
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

4. CRA & MSTU Advisory Board Meeting 2021 Calendar (Enclosure 4)

Staff presented the board with the November 18, 2020 Joint CRA & MSTU Meeting Minutes, Budgets, Upcoming Meetings, and the 2021 CRA & MSTU Meeting Calendar. Staff explained that the meetings for November and December of 2021 will be optional, they will be listed as Joint Meeting for now, if there is something on the agenda the meeting will be held. If there isn't an item for the agenda, then it will be cancelled.

Action: Ms. Anne Goodnight made a motion to approve the amended Consent Agenda as presented. Mr. Ski Olesky seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 6-0.

F. Announcements.

1. Communications Folder

Staff reviewed the communications folder with the board and members of the public. The folder contained the public notice for this meeting, a copy of the FDOT Public Hearing for the Five-Year Work Program, and the Winter addition for the Friends of the River of Grass Greenway Newsletter.

2. Public Comment speaker slips

CRA staff reiterated the public 3-minute speaker slip policy. The board will give more time if they feel it necessary.

3. Budget & Work Plan Workshop – February 17, 2021 @ 9:00

Staff announced that the Budget & Work Plan Workshop has been set for February 17, 2021. Board members and public are asked to attend and participate.

4. Immokalee Lighting and Beautification MSTU board vacancies

Staff announced that the Immokalee Lighting and Beautification MSTU board currently has two vacancies. There are currently five applicants and recommendations will be made at the next MSTU meeting scheduled for January 27, 2021.

G. CRA New Business

1. Nomination for Chair and Vice-Chair

Staff announced that it was time for the boards to nominate Chair and Vice-Chair for the upcoming year.

Nominations for CRA Chair and Vice-Chair began.

Ms. Anne Goodnight made a nomination to appoint Frank Nappo as Chair. Mr. Ski Olesky seconded the nomination.

Mr. Frank Nappo made a nomination to appoint Anne Goodnight as Vice-Chair. Ms. Andrea Halman seconded the nomination.

Action: Ms. Anne Goodnight made a motion to appoint Dr. Frank Nappo as CRA Chair. Mr. Ski Olesky seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 5-0.

Action: Dr. Frank Nappo made a motion to appoint Anne Goodnight as CRA Vice-Chair. Ms. Andrea Halman seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 5-0.

2. Road Maintenance – Repair Proposals

Ms. Debrah Forester, CRA Director, provided an update. Road maintenance did an assessment of some private roads that need repair.



This would help with emergency services being able to access that part of the community. The total repairs would cost \$15,000. Staff is asking that the CRA and MSTU boards split the cost in order to help with the repairs. The roads in question are already a part of the MSTU and CRA boundary.

Commissioner William "Bill" McDaniel asks that the board table this discussion until the legal department can get involved. He cannot support the way this is being presented. He knows that the roads need to be fixed but the expense should not fall on all of the residents of Immokalee when they are private access roads. The legalities of spending public funds on private property need to be addressed first. He brought forward a resolution last year to create a Collier County MSTU for all of the people who own land or access their property via private road. This would have cost about \$50 per year and all involved would pay into the fund and it was specified that first responders would give the road prioritization and those roads would be brought up to standard that the ambulance, the lowest vehicle, could go through. After about a two to three-year period there would be sufficient funds to have the private roads elevated to standard including the ones being presented here today. The resolution failed 3 to 2, but there is a new Commissioner. The proposal was reviewed by the county attorney and met all of the requirements.

Ms. Anne Goodnight, CRA Vice-Chair, agreed with Commissioner McDaniel. There are several roads that need repair, but the owners don't want to turn the road over to the county. The owners want it fixed but they don't want to spend their money only to have the county take it over.

Ms. Debrah Forester thinks that bringing that resolution forward again would be good. The goal here is to make sure that the roads are adequate enough to get emergency services to all the community members.

Ms. Andrea Halman stated that those homeowners with private roads should be responsible for fixing their road.

Ms. Yvar Pierre wanted to know if there is a list of the people who own the roads so that they could be held responsible for taking care of the road.

Dr. Frank Nappo asked if Commissioner McDaniel needed a letter of support for the Collier County MSTU.

Commissioner McDaniel asked that he be given some time to go over the resolution with staff and bring it back next month to go over it with both boards. The original resolution was developed by the County Attorney.

