The meeting was called to order by Bernardo Barnhart, MSTU Chair at 8:32 A.M.

B. Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silent.

Christie Betancourt led the Pledge of Allegiance and Bernardo Barnhart led a moment of silence.

C. Roll Call and Announcement of a Quorum.

Christie Betancourt opened roll call. A quorum was announced for the MSTU board.

Staff presented the board with the December 18, 2019 Joint CRA & MSTU Meeting Minutes, Budget, Operations Manager's Report, and Community Meetings.

Staff reviewed the communications folder with the board and members of the public. The folder contained the public notice for this meeting, the 2020 Calendar for the CRA and MSTU meetings, Governor DeSantis open vacancy's, IUNC Housing Committee meeting, Mr. William Austin Deyo's obituary, and upcoming community event listing.

Staff reiterated the public 3-minute speaker slip policy. The board will give more time if they feel it necessary.

Staff announced that the Budget and Workplan Workshop has been scheduled for February 13, 2020, members of the boards and public are encouraged to attend.

1. MSTU Project Manager Report (Enclosure 5)

Staff informed the board that Julian Morgan's last day as Project Manager is January 24, 2020. Staff also informed board that they will be applying for another grant. This would be to continue the sidewalk in the Eustis area from South 5th to South 1st, an area of about .3 of a mile, a map of the proposed section is in the Project Manager's report located in Enclosure 5. The window to apply is very short, deadline is February 10, 2020.

2. Main Street Improvements Project – FDOT Project #439002-1 – update

Staff informed board that the Carver/South 5th street project is currently at 90% plans, awaiting the engineer to address a few items and the project should be at 100% plans within the next month. Bid documents are going out. Julian will be working on a map of the blue poles, as to condition, and any other item that might be pressing. Poles may be replaced or just moved to certain areas of concern. They could also be sold for surplus. A lighting plan assessment will need to be done for the needs of the lighting areas to be addressed. One area of concern other than the lighting was the issue of trash pickup during the holidays. Christmas and New Year landed on trash pickup day so there was no pickup for 14 days. The problem would be if this happens again, there needs to be something done to address this before it happens again. Staff will try and check the schedule and see what can be done in the future. Commissioner McDaniel would like a copy of the email so that he can have his staff check the contract and see what the verbiage states for this type of incident.

3. Holiday Decorations

Staff informed board that there will be a five-year contract going out for bid on the holiday decorations to avoid any last-minute issues. The maintenance department will be doing some minor repairs and re-painting at the Zocalo park.

4. Monuments – Welcome Signs

Ms. Sharon Johnson with Lykins addressed the board with updates. All permits are in, they only need to pick out the colors for the monuments. Three colors are needed, one for the body, one for the molding and one for the background. the board would like to go with different shades of the cream color for the body and the molding and an off white for the background. A rendering will be sent back for final approval.

 Staffed reviewed the schedule of maintenance with the board and members of the public.
 - 2. Project Manager Observation Field Report (Enclosure 7)
 Staff reviewed the PM observation field report with the board and provided updates on the mulch installation, the banners, the cemetery on Main Street and Zocalo plaza.

Mr. Armando Yzaguirre presented on the excess gum on the sidewalks along Main Street. He informed the board that all the companies he reached out to for removal of the gum were in the excess of \$5,000.00. He purchased specific nozzle needed for the pressure washer to see how long it would take for one of his employees to do the work. It took 45 minutes to do one square along one of the worst areas on main street. He estimates that ten squares would cost \$500 for one employee to do it.

He suggested that we get the owners to pay half and agree to maintain the area once it has been cleaned. The target is along Main Street. The board could choose to do a test, maybe at Zocalo Park, to see how much can be done for the \$500.

Action: Ms. Andrea Halman made a motion to remov gum on the sidewalk along the Zocalo park area at a not-to-exceed amount of \$500. Mr. Peter Johnson seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 3-0.

Ms. Victoria Peters had responses to the boards previous questions of the work that is being done on SR 82 and SR 29. The gas lines and pipes being put in are for both natural and propane gas, the company is taking advantage of the construction to update the pipes and infrastructure prior to construction starting. The construction company is 60 days into their contract and are on schedule. They will be starting drainage soon. She did not have updates yet on the roundabout but will get back with the board as soon as she has them. Josephine Mac is the possible point of contact for this project.

