Dear Members and Friends of Community Presbyterian Church,

It is hard to believe how quickly the summer is moving along. Memorial Day seems like just a few days ago and already it is the beginning of August! I know for our teachers, administrators and students the summer has just flown by. Please remember to pray for our students and all who support them as they head back to classes.

A word about the **Church Health Assessment Tool** (CHAT) which is our mission study for the Pastor Nominating Committee to use. As of July 31<sup>st</sup> the study has been completed. **Thank you** to all who took the time to reflect upon the mission of our congregation and fill out the tool. At the time of this writing, I don't have the final percentage of the congregation who participated in the study, but as of July 29<sup>th</sup> we were at 56%. Some of you will look at that number and be discouraged – **don't!** The national average for such studies is between 25% and 35% participation, so we are 'above average' and will have good data for our committee.

A final focus.... Certainly we are involved in many different ministries in the White Mountains, but I would remind you that our main focus as a congregation is worship. From our worship flows our desire to be involved ministering in our communities. However, sometimes we attend worship and don't really reflect upon what we are doing during our services on Sunday mornings. So let's take time during August to remember why we do what we do in worship. The sermons during the month will focus us upon the elements of our worship. They are listed below:

- □ August 4: "The Gathering" ~ Psalm 100
- □ August 11: "The Hearing" ~ Matthew 11:1-15
- □ August 18: "The Responding" ~ James 1:22-25
- □ August 25: "The Sacraments" ~ Matthew 28:19-20 & Matthew 26:26-30

#### MONTHLY DEVOTIONS FROM OUR CHURCH FAMILY

**DEVOTION TITLE:** God's Wonders in the Skies **AUTHOR:** Patsy Hjalmarson

**VERSE:** The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork. Psalms 19:1 (RSV)

**MEDITATION:** One of the most real and spiritual experiences was when I saw the heavens declare the glory of God and the skies truly display His marvelous craftsmanship.

In mid-December 1985, I was flying in a small nine passenger plane from Point Barrow, Alaska, to the small village of Kaktovik, Alaska. I was in the co-pilot seat and just as we took off there was a rather huge light coming toward us on my right side. I kept waiting to hear from ground control that another aircraft was approaching and when none came through I told the pilot that I thought another plane was coming in. The light was very bright. He immediately leaned over and said "Where?" When I showed him he seemed awestruck and quietly said "I've been looking for that all week, it's Halley's Comet." I too was awestruck and just watched for a little bit. Then I turned and looked toward the left and there was a beautiful and colorful heavenly display of the Aurora Borealis. As we ascended higher, just in front of us the heavens were streaked with reds and pinks of the arctic skies. Being so far north, the sun didn't really rise or set, but being up so high we were able to see these magnificent colors.

I just sat there and marveled at these three totally amazing sights, Halley's Comet on my right, the Aurora Borealis on my left, and the colorful skies in front of me. Even as I write this, it is hard to find the right words to describe the beauty of what I saw. Even harder to describe is the total spiritual feeling that came over me. It was as if God was right there saying "See this marvelous creation." I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit and knew that the Heavens do declare of Glory of God.

I'm not sure that anyone could explain these three images all at once or if they would ever happen again, but I know in those moments in that aircraft I experienced an incredible amazing picture of the heavens declaring the Glory of God. The scriptures became very real to me.

When I look into the sky, whether it is day or night, whether I see sunshine, clouds, moon or stars, I see God's craftsmanship.

**PRAYER:** O Lord, thank you for allowing me such wonderful experiences. Let me daily remember to thank you for your beauty, not only of earth's creation but knowing that even the heavens declare Your glory.

February ~ May 2019 - - Spend time getting to know congregation (Completed)



June ~ July 2019 - - Complete congregational mission study (Completed)



**August/September 2019** - - Elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

September ~ November 2019 - - Complete Ministry Information Form (MIF) (resume of the church)

**December 2019** - - Submit MIF for circulation


**January ~ August 2020** - - Review Personal Information Forms (PIF) - Interviews - Neutral Pulpit presentation - present candidate to congregation for vote.

#### **RECYCLING NEWS**

Hello Recycling Earth Stewards!

Thank you so much for recycling! On Tuesday mornings at my Show Low home, I have been putting out my curb-side recycle bin totally filled with clean recyclables.

Although we have had a great response to recycling at CPC, not everything that has been left at the church is recyclable. I can understand the confusion because different cities and towns in our state have different "rules."

Our recycling at the church uses the Show Low rules, so no glass and please take the tops off of soda bottles. Also . . . .

- \* NO DIRTY STUFF—That means no used Kleenix, napkins, toilet paper, paper towels, and food containers like pizza boxes.
- \* NO PLASTIC BAGS—Bring them to church, donate them to any thrift store, and most grocery stores.
- \* NO STYROFOAM, PACKING PEANUTS or PACKAGING FOAM.

One more thing to note, please consider using boxes instead of plastic bags to carry the items to the church. And bringing your own containers to restaurants for take out.