Action: Ms. Anne Goodnight made a motion to table the item. Mr. Ski Olesky seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 6-0.



H. CRA Old Business

1. TIGER Grant Update

Ms. Debrah Forester gave a brief update to the board. Staff has been working with the TIGER grant people to give them feedback as to what is needed in that area. Part of the grant is a requirement to have a public meeting to present their findings. At next month's joint CRA & MSTU meeting they will present their preliminary design work and it will be a public comment for them as part of meeting.

2. Redevelopment Plan Update

Staff gave a brief update to the board. Johnson Engineering has 485 days to complete this project. This project is slated to be completed by March of 2022. In order to get public input, there will be smaller zoom meetings held and a possible outside event. This will be a plan for the next 30 years but also noting that about every five years or so the plan will need to be updated.

I. Staff Reports

1. Operations Manager Report (Enclosure 5)

Ms. Christie Betancourt reviewed the operations manager report, enclosure 5. Staff has had recent requests that better lighting needs to be put in on Lake Trafford Road. After a meeting with the county, staff was told that the grant is specific to sidewalks and lighting is not included. Currently there are LCEC poles but for the walking path not for the road. There will need to be a lighting justification study to see how many lights are needed and where the placement will be. The issue being timing, the addition of sidewalks to this area is an FDOT project and Stormwater will be involved. If staff moves forward with putting in lighting it may have to be removed or dug up for Stormwater. Working with FDOT to see about maybe putting in conduits when their project gets started would be a better option. Staff is hoping to get lighting as part of design with future projects, then CDBG grants could be a way to pay for the installation of the lighting.

Ms. Victoria Peters, FDOT, stated that when projects have been vetted through the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) there is a chance to add safety features like lighting while the project is still in design. If it is an issue of funding, there could be a possibility that funds could be available if the MPO board and Anne Mclaughlin approve the addition. This would have to be in the year of construction or design and if funds are available. She asks that staff get with her to try and see if this is an option for this project.

Mr. Alberto Estrada, community member, proposes the lighting be addressed. His brother was recently in an accident because of improper lighting. He feels that the streets are not safe for all of the people that live in that vicinity.

Ms. Anne Goodnight has concerns about the non-profit organizations that are building in Immokalee, she is in favor of the new buildings going up and new housing developments but non-profit organizations do not pay ad-valorem taxes so the residents of Immokalee will be paying for emergency services for all of these developments.

Dr. Frank Nappo asked Commissioner McDaniel if there is a way for non-profits to pay into emergency services if they are not going to pay ad-valorem taxes.



Commissioner McDaniel is meeting with Fire Chief Choate today to speak about the inequity of such organizations not paying into the emergency services part of the ad-valorem taxes. There is no quick fix.

Dr. Frank Nappo would like to work with Commissioner to get this topic addressed. There are a lot of developments going in, but they are all non-profits and so the taxes that would help with emergency services will not be collected. There has to be a way to have those organizations pay an initial fee and then a yearly one even if just for emergency services.

2. Project Manager Report (Enclosure 6)

Ms. Yvonne Blair reviewed the project manager report, enclosure 6. Coastal Concrete is moving along with the project on Carver and 5th. The welcome sign is on its way to being completed. The FDOT Main Street Project is at 96% in completion.

Ms. Andrea Halman questioned if anything was being done about the lighting outages. It is extremely dark on main street when the lighting isn't working.

Staff is working in coordination with the Sherriff's department to make sure that any issues are being addressed through 311 to ensure that all agencies are being made aware of the outages.

Ms. Lupita Vasquez Reyes wanted to see if there was a specific person to contact as to the cleanup after projects are being completed, specifically the Main Street Project being done now by FDOT. She has utilized 311 and sent in pictures.

Ms. Yvonne Blair stated that she would bring that up at the next Main Street Project meeting.

J. Other Agencies

1. Code Enforcement update (Enclosure 7)

Staff reviewed the Code Enforcement update, enclosure 7. The removal of the homeless camp on South 4th Street.

Mr. Jonas Mervilus asked if there was a program for the homeless. He would like to help fund it if there is.

