believe those yells. I am beginning to identify the fans in the seats. I am beginning to forget that this is a short season with new rules in empty stadiums.

In some ways, I realize, it isn't all that different from our own worship except the sense that you are in the pews is real. Every Sunday we look out and we see your faces. Every Sunday we bow our heads and we hear your voices joining us in prayer. Every Sunday, and every day when we do our 10 at 10 devotions, we feel you all close.

Because, you see, we don't need cardboard cut outs or fake noise to make God real. God is real! God is here! And God is gathering us together even though we might be, in only some ways, far apart.

Just know that whenever our doors do open, our smiles will be broad and our hearts will burst. But in the meantime our faces wear God's smile. Our eyes see God's love. Our ears hear the songs of God's angels. And our souls are truly touched by the hands of God!

Humor from the Pulpit

For me, one of the surest ways to grab one’s attention for the sermon is a joke from the preacher before he/she begins. Rev. Curtis Peek did that with his story about a horse who wouldn’t move until it heard the command “Praise the Lord”. Recall that the rider uttered these words, and the horse began to move. When he repeated it, the horse went a little faster, and with the next “Praise the Lord,” the horse went into a full gallop! Unfortunately, this horse, faithful to his master’s command, was racing toward a cliff. Frantically, he needed to stop this steed and searching for words, he said “Amen.” The horse, as it was fast approaching this cliff, stopped just in the nick of time. And feeling much relief, the rider looked to the heavens and prayed, “Praise the Lord.!” Not only did this story capture my whole-hearted attention, I even remembered his sermon on Jacob wrestling with God.

However, there is one story from the pulpit by Dr. Richard Bower, that is etched permanently in my memory, even after more than twenty-five years. He was relating an incident of the chairman of Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company. It was a beautiful spring Sunday afternoon, so the Chair of Mass Mutual suggested to his wife that they take a leisurely drive to see the countryside of Springfield, MA. As they were driving, he took note that the gas gauge showed they were running low, whereupon they pulled into an old country store, one with a gasoline pump in front. As he was watching the elderly looking attendant fill his tank, his wife went into the store.

After this attendant completed the fill up, he returned to the front of the store and sat down. Then, the wife came out and out-of-the-blue started a lively conversation with this attendant. The Chair sat patiently in the car until this sparkling conversation was completed. After driving off, the Chair waited a little while before discussing the storefront scene. It turned out that the attendant was an old high school classmate, who in fact dated the wife on several occasions. After much ease, the Chairman professed to his wife, “Aren’t you glad that you married me, the Chairman of Mass Mutual, instead of him as you would only be a wife of a gas station attendant?” Whereupon the wife responded, “Listen, if I had married him, he would be Chairman of Mass Mutual and you would be pumping gas!”

### **GREAT RECIPE of the MONTH**

#### **SLOW-COOKER SHORT RIB TACOS**

2½ pounds boneless beef short ribs  
Kosher salt & ground black pepper  
2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil  
1 large sweet onion, diced  
3 cloves garlic, minced  
2 cups beef broth  
1 cup crushed tomatoes

1½ tablespoons gochujang  
¼ cup light brown sugar  
¼ cup rice vinegar  
12 eight-inch flour tortillas  
½ small green cabbage, finely shredded  
12 dill pickle spears  
⅓ cup roughly chopped cilantro

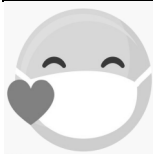
#### **SLOW-COOKER SHORT RIB:**

Season the short ribs with salt and pepper. In a large pot, heat the oil over medium heat. Add the short ribs and sear until well browned on all sides, 9 to 12 minutes. Remove from the pan and place into the slow cooker. Add the onion, garlic, beef broth, crushed tomatoes, gochujang, brown sugar and vinegar and stir to combine. Turn the slow cooker on low; cook the short ribs until they are very tender, 7½ to 8 hours. Remove the meat from the slow cooker and shred with forks. Put remaining ingredients from the slow cooker into a medium pot. Bring the mixture to a simmer and cook until slightly thickened, 15 to 20 minutes. Add the sauce to the meat and toss well to combine.

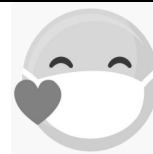
#### **MAKE THE TACOS:**

In a large skillet, heat the tortillas one at a time. To build the tacos, divide the meat, cabbage and dill pickle spears between the tortillas. Top with black pepper and cilantro.

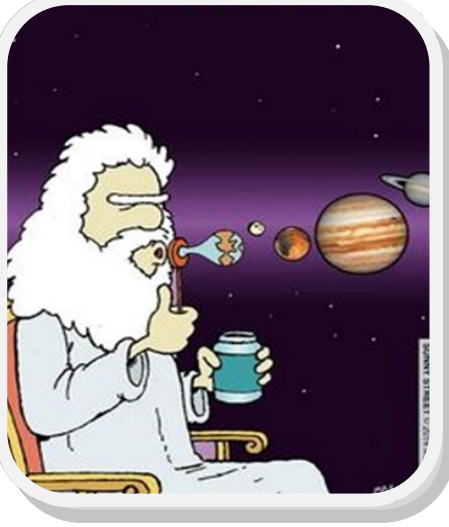




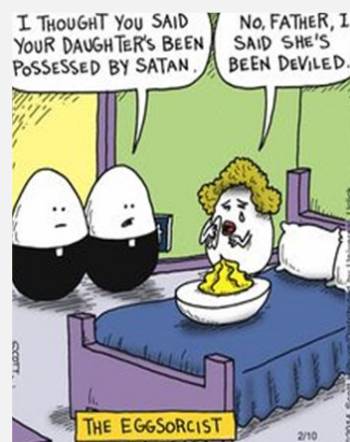

**TRUSTEE NEWS**

The Trustees met in executive session on August 18. Again, John Van Veen gave us a extensive report on the current financial position of the church. We are beginning to see some income from the film industry. The preschool had its Summer session with reduced enrollment, 10 per class down from the 20 previously allowed. The fall session will open with 24 children and may be increase per CDC guidelines. Tuition had been increased pre-COVID for this September, and was raised once again post-COVID.

There are still many more unknowns than knowns, as far as income goes. It also doesn't seem that our representatives in Washington are in any hurry to come up with a new relief package. For now, we are making no cuts and will begin to borrow from our endowments as we are allowed. The endowments however are not a bottomless pit. We will continue to monitor the situation.

A quick word about income from the congregation. In the early days of the Church, about 80% of the budget came from the congregation. That has reversed. You all have been doing a good job of keeping up with your estimate of giving. However, please consider raising the amount you give so we can, even to a small degree, reduce our dependence on outside income. We know we can do this. Just witness Diane Delany's fundraiser that surpassed the \$2500 goal.
