Dear Members and Friends of Community Presbyterian Church,

There are three 'Good News' Items to share with you this month! They are the Presbyterian Women's mission sale, information about the Montlure property and our upcoming congregational meeting.

First the work of the Presbyterian Women. As you know, the PW group has worked all summer to prepare for their craft and bake sale the weekend of August 24/25. You can gain more information about this event and the mission projects they supported in the article elsewhere in this newsletter. But I want to offer up a big 'Thank You' from the congregation for their diligent work (no doubt there was fun involved as well!). This summer long mission endeavor included many women who were willing to give of their time and efforts to make this year's sale such a great success. Thank you ladies for your faithfulness ~ this is 'good news'!

Second, the presbyteries of Arizona have received verbal permission from the National Forest Service to re-occupy the Montlure Camp site in Greer! (I say 'verbal' permission as they are waiting for an official 'written' document which is in process.) It is questionable if the camp will be ready for use the summer of 2020, but you never know. The presbyteries are putting together a plan for renovation of the property so there will be many more details to come. However, this long-awaited announcement is truly - 'good news'!

Third, we have received permission from the Committee on Ministry of Grand Canyon Presbytery to move ahead to the next step in our new pastor search. That step is to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Sooooo, we need a congregational meeting to elect this search committee. The congregational meeting will be held immediately following worship on Sunday, September 15th. This is a major step forward in our search process ~ and is truly 'good news'!

We are experiencing God's grace in many different ways. Again thanks to all the folks who are/were working on these projects. Let's rejoice in all this 'good news'.

DEVOTION TITLE: No Getting Away From God

VERSE: ¹⁶ that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with might through his Spirit in the inner man, ¹⁷ and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may have power to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, ¹⁹ and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Ephesians 3:16-19 (RSV)

MEDITATION: A few years ago my husband David and I spent 2 ½ years living in Puerto Rico. He worked with the Puerto Rico Department of Health and the Center for Disease Control while we were there. I was not employed, but found MANY things to do (after all, we lived ON the beach, so that was <u>one</u> thing...). We did a bit of church shopping and settled on attending Second Union Church.

Second Union Church is made up of Episcopalians, Methodists, and Presbyterians. We made some lifelong friends there, including Pastor Bob (Zoba) and his wife Christie, who was also my favorite Spanish teacher. Christie and some other women led a Bible Study which followed Spanish lessons on Tuesdays. One of the best activities I've ever done was during one of our Bible studies.

We were told to think about milestones as well as smaller events in our life. We were to write them down in chronological order and then think about God's role in that activity. The message was that God has been with us every step of the way even if we didn't know it, acknowledge it, or feel His presence at the time. When I jotted down these special events in my life, I saw looking back that God was guiding me and had me in the palm of His hand even when I didn't know it. This gave me such a sense of God's guidance in the past, that I felt He certainly would continue to guide me in the future. The following verse has always made me appreciate God being with me ALWAYS:

³⁸ For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 8:38-39 (RSV)

PRAYER: Dear Heavenly Father, I thank you for guiding me in all the events in my life. May I always feel your presence with me in every step of life as you hold me closely and guide my path. Amen.

FOOD DRIVE FOR VETERANS

For a number of years, the deacons of the church have taken on the mission of organizing holiday food boxes for veterans in need in our community. We have been working with three organizations: the Pinetop VFW, Fishers of Men for Veterans, and Walking Down Ranch. Last year we donated 45 food boxes at Thanksgiving, and for Christmas, Tom and Liz Jernigan put together another 45.

It is time to begin the process of planning and then collecting food for this project. We typically collect a different non-perishable food item each week from September through October, as well as donations by check for the later purchase of perishable food items.



We can also use other nonperishable food items, besides those on our list. So if you're cleaning out your pantry in preparation for returning to a warmer climate, we'll be happy to make use of those items. Below is our planned schedule for collecting food.

MISSION STUDY FINDINGS

<u>Church Health Assessment Tool Findings</u> (CHAT Mission Study)

As a congregation we completed our mission study the end of July and here are some of the major findings....

Strengths:

- God's Empowering Presence (sensing the church seeks direction from God)
- God-Exalting Worship (worship is refreshing, renewing, uplifting, meaningful)
- Wise Administration and Accountability (approval how 'behind the scenes' administration is managed)
- Stewardship and Generosity (how resources are handled and shared with others)
- Commitment to Loving and Caring Relationships (God honoring life together)

Areas for Improvement:

- Outward Focus (could do more outreach in the community)
- Learning and Growing in Community (could be more community building activities within the church)
- Servant-Leadership Development (could improve identifying, training of leaders)
- Networking with the Body of Christ (could be more connected with other churches)
- Spiritual Disciplines (could encourage more the spiritual vitality of members)

If you would like to discuss these findings further, Pastor Bob will be hosting a discussion in Fellowship Hall following worship on Sunday, September 1st. Thanks to all for supporting this study and helping us give a good snapshot of our congregation to a new installed pastor.