2. FDOT updates (Enclosure 8)

Ms. Victoria Peters addressed the board with updates on enclosure 8. She will have a construction timeline for the SR29 and Westclox signal. FDOT has come out with a tentative five-year work program. The first project on that list is for Immokalee, the title is Immokalee City Sidewalks, the design will start in FY22 with construction in FY24 and will be six-foot sidewalks in various locations. This will be presented at the February MPO meeting.

Mr. Jonas Mervilus asked about the roundabout that is to be put in at SR29 and Westclox.



Ms. Victoria Peters stated that it is in design, "in design" means the treatment of the intersection. Right now, they will be installing a full traffic signal, but they are looking at a roundabout as a possibility for safety reasons.

Ms. Lupita Vasquez asked through chat if Victoria can be contacted for public feedback in regard to the February 12th meeting.

Ms. Victoria Peters stated that if any public feedback is given at any meeting, she will respond or will get the information back to whomever is needing answers to any of their projects.

Ms. Pam Brown stated that she is on the citizens advisory committee under the MPO board. If there any concerns from the public, she can also take those concerns back to her committee as well. She would also like to see if another public meeting can be held to discuss the potential Westclox roundabout.

Ms. Silvia Puente announced that there is a vacancy at the Library. The job will be posted until the 28th, it is full time position with benefits. Hours are still Monday through Friday from 10 A.M. until 5 P.M.

Mr. Jonas Mervilus asked if there are issues with computer access. He has access to 200 laptops that can be given away.

Ms. Silvia Puente responded that to her understanding all children that attend school have been issued a laptop. She does not know of any issues with computer access at this time. The issue she knows of is the Wi-Fi access. The library tries to accommodate workspace for those students that come in because their Wi-Fi is down at home.

Ms. Christie Betancourt suggested laptops he coordinate issuing laptops to students in need during summertime because the students turn in the school laptops when school is out.

Ms. Andrea Halman asked the Commissioner has had an update about the Wi-Fi issue in Immokalee.

Commissioner McDaniel responded that the School District had an initiative to provide boosting off of the school owned buildings and they were going to try to incorporate boosting with the government owned buildings.

Staff reviewed the Project Manager report on enclosure 12 with the board and provided updates. The Carver and South 5th sidewalk project commenced on September 16, 2020 and is expected to have a completion date of March 17, 2021.

The monument sign is moving forward with the addition of the lettering and then the final part to completing the sign will be the landscaping and lighting.

The FDOT Main Street Project is at 96% in completion.

Staff is continuing cleanup efforts on Main Street. Daily cleanup of cardboard boxes due to food distribution has caused the trash cans to overflow.

Sherriff Deputy Mike Taylor addressed the board as to the cleanup efforts. He advised the board that while the boxes are coming from the food distribution it is not just Main Street that has the issue. The trash around Immokalee in general is a problem. There are several problem areas, a possible solution could be using the "weekenders" to clean up whenever possible.

The other issue is that the Sherriff's department are no longer doing trespasses the way they used to. They used to have trespass agreements where a deputy could go and trespass someone of the property. They are no longer allowed to do this. Now, they have to have the property owner on site to trespass the person then if the person doesn't leave then the deputies can arrest. They will also have issues with the benches because they can't do anything if they are just sitting on the bench.

Commissioner William "Bill" McDaniel stated that he will get with the Sherriff's department and coordinate with them to utilize "Weekend Warriors" for the cleanup of the excess trash.

Ms. Annie Alvarez stated that Park & Rec had not been notified as to the change in the trespassing issue. She will coordinate with Park staff and Park rangers.

Staff advised the board of the electrical enhancements being finalized today by Simmonds Electric, and the contractor that will be doing the kiosk installation has already ordered the kiosk.

Ms. Andrea Halman asked who will be keeping track of what goes into the kiosk.

Ms. Debrah Forester explained that the kiosk will be locked and CRA staff will have the key. There will not be a way for anyone to just put things in there.



2. Operations Manager Report (Enclosure 13)

Staff reviewed the Operations Manager report on enclosure 13. As part of the redevelopment plan, staff will be sending out a series of surveys along with having small zoom group meetings to get community input.

Ms. Gabriel Gijon stated that she could share surveys and questions to all of the RCMA families they work with to help get community input.

 - Staff reviewed the Code Enforcement update, enclosure 7. The removal of the homeless camp on South 4th Street.

