

Lent is the season, the 40 days, when we walk with Jesus to the cross. The colors are purple and gray. The sounds are somber and quiet. There is a stillness as we realize that the one we have followed, the one who leads on the path of mercy and justice, the one who makes God's love real, will be crucified.

And though we know that just beyond the cross is the empty tomb, let us not skip these quiet days. Let us not turn away from the shadows which are falling upon our master.

Let us instead be with Jesus. Let us go into the wilderness for the 40 days that began his own ministry. And though we will not meet Satan as he did, we can use this sacred time to do what he did. We contemplate who we are to be as God's children, as those who know Christ. We examine those things which get in the way of our faithfulness—the fears, the anxieties, the anger and resentments which sometimes simmer inside of us. Let us take the time to quiet ourselves, to see ourselves, so that we may live faithfully. We may live lovingly.

Let us not be afraid of silence, but relish the time to spend with God. Let us not be afraid of the shadows, for the light of God will always be there for us to see, to light our own way. Let the season of Lent be a time when we allow ourselves to find moments for prayer, quiet, reflection, meditation. So that when we see the cross, we also see the empty tomb, that though Jesus died, he lived again.

Let us see the light even as we walk through the shadows.....

GETTING TO KNOW HILARIO CABRAL

From humble beginnings, Hilario's life was shaped by his faith, his love for dance, and his belief that God had given him a special purpose. Hilario's remarkable talent for dance and music became evident at a young age. At just nine years old, he made his first television appearance. His talent and charisma caught the attention of many, leading to a once-in-a-lifetime invitation to perform at the U.S.



Embassy. The sight of a U.S. Embassy limousine arriving on his neighborhoods dirt road was a moment of wonder and confirmation that God had a plan for his life. That experience opened his eyes to the opportunities ahead, instilling in him a deep sense of gratitude and purpose.

At eighteen, Hilario was hired to perform in Las Vegas' largest production show, "Jubilee". He had the opportunity to open shows for legendary stars such as Frank Sinatra, Tom Jones, Sammy Davis Jr., Tina Turner, Janet Jackson and the Queen of England during the golden era of Las Vegas entertainment. He performed in Jubilee for 20 years, making his mark in entertainment history while simultaneously achieving his 6th degree black belt Master in Taekwondo.

Despite the highs and lows of the entertainment industry, Hilario has always turned to God for guidance. His faith remains the cornerstone of his life, and reading the Bible and following the teachings of Jesus provide him with strength and confidence. He firmly believes that God's greatness will always sustain him, no matter what challenges arise.

Today, Hilario continues to serve the community by sitting on the Board of CWS and actively participating in the Church of the Chimes. His journey—from a small village in Argentina to the grand stages of Las Vegas and beyond—is a testament to the power of faith, perseverance, and the belief that God makes the impossible possible. Hilario looks forward to continuing his service at COTC, embracing his faith, and inspiring others with his remarkable story.
