Frank also served in a number of Episcopal parishes, including most recently as interim rector at St. Andrew's in Newcastle, Maine.

Frank is co-founder and emeritus president of Princeton in Africa, an international service fellowship for college graduates. He was also a founding board member of Healthy Learners, expanding access to health care for school-aged children in Zambia.

A Jew by birth, Frank enjoyed exploring how to minister effectively across pluralistic boundaries. He is the author of *Growing Up: Limiting Adolescence in a World Desperate for Adults.* Now retired, he serves on a number of nonprofit boards. Frank has three children, four grandchildren, and lives with his wife Carrie in Topsham. Welcome Frank!

ANDREW OLIVER is a former UNA Maine board member, serving from 2015-2016. Andrew was crucial in introducing UNA Maine's use of social media platforms, like Twitter, to promote the mission, vision, and values of the United Nations, as well as our Chapter's content and events.

technology industries.


Andrew has recently settled into Old Orchard Beach, where he is within jogging distance of the beach! Welcome Andrew!