K. Citizen Comments

Ms. Silvia Puente reminded everyone that the library is open from 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. They do have a position open at their facility. Anyone that interested can go to the Collier County website under careers. It is an entry level library assistant position.

Ms. Annie Alvarez gave updates for Parks and Recreation. Park staff will be doing something for Earth Day. They will be opening up summer camp registration on March 1, 2021. They will also be doing a complete re-vamp of the Sports Complex; the pool will be closed for about a year. They are going to work on the building as well as the parking lot. She will have the Project Manager come out in a few months to give the board a complete update on this project.

Commissioner McDaniel informed the board that he is going to try to increase the IT capacity countywide to have less technological issues as we move forward with the virtual meetings. He has already contacted the CareerSource owner to discuss this issue. He asks that everyone be patient.

3. Redevelopment Plan


Staff issued Notice to Proceed to Johnson Engineering on December 1, 2020 to provide planning support services for the Immokalee Community Redevelopment Plan. Their proposal of \$79,710 is based on planning support services for the CRA staff's update to the Immokalee Community Redevelopment Plan. This effort is specific to Section 4 of the Collier County Community Redevelopment Agency Community Redevelopment Plan, amended May 2019. The Immokalee Community Redevelopment Plan will be prepared consistent with the policies of the Immokalee Area Master Plan adopted as part of the County's Growth Management Plan on December 10, 2019. Completion of this project is set for March 31, 2022 (485 days).

4. Infrastructure Projects in Immokalee

1) Eden park Elementary Safe Routes to School

- 6' Sidewalk on the south and west side of the road.
- Construction costs \$663,000.
- Funded with Safe Routes to School funds in FY 21/22.
- Construction in FY 22/23



2) Lake Trafford Road

- Design for projects 1&2 (Lake Trafford) has not started. In Negotiations.
- BCC award of Design has been pushed back to February. 2021.
- Construction 2022-2023
- Project 3 is discussed under Stormwater projects.



Design of bicycle and pedestrian features on Lake Trafford Road from Little League Road to Laurel Street. The project length is approximately 1.850 miles. Specifically, the design will provide for bicycle lanes on each side of the roadway within the project limits and design of a 6' sidewalk on the south side of the roadway from Carson Road to Krystal Lane and from North 18th Street to Laurel Street. Includes adjustment or relocation of the existing signalization at the intersection of Carson Road and 19th Street, Constrained right-of-way at 19th Street intersection may require bike lane tapers to if required.

3) TIGER (Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery) Grant

Immokalee Complete Streets TIGER Grant \$16,415,864 Project total. Funding sources are FHWA grand funds (80%) = \$13,132,691 County match funds (20%) = \$3,283,173.

Includes design and construction of 20 Miles of concrete sidewalks, a bike boulevard network, a shared-use path, street lighting, bus shelters, a new transit center, landscaping, drainage improvements, and intersection and traffic calming retreats.

Collier County has provided the CRA with an overview of estimated schedule with milestones. The design/build portion of this project is set to start early 2022 and construction is set to be completed early 2024.




4) Stormwater Improvements

The original Immokalee Stormwater Master Plan (ISWMP) was prepared by H.W. Lochner (2005). Camp Dresser & McKee (CDM) was contracted in 2010 to prepare construction plans for the Downtown Immokalee and Immokalee Drive projects plus update the ISWMP. A draft update document was prepared but not finalized. On November 28, 2018 county staff presented the follow-up analysis.

Immokalee Stormwater Project updates: North 3^{rd.} Street Stormwater Improvements:

The North 3rd Street Drainage proposed project is located on North 3rd Street between 2nd Avenue and Roberts Avenue West. The project would include roadside swales, installation of inlets on 3rd Street, construction of a storm drainpipe system to alleviate ponding and allow conveyance southward to the storm drain system on West Main Street. Cost for repairs is estimated at \$600,000. The grant funding contract is now finalized, and the project is entering the contractor bidding phase. The new project manager is Brittany Lazo with Collier County Stormwater Management. The contractor procurement process typically takes 5 or 6 months, but the process is moving forward.





