RECOGNIZE JUST WHO YOU ARE!

For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.
And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ;
if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together.
Romans 8:14,17

Too often we find Christians who have forgotten that we really are children of the Most High God.

We have allowed lies to be imbedded in us that has created a performance-based relationship with the Grace Giver. Some dear saints of God are afraid to move out in boldness because they still believe that God can only love them if their performance is without fault.

This fear has immobilized many. This lie is displaced when we know we are loved not because of our performance, but out of the very nature of God. He can only love. He is love. He is unchangeable.

As a servant of God, it is totally natural to operate in the fearful but reverent view that if we mess up we somehow lose our salvation.

Jesus said in John 15 that He would no longer relate to His disciples as servants. He would now relate to them as friends. The shift here was not simply using a new word to describe the relationship, but rather how the word "friend" would radically change how the disciples would relate to Jesus.

In 2nd Corinthians 20:18 the Lord says, "And, I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

As a child of God we now operate in the spirit of Love and not servitude. In other words, we do the right thing because we love God. As a child of God we now have the autonomy to come boldly to the throne and ask God to FIX us.

When we were servants and we messed up, we were simply cut off and replaced. But as children we cannot be replaced as we are heirs to the kingdom and joint heirs with Jesus Christ. (See Romans 8:18).

I encourage you to recognize who you are and accept the RELATIONSHIP the Lord has called you to be with Him. Respect the Family Values by doing those things that honor our Heavenly Father.

I love to share stories about people making a difference in the world. I do this to help encourage our congregation and friends to realize we all have the ability to make a positive change in our communities, and even in the world. I also do this because our world can be overwhelming to live in sometimes, and by sharing positive life stories, the uplift might help to shift our perspectives.

Today I'm sharing a story about a boy who lives in Tasmania, an island state of Australia. Campbell Remess was 9 years old when he and his mother were Christmas gift shopping, and he asked if they could purchase a few presents for sick children in hospitals. His mother explained that money was tight and they couldn't afford the extra cost. What was Campbell's response? He told his mom not to worry, he'd make the presents himself.

He had never sewed anything before, but he hijacked his mother's sewing machine. Using left over fabric and looking on the internet for instructions, he began making stuffed teddy bears. The first bear took five hours with a lot of trial and error. With dedication, practice and persistence, he now makes a teddy bear in one hour. The now teenager makes hundreds and hundreds of bears for the sick. The bears give the recipients some magical love as they fight their health issues. Campbell made an extra special bear for his dad when he had cancer. His dad said his son's mission has taught him to get up and move forward no matter the circumstances. After Campbell's story aired on an Australian TV station, he started a non-profit, Project 365. These one-of-a-kind bears spread love and hope to the cancer patients who receive them.

This story of kindness and shared love illustrates how one person CAN make a difference. Think about what you can do to help someone. Know that your actions can change a life!

Blessings, Jane....and remember to take some quiet time with God!

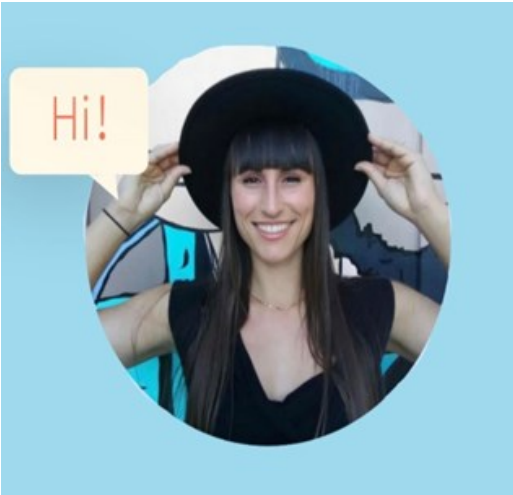

STAVES CHAPEL ~ STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

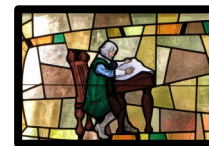

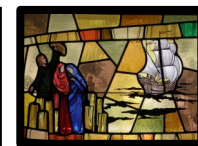
