Dear Members and Friends of Community Presbyterian Church,

Your concern supported us during our daughter-in-law's job furlough and their subsequent move to Colorado Springs. You taught our grandson to fish and allowed our granddaughter to 'ring the church bell' (always a highlight of their visits with us!). To put our thoughts in one phrase, our time here has been a 'delight'.

What is next for us? We will be heading back to Colorado the end of the month (my last Sunday will be July 26<sup>th</sup>). Our son and daughter-in-law are currently living in our house while they search for a place to buy, so we may be living (temporarily?) at our family cabin behind Pikes Peak ~ another adventure. As soon as we can, we will settle back into our place and begin renewing our relationships with long-time friends. I have been put forth as the candidate for the job of Executive Presbyter (basically pastor to the pastors) of Pueblo Presbytery (Southeastern Colorado). The members of presbytery will vote on my nomination at our 'Zoom' meeting on July 18<sup>th</sup>. If all goes well, I will start this half-time position on September 1<sup>st</sup>.

So we have had our times of worship, our projects, our laughter and our tears. In other words, we have experienced life together. Thank you for allowing us to serve God's Kingdom alongside of you. It has been a fun time of growth. May God watch between us while we are apart one from another.

#### **CPC Reopening and Gathering Plans**

As we enter the fourth month since the suspension of in-person worship services in March, we remain challenged in finding the correct paths forward for safe and meaningful worship. Our situation is complicated by Arizona's recent dramatic increase in COVID cases and the realization that the southern and northern ends of Navajo county have two of the highest COVID rates in the entire country. Further complicating our plans is the fact that the majority of our church members and attenders fall into a high risk group that must be diligently protected from exposure to the coronavirus.

As public health professionals in the congregation, we have helped CPC leadership to closely monitor CDC and Arizona Department of Health Service guidelines related to faith groups. We have also incorporated recommendations from the Grand Canyon Presbytery and local instruction such as the recent mandatory mask ordinance issued by the Pinetop-Lakeside town council on June 24<sup>th</sup>.

While ensuring the safety of our worshipers remains our primary goal, but a key secondary objective is to be a responsible community member and a congregation that models worship practices that exhibit our concern for the well-being of our broader community. Therefore, in the absence of a clear downward trend in COVID activity in our state and region, we feel that opening the sanctuary to in-person worship services remains an *unsafe option for at least the next 4-6 weeks* and possibly through the end of summer. Instead, we will focus on our drive-in service options, posting recorded worship experiences on-line for those who can't join us in the parking lot, and the potential to use some of our outdoor facilities for small group gatherings. Along those lines, we are finalizing guidelines for the Session's consideration regarding the use of the picnic pavilion for committee meetings, study groups such as the Sonrisers, and other small church gatherings. These guidelines will appear in a future issue of the newsletter and CPC Express.

#### **MINISTRY NOTES**

#### One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

Normally the **One Great Hour of Sharing Offering** is received during Holy Week. However, the Mission Committee decided to push this special offering back to the time when we can all be together for worship and have it be part of our celebration and thanksgiving Stand by for more information on how we are making this an offering of gratitude for our return from social distancing.

#### Did You Know That You Can Donate To The Church By Using Your IRA?

Because of changes in the tax laws there is now a tax-friendly way to contribute to qualifying charities (like a church). In general, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable in the year you receive them. But one exception to this rule is the **Q**ualified **C**haritable **D**istribution (QCD). A QCD generally is a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your IRA to an organization eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions. You must be at least age 701/2 when the distribution is made. Also, you must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution as you would need to claim a deduction for a charitable contribution. (You can't claim a charitable contribution deduction for an QCD not included in your income.)

This provision of the tax code may be of interest to taxpayers who are at least age 701/2 and have a traditional IRA. These individuals must take required minimum distributions from their IRA each year. Seniors in this position can now make charitable contributions while at the same time reducing their taxable income by directing the trustee of their IRA to make qualified charitable distributions (QCD), which count towards their minimum distribution. For more information please call the church office or see IRS Publication 590-B.

#### Get It On The Calendar:

If your group has an event/meeting planned at the church, please call the church office and have Tammy put it on the master calendar. Without this information, 'double-booking' could easily happen. Thanks for your help!

#### Updates on Website:

If you haven't checked out our website (<u>www.cpcpinetop.org</u>) recently, please do. You will see many updates containing different types of material. Some of the information is directed toward folks seeking a church to attend, others is information that you as a member/attender may need to know.