Eden Gardens project:

The County has again applied for CDBG-DR grant funding for this project. The application is now in the review and response to questions stage. The Eden Garden Bypass Drainage Improvement proposed project is located is the area south of Westclox St., east of Boxwood Dr., west of Carson Rd., and generally north and northeast of Eden Gardens. The project would construct a new ditch along the northern boundary of Eden Gardens, install a 24" pipe under Boxwood Dr. to tie into the existing ditch along the northwest boundary of Eden Gardens to convey flows further west. Cost for repairs is estimated at \$600,000.

Madison Avenue Channel project:

On the northeastern side of Immokalee, county staff obtained Board of County Commissioners approval to purchase a 6-acre parcel just to the east of the Immokalee Foundation Career Path Learning Lab site. They are still working through the closing with the owner. That site will provide a pond site to improve stormwater quality from the outfalls along Madison Ave. Additionally, county staff is working with FDOT's design firms to coordinate the alignment of the SR-29 bypass loop so they can avoid having to route the stormwater from the Madison Avenue channel all the way around the north and east sides of the airport. So far, this coordination looks favorable.

Lake Trafford Road Area:

The single negotiated contract for designing both the stormwater treatment facility in the SE corner (Tract 3) of Arrowhead Reserve and the pathway and needed drainage improvements along Lake Trafford Road from Little League Road to Tippins Terrace is being scheduled for Board of County Commissioners approval in October. County staff sent draft executive summary to Procurement on 09/28/2020. County staff is looking at phasing the construction, with Phase 1 being the Arrowhead Tract 3 site and Phase 2 being the pathway and drainage west of Little League Road. The goal is to get the Phase 1 design done by roughly late February/early March 2021 so county staff can then start bidding for its construction start in FY 20/21. Staff plan on bidding the Phase 2 construction in the following fiscal year FY 21/22.



5. Commercial Façade Grant

Program is in place and being reviewed for revisions. On June 19, 2019 CRA board approved Lozano's Mini Mart for a \$20,000 façade grant for improvements to property located at 102 New Market Rd.

Staff met with Mini Mart owners to complete package for BCC submittal.

No update.



6. FHERO

Florida Heartland Economic Region of Opportunity – updates Staff continues to attend monthly meetings.

FHERO was awarded a \$22,000 grant to prepare an Economic Strategic Plan for Immokalee. Site Tour was conducted by VisonFirst on March 13, 2020. Staff provide VisionFirst with updates to draft Strategic plan. Final copy will be presented at a future meeting.

Staff processed annual membership fee in the amount of \$2,415.40. Pursuant to Executive Order 16-150, the RAO designation for the area around Immokalee included within the Round II Federal Rural Enterprise Community located in northeast Collier County shall be in effect for five years and will expire on June 27, 2021.

The CRA was awarded through FHERO a Site Improvement Plan DEO Grant totally 13,540 for Professional Services for Airpark Blvd. The Proposed scope of work include general consulting, engineering, planning, and survey services to evaluate the subject site for commercial development.

The CRA was also awarded through FHERO a Retail Demand Analysis DEPO Grant totally \$7,700 for Professional Services for assessment of retail demand in the Immokalee Community.

7. Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition

The Housing Committee is updated the Immokalee Disaster Recover Resiliency Plan and funding options for future projects. The Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition (IUNC) is a long-term recovery group that formed in the fall of 2017 as the result of Hurricane Irma. This group is composed of non-profits, faith based, local, state or national organizations who work together to meet the unmet of Immokalee residents impacted by disaster. Housing committee meetings are held the second Friday of every month via zoom.



8. EPA Brownfields Coalition Assessment Grant

Awarded to the Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council. Immokalee site identified in the grant was the **Immokalee Regional Airport** (165 Airpark Blvd., Immokalee, FL. 34142). Airport staff is coordinating with Terracon to complete assessment. Terracon provided staff with a draft report of the airport sites.

9. Development in Immokalee

1) Guadalupe Center van Otterloo Campus for Learning

The Guadalupe Center broke ground on October 30th for a new educational campus that will create lasting, transformational change for students in Immokalee. The van Otterloo Family Campus for Learning will feature two academic buildings with multiple classrooms, a library, learning lab, cafeteria and kitchen, playground, administrative offices, mentor lounges, commons areas, a medical and dental suite, outdoor gardens and a student wall of fame.

