More Things to Ponder and Another Date to Save

 We are invited to join with the book group of the Portland area chapter of the League of Women Voters of Maine on March 24 for a late afternoon virtual discussion of I Am A Girl From Africa written by

- Elizabeth Nyamayaro. The discussion will be facilitated by leaders of both groups. Nyamayaro's book, published in 2020 is a memoir of her early life in Zimbabwe, and her later work with the United Nations in various roles, including as senior advisor on gender equality. Pick up a book at your local bookstore, online, or find it through your library. More details will be provided in early March.
- Another older book that is worth reading (or rereading), remarkably timely, is *Ralph Bunche: An Amercan Life* by Brian Urquhart, published in 1993. A documentary based on the book was released in 2001 and is narrated by Oscar winning actor Sidney Poitier. The book is available through libraries, bookstores, and online. The film is available on Kanopy and Vimeo. Ralph J. Bunche, (1903-1971), was an African-American political and social scientist, diplomat, and US civil rights movement activist. After teaching at Howard University, he worked on forming, and then with, the UN from 1944 to 1971. He was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1950 for his work as a UN mediator in Palestine in 1948–1949. He walked at the side of Dr. King during the 1965 civil rights march from Selma to Montgomery.
