MEET THE AMBASSADOR!



Linda Thomas-Greenfield, age 68, born in Baker, Louisiana, the oldest of eight children, was sworn in as our 31st Ambassador to the UN on February 24, 2021. She joined the US State Department in 1982 and rose to become assistant secretary of state for African affairs, from 2013 to 2017. Throughout her career she has represented the US in such countries as Liberia, Pakistan, Kenya, Nigeria and Jamaica. She also worked on refugee and migration issues, at the US mission to the UN in Geneva. She has been described by her former supervisors as brilliant, a skilled diplomat, and is known for her compassion, kindness, and commitment to democracy, good governance, human rights and anticorruption.