The campus will accommodate up to 154 students in Guadalupe Center's Early Childhood Education Program, as well as 125 high school students in the college-preparatory Tutor Corps Program. Guadalupe Center named the campus in honor of Rose-Marie and Eijk van Otterloo, whose generous \$5 million matching gift helped launch the project and inspired others to give. Within the campus, Brynne & Bob Coletti Hall will become the new home for the Tutor Corps Program. Barron Collier Companies donated 9.5 acres for the new campus. 2) Immokalee Foundation Learning Lab 18-home subdivision

The Immokalee Foundation Learning Lab 18-home subdivision in currently under construction. Collier Enterprises donated the 8 acres of land for a housing subdivision that will serve as a hands-on learning laboratory for student in the foundation's program., Career Pathways: Empowering Students to Succeed. BCB Homes, will be serving as the general contractor.



3) Redlands Christian Migrant Association (RCMA) Childcare Development Center and Community Hub

The RCMA proposed childcare center and community hub consist of Childcare classrooms, Area office, and playground. The development will accommodate 234 children and 30 employees. RCMA will be presenting to the CRA at a future meeting.



4) Redlands Christian Migrant Association (RCMA) Rollason Center Annex Building located at 402 W. Main Street (Headquarters)

The proposed three-story office building design is currently is discussion for development if funding permits.




5) Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance (IFHA)

10. The Face of Immokalee

On December 12, 2018 Michelle Tricca, a local Artist, presented The Face of Immokalee, a proposed outdoor photography installation celebrating the soul of Immokalee. CRA board supported the project and have formed a subcommittee to move the project forward.

The subcommittee last met on December 9, 2019 to discuss the art wall options for the old McCrory's building (S&O Grocery), Lipman Produce (trucks/building), site on 1st Street (Gadsden blue building), and the Zocalo plaza. Committee supported rendering provided by artist with minor changes. Ms. Tricca's photos were selected to be displayed at the BCC Chambers through February 29, 2020.

On October 22, 2020 CRA staff and Lipman staff met with Michelle Tricca to discuss project status.

On October 29, 2020 WGCU did a story on Ms. Tricca's public art installation for the Phase 1 portion of the project. Please see link to the WGCU Face of Immokalee Story. WGCU Face of Immokalee Story

On November 18, 2020 both the CRA and MSTU board supported The Face of Immokalee project and made a motion to allow the use of Zocalo Plaza Art Wall as a canvas for the project.

11. Impact Fee Installment Payment Program

The program is for areas within the Immokalee CRA Boundary. The program took effect on October 2017.

- 1) Pay your impact fees in installments over 20 years.

1. Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) Sidewalk Projects

i. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase II

Carver Street and S. 5th Street (funded with CDBG and CRA funds) Project #33588.1

In June 2019, through a competitive process, the Immokalee CRA was selected and awarded grant funds for additional sidewalk improvements along the southside of Immokalee. The CRA received a total of \$676,365 of HUD funding allocation for CDBG projects.

In June 2020, through a competitive bid process Coastal Concrete Products LLC d/b/a Coastal Site Development (Coastal Concrete) provided certification as a Section 3 Business and was awarded the contract in the amount of **\$821,756.00**. Total project cost is estimated at \$991,114.

Staff has processed CDBG reimbursement request to CHS for Applications #1 (\$20,750), #2 (\$56,353.35) and #3 (\$263,943.40) totaling \$341,046.75 in invoices for payment for Coastal Concrete (less retainage). A Change Order to the Construction Contract was prepared to extend the project completion from 2.28.21 to 3.17.21 to add an additional 17 days to the construction contract due to scheduling delays, modifications to shop drawings and weather conditions to allow for project completion. No additional funds are required. County Inspection on 1.27.21 revealed several minor issues that have mostly been corrected (e.g. open cuts have temporary asphalt, MOT signage up and sidewalk closed). Installation of stormwater boxes and pipe were completed on Carver Street by 2.3.21. The crews are working on the water main pipe installation on S 5th Street and the sidewalk forms and concrete work will commence on Carver once the survey is finalized. Progress Meetings are conducted biweekly and the 2.19.21 Meeting was an in-field walk with Staff, Contractor, CEI and Engineer.

ii. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase III – Eustis Avenue




On February 6, 2020 the CRA applied for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the construction of sidewalks along Eustis Avenue. Project area is highlighted in yellow from South 5th Street to South 1st Street (about .3 mile). Current and completed projects are highlighted in orange.

