SCORING GUIDE



Instructions:

Count how many times you answered "Yes" or "Sometimes"

6-8	Your child may benefit from an AAC evaluation. AAC can be life-changing, even for kids who are still learning to talk!		
3-5	It might be worth exploring AAC as part of a communication plan. Reach out to a speech-language pathologist who specializes in AAC.		
0-2	Your child may not need AAC right now, but keep an eye on development and check in with a speech therapist if you have concerns.
