

Using AAC in Daily Activities

Helping your child use their AAC device in daily routines makes communication meaningful!



Making a Peanut Butter Sandwich

Reading a Book

Getting Dressed

Start with with core words:

'Put', 'Want', 'More', 'Spread', 'All done'

Examples of phrases to model:

- 1. 'Put bread' (placing bread)
- 'Want peanut butter' (choosing an ingredient)
- 'Spread peanut butter' (describing action)
- 4. 'More jelly?' (asking question)
- 5. 'All done!' (finishing up)

Expand communication: Talk about texture ('sticky'), taste ('sweet'), and sequence ('first', 'next', 'last')

Start with core words:

'Look', 'Turn', 'Like', 'More', 'Go'

Examples of phrases to model:

- 1. 'Look!' (point to pictures)
- 2. *'Turn Page*.' (encourage interaction)
- 'I like that.' (expressing preference)
- 4. 'More book?' (asking to continue
- 5. 'Go again!' (reading again)

Expand communication:

Ask questions ('What next?'), describe pictures ('Big dog!'), and make comments ('Fun!')

Start with core words:

'On', 'Off', 'Want', 'Help', 'Like'

Examples of phrases to model:

- 1. 'Shirt on' (putting on shirt)
- 2. 'Shoes off.' (taking off shoes)
- 3. *'Want blue?'* (choosing a color)
- 4. 'Help pants.' (asking for assistance)
- 5. 'I like this' (commenting)

Expand communication:

Talk about textures ('soft', 'rough'), preferences ('I like red.'), and weather choices ('Hot?' 'Wear shorts!').