The total cost for the project (design and construction) is estimated at \$380,000. The MSTU (Fund 162) will design the project, and the anticipated cost is \$60,000. On March 6, 2020 CRA staff presented to CHS panel and staff for the grant project. In April 2020, staff were informed that they were not awarded the requested grant amount. Staff is moving forward with the Direct Select process for a Contractor to design this project to have it ready for consideration of grant funding in 2022.

2. Beautification Enhancements

i. Welcome Sign (Monuments)

The "Field of Dreams" painted mural by artist, Martha M. Cantu, was completed on 12.24.2020. Staff coordinated with Lykins to add the lettering "Welcome To" and "Immokalee My Home". The installation of the planter pots on the 1st/Eustis monument sign, irrigation & electrical hookup and landscaping planting is being coordinated with Hannula Landacaping & Irrigation Inc. for completion the week of 2.22.21. The Monument permit was extended to 3.3.21 and the ROW permit was extended to 3.13.21.

The Collier County Board of County Commissioners approved the reconfigured signs and for the work to exceed the \$50,000 threshold to complete the two signs on 1.26.21. The funding on the existing Purchase Order will complete the 1st Street sign and the Triangle sign Purchase Order is being processed after securing BCC's approval. Purchase Order was approved and received on 1.17.21. Lykins shall resume work on the project by doing a print on a ACM substrate and attach it to the Triangle sign with the lighted lettering underneath.

The Farm Worker's Village sign (Panther Crossing/SR 29) is pending the recording of the conveyance of an easement and the subordination, consent and joinder documents before Staff can proceed. The coordination of securing the required documentation is being managed by the Collier County Real Property Management Department.

The 100 bricks are stored at road maintenance, and Staff has prepared a draft Small Projects Request for Quote on 2.2.21 for approval to obtain bids.

3. Main Street Improvements

i. SR 29 (Main Street) from North 9th Street to North 1st Street (Project #439002-1) Pedestrian Safety Improvements

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) partnered with the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) and the Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU) to program a project on SR 29 in Immokalee due to a history high bicycle and pedestrian crashes and activity.

The purpose of the project is to increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety and consists of installing two RRFBs (Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons), pavement marking improvements, reconstruction of the lighting system, constructing a new signal at 3rd Street, drainage improvements, and sidewalk enhancements. The project is estimated at 1.98 Million. The FDOT Project Manager for this project is Josephine Mak.

Construction began in May 2020 and walk through was on 2.4.21. The County conducted the inspection on 2.8.21 of the new traffic signalization, loops, flasher assemblies load centers and lighting. On 2.11.21 County Inspectors identified only two deficiencies on all the new streetlight and these were immediately repaired; and on S. 4th Street there is a LCEC light fixed to a wooden electric pole that is directly over the streetlight circuit and will need to be relocated as it will affect the photocell and interfere with the timing of the streetlights. Staff participated in the final walk through on 2.18.21 and received a copy of the Final Punch List noting minor items for correction. The County's reinspection of signalization is scheduled for 2.23.21. The Contractor is expected completion of punch list activities by end of February 2021.

The FDOT will pay the cost to install 30 standard LED light Poles and the MSTU provided an advance deposit of \$125,342 to FDOT for installation of holiday attachments on 30 light poles and all efforts associated with adding the attachments, including banner arms, GFCI outlets, additional conductors, mobilization and maintenance of traffic at SR29 from 1st Street North to 9th Street North in Immokalee.

4. First Street Corridor Conceptual Plan

Q. Grady Minor & Associates, P.A (Grady Minor) has been hired to provide professional services for future street lighting and pedestrian safety improvements along South First Street (from Main Street to School Road/Seminole Crossing Trail) in Immokalee.

The work includes feasibility studies and conceptual plans for the purpose of relocating existing decorative light poles, considering the future street lighting and pedestrian safety improvements. Additionally, it includes reviewing and providing recommendations for the location of new pedestrian crosswalks and the location of new landscape and hardscape elements, for areas in need of improvements, considering the future street lighting and pedestrian safety improvements. Tom Hollis Engineering Consultants, Inc. will provide sub-consultant assistance for determining lighting requirements, light pole locations, and lighting specifications. The survey and on-site visits have been completed and traffic counts were utilized for pedestrian safety. Hollis Engineering verified with the existing blue pole's manufacturer that they meet current wind load criteria and are being evaluated along with LCEC light fixtures for the corridor. The Consultants shall provide Staff with an evaluation report and finalize recommendations in February 2021 to draft the concept plans. meeting with Consultants on 3.1.21 to discuss proposed plans. Total project cost for the evaluation is \$43,872 and work is scheduled to be completed 3.14.21.

