

## Speech & Language Milestones Chart

Age	Milestones
0-6 months	<ul> <li>Coos, gurgles, and makes pleasure sounds</li> <li>Turns head toward sounds</li> <li>Begins to laugh and squeal</li> </ul>
6-12 months	<ul> <li>Responds to name</li> <li>Babbles with variety (e.g., "ba-da")</li> <li>Understands "no" and simple commands</li> <li>Uses gestures (i.e., waving, pointing)</li> </ul>
12-18 months	<ul> <li>Says 5-10 words meaningfully</li> <li>Imitates words and sounds</li> <li>Understands up to 50 words</li> <li>Uses gestures and vocalizations to express wants</li> </ul>
18-24 months	<ul> <li>Has a vocabulary of ~50 words</li> <li>Begins combining 2-words (e.g., "want + milk")</li> <li>Follows simple two-step directions</li> <li>Points to common objects or pictures when named</li> </ul>
2-3 years	<ul> <li>Uses 2-3 word combinations regularly</li> <li>Asks simple questions</li> <li>Speech is understood 50-75% of the time</li> <li>Begins using pronouns (e.g., me, you, mine)</li> </ul>
3-4 years	<ul> <li>Talks about daily experiences</li> <li>Speech is understood ~75-90% of the time</li> <li>Uses 4-5 word sentences</li> <li>Understands concepts like big/little, in/out</li> </ul>
4-5 years	<ul> <li>Tells stories and follows multi-step directions</li> <li>Uses correct grammar most of the time</li> <li>Speech is understood ~90-100% of the time</li> <li>Begins using complex sentences</li> </ul>
5+ years	<ul> <li>Communicates clearly with both adults and peers</li> <li>Uses language to reason, predict, and describe</li> <li>Understands humor, time concepts, and abstract ideas</li> </ul>
