Community Presbyterian Church June 2020 Newsletter

Dear Members and Friends of Community Presbyterian Church,

Per the request of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), the Session has called for a **congregational meeting to be held over the weekend of June 12th-14th**. The purpose of this meeting is to consider/vote on the candidacy of **The Rev. Diane White** whom the PNC is nominating to be our permanent pastor. This is a 'running meeting' and **has been approved** by the Committee on Ministry of the Grand Canyon Presbytery. Yes, this will be an unusual way to hold a congregational meeting to vote on a candidate, so allow me to explain....

Normally, when we are not dealing with a pandemic, a candidate is presented to the congregation through a series of 'meet and greets' and then **officiates at worship** on Sunday morning. Immediately following the worship service a congregational meeting would be held for **congregation questions** to be addressed by the candidate. After the questions session, the candidate would be dismissed and **discussion among the congregational members** would clarify any remaining issues and a **vote** would be taken. When the **votes were tallied**, the **candidate would be notified** and either **accept or deny the 'call'** the congregation is issuing. Finally, the candidate's **decision would be communicated to the congregation and the presbytery**. That's the normal way for these congregational meetings. However, these are not normal times. So below is a format showing how we are going to meet all of these 'requirements' for the meeting over the course of the June 12-14 weekend. (The requirement will be in 'black' and how we are going to accomplish the requirements will be in 'blue').

Candidate Officiates at Worship: Pastor White will actually officiate at worship three (3) times during the weekend in June. The first is the recorded service available for viewing on our website (cpcpinetop.org) on Saturday, June 13th. She will also be officiating at the two Sunday morning worship services (8:30 & 10:30) on June 14th.

Congregational Questions: <u>Congregational members and friends</u> will be able to submit questions for Pastor White to address. Your questions need to be emailed or phoned into the office by June 9th and Pastor White will address them as a continuation of the recorded service available on June 13th. How this will work is following the conclusion of the recorded worship service, I will call the congregational meeting to order (virtually) and I will ask Pastor White the questions that have been submitted. You can then see her answers on our website.

Discussion Among Congregational Members: Because of the virus, there is not a formal time when we can all get together in person to discuss Pastor White's candidacy in. But I am sure over the weekend, members will be discussing among themselves her officiating at the virtual worship and the answers to her questions.

MORE FROM PASTOR BOB

Members Vote: Please remember that only <u>congregational members</u> will be able to vote in this process. Members of the PNC will be contacting each member to explain the voting process. Members will be able to contact their PNC liaison and cast their vote anytime after the virtual worship service is posted on the website and up until after the 10:30 worship service on Sunday the 14th. The voting will not be a total 'secret ballot' (as the PNC liaison will know their contact's votes), however, when the liaisons report the votes to the Clerk of Session they will only be reporting numbers and no names.

Tally of vote: Shortly after the 10:30 worship service on the 14th, each PNC liaison will call the Clerk of Session with their voting results. The Clerk will tally of the votes cast and report the total to the Moderator of the congregational meeting (that's me!).

Candidate Notification: As Moderator of the meeting, I will then (by 1:00 pm on the 14th) notify Pastor White of the results of the congregational vote.

Acceptance/Denial of 'Call': Pastor White decides whether to accept or deny the 'call' of the congregation and reports her decision to the Moderator. (She will give me her answer before she leaves for the airport the afternoon of the 14th).

Congregation Notification of Results: Immediately following Pastor White's decision, I (with the assistance of the Clerk) will send out an email to the members and friends of CPC reporting the outcome. I will also notify our presbytery liaison so the decision can be reported to the Committee on Ministry.

As you can see, our 'running congregation meeting' will be out of the ordinary, but still accomplish what needs to be done. Actually, the Committee on Ministry was very pleased we were able to come up with a creative solution during this time of pandemic. If you have any questions about the process, please feel free to contact me. Thanks to everyone for their cooperation in this unique process!

Opening the Church and Summer Worship Times:

If you tuned in to watch last week's service, you noticed that the chairs are back in the sanctuary but arranged differently. This is our first attempt at setting up the sanctuary for 'social separation' while we worship. Different configurations may be tried while we work to prepare the sanctuary for reopening. Another item we are addressing is air flow through the sanctuary. Proper separation and proper air circulation are critical to our being able to get back into our building. However, in the meantime, we are beginning our **drive-in worship services** on Sunday, **June 7**th. This day will also begin our summer worship schedule. There will be two identical services at 8:30 and 10:30. These services will be the first step for in-person services and provide us an opportunity to be 'together' while we continue to prepare the sanctuary for use. More information about the drive-in services will be provided in the June 5th CPC Express, so be watching for information about traffic flow, worship etiquette and how to say 'Amen' from your vehicles!

Would You Like To Be An Affiliate Member of CPC?

Through affiliate membership, friends who have a church membership elsewhere but summer with us can keep their current 'home church' membership, yet become 'affiliate members' at CPC – their 'summer church'. October 2019 - - Elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) (Completed)

Oct ~ Nov 2019 - - Complete Ministry Information Form (MIF)(resume of the church) (Completed)

December 2019 - - Submit MIF for circulation (Completed)


January ~ August 2020 - - Review Personal Information Forms (PIF) - Interviews -(Partly completed)- Pulpit presentation - present candidate to congregation for vote (June 12-14)

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering

Normally the **One Great Hour of Sharing Offering** is received during Holy Week. However, the Mission Committee decided to push this special offering back to the time when we can all be together for worship and have it be part of our celebration and thanksgiving Stand by for more information on how we are making this an offering of gratitude for our return from social distancing.

Did You Know That You Can Donate To The Church By Using Your IRA?

Because of changes in the tax laws there is now a tax-friendly way to contribute to qualifying charities (like a church). In general, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable in the year you receive them. But one exception to this rule is the **Q**ualified **C**haritable **D**istribution (QCD). A QCD generally is a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your IRA to an organization eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions. You must be at least age 701/2 when the distribution is made. Also, you must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution as you would need to claim a deduction for a charitable contribution. (You can't claim a charitable contribution deduction for an QCD not included in your income.)

This provision of the tax code may be of interest to taxpayers who are at least age 701/2 and have a traditional IRA. These individuals must take required minimum distributions from their IRA each year. Seniors in this position can now make charitable contributions while at the same time reducing their taxable income by directing the trustee of their IRA to make qualified charitable distributions (QCD), which count towards their minimum distribution.