5. Trash Cans and Garbage Pickup

Staff is continuing cleanup efforts with our Maintenance Contractor. Staff is working on setting up an Interagency discussion for a solution and funding. Some possible solutions are daily walk throughs and clean up by workers, a local educational effort to keep the sidewalks clean and/or the removal of the benches from Main Street to stop the homeless from loitering and littering.

6. Main Street Improvements

In addition to trash removal, another issue is that mulch in the medians is coming into the roadway. Chickens are making beds in the mulch. The solution is to remove the chickens and to remove the dirt in the medians and replant in the problem areas. Commissioner William "Bill" McDaniel is coordinating with the Sheriff's Office to utilize "Weekend Warriors" for clean-up of excessive trash.

7. Zocalo Plaza

i. Parks & Recreation Monthly Maintenance

Park staff continue doing monthly maintenance (painting, trimming, cleaning, and mulch) of plaza; and Staff is billing CRA & MSTU quarterly. Staff is monitoring the quality of maintenance services being provided. Between the period of January 29th and February 10th, Domestic Animal Services assisted Staff with trapping eight chickens, removing them from Zocalo and placing them for adoption. The chicken population will be monitored and reengage the DAS services as needed.





ii. CRA Staff

Simmonds Electric commenced work (Purchase Order issued for \$15,627,03) at Zocalo on 1.7.21 for the electrical enhancements for additional loads and to provide a cut-off switch in the electrical room area for the Plaza. Simmonds completed the wiring for the proposed kiosk and better amps for holiday decorations on 1.27.21. Electrician recommended relocating the step-down transformer above ground level. On 2.5.21, Staff authorized for the step-down transformer located in the underground PVC Junction box to be placed above ground and waterproof.

GEC, LLC's quote of \$4,514 was awarded as lowest bidder to purchase, permit and manage the installation of the kiosk together with the relocation of the pineapple bike rack. On January 27, 2021, Staff send photos of the pavers to GEC for the repairs after the bike rack is moved. The contractor ordered the kiosk from the manufacturer and anticipates delivery from the Manufacturer the week of 2.22.21 and installation the first week of March.

8. Roadway Improvements

i. SR 29/Westclox Street

The design for a roundabout for this intersection is completed. On 1.11.21 FDOT reported that the project is approved and is being authorized for the equipment to be purchased for a full signal light for that intersection. It should be constructed sometime early next year.



ii. SR 82 Road Widening Project Gator Slough Lane to SR 29 (Project # 430849-1.

The Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) contractor, Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, began work at the end of the year 2019 to widen SR 82 from Gator Slough Lane to SR 29, from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, while allowing for a future six-lane roadway. Additional improvements on this 3.2-mile corridor include construction of 5-foot wide paved shoulders, which will also serve as bike lanes, a 54-foot wide median, a 10-foot multi-use trail along the south side, and a 5-foot sidewalk along the north side.

The intersection at SR 29 will be changed from a condition stop with flashing beacon to a roundabout. The construction is expected to be completed by summer of 2022. The community outreach manager is Lisa Macias. The Project Manager is Dennis Day.



9. CAT Bus Stop #353 located on Roberts Ave W in front of Roberts Senior Center

Bus stop 353 located on Roberts Avenue West in front of the Roberts Senior Center was originally was planned for ADA improvement but after further review it was determined based on the counts it met the criteria for a bench to be incorporated into the improvements and a shelter. CAT did not have the funds to cover all the construction. CAT obtain support from the CRA and the MSTU for a total shared cost between the CRA and MSTU of \$30,000 with each paying a not-to-exceed amount of \$15,000 to complete bus stop improvement to include ADA compliance, bench, bike rack, trash can, stormwater improvements and a shelter. The shelter and amenities were ordered but are not anticipated to arrive until late April 2021 to complete the installation. Staff contacting CAT Staff with questions regarding the ADA access when boarding a bus.