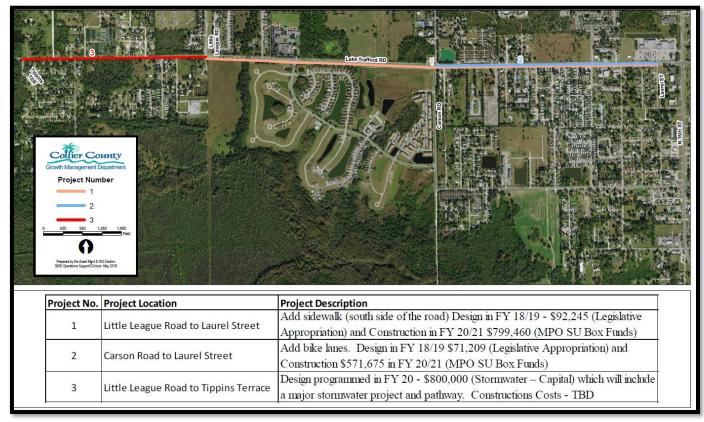

4. TIGER (Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery) Grant

Immokalee Complete Streets TIGER Grant -\$16,415,864 Project total. Funding sources are FHWA grand funds (80%) = \$13,132,691 County match funds (20%) = \$3,283,173.

- Includes design and construction of 20 Miles of concrete sidewalks, a bike boulevard network, a shared-use path, street lighting, bus shelters, a new transit center, landscaping, drainage improvements, and intersection and traffic calming retreats.
- Collier County has provided the CRA with an overview of estimated schedule with milestones.
 The design/build portion of this project is set to start Winter 2020 and construction is set to be completed Winter 2023.

7. Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition

The Housing Committee met on January 8, 2020 and provided updates on housing improvements in Immokalee. The committee is working on revising the Immokalee Disaster Recover Resiliency Plan and funding options for future projects. The Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition (IUNC) is a long-term recovery group that formed in the fall of 2017 as the result of Hurricane Irma. This group is composed of non-profits, faith based, local, state or national organizations who work together to meet the unmet of Immokalee residents impacted by disaster. The IUNC works in collaboration with other agencies to assess needs, offer resources and ensure that residents are assisted after their resources (FEMA, SBA loans, and personal insurance) have been exhausted.

Our objectives are to:

- Provide residents with spiritual and emotional care management.
- Home repairs according to unmet needs funding
- Community care through case management.

Priorities

The Immokalee Unmet Needs goal is to assure that our community is prepared for future disaster by:

- Educating about the process and resources for recovery
- Joining the county Emergency Management Plan (Including the IUNC in the Emergency Management Plan assures that necessary decisions are made beforehand.)
- Keeping donations local
- Workshops
- Improving communication

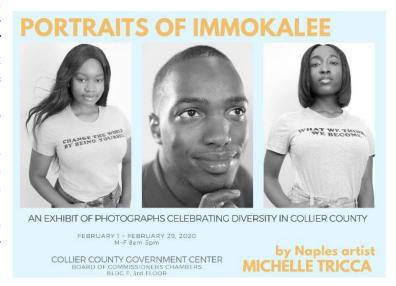




10. The Face of Immokalee

Project Manager Report 02/20/2020



1. Pedestrian Safety Improvements

i. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase III – Eustis Avenue



On February 6, 2020 the CRA applied for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the construction of sidewalks along Eustis Avenue.

Project area is highlighted in yellow (see above) from South 5th Street to South 1st Street (about .3 mile). Current and completed projects are highlighted in orange (see above).

Total cost for the project (design and construction) is estimated at \$380,000 over two fiscal years. The MSTU (Fund 162) will design the project in FY20, anticipated cost is \$60,000. The CRA (Fund 186) will contribute \$20,000 for CEI services in FY21.

In FY21, if grant funds are awarded, a Budget Amendment of \$320,000 will be initiated to recognize the grant revenue of \$300,000 and \$20,000 in CRA Fund 186. Although this grant application does not require a match; the CRA is pledging a monetary match of \$20,000 for CEI services for the project in fiscal year (FY21). Total contribution to this project by the MSTU and CRA is \$80,000.

ii. SR 29 (Main Street) from North 9th Street to North 1st Street (Project #439002-1)

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) partnered with the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) and the Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU) to program a project on SR 29 in Immokalee due to a history high bicycle and pedestrian crashes and activity.

The purpose of the project is to increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety and consists of installing two RRFBs (Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons), signing and pavement marking improvements, reconstruction of the lighting system, constructing a new signal at 3rd Street, drainage improvements, and sidewalk enhancements. The project is estimated at 1.98 Million. The FDOT Project Manager for this project is David Jones.



Project Schedule:

- 100% design completed in May 2019.
- Out for bid by July 2019.
- Award the contract to the contractor by December 2019.
- Construction will begin within 60/90 days after awarded contract (April 2020).
- Expected completion by September 2020.

Background:

- FDOT will pay the cost to install 30 standard LED light Poles.
- MSTU will pay the cost difference to add the enhancements.

The MSTU provided an advance deposit of \$125,342 to FDOT for installation of holiday attachments on 30 light poles and all efforts associated with adding the attachments, including banner arms, GFCI outlets, additional conductors, mobilization and maintenance of traffic at SR29 from 1st Street North to 9th Street North in Immokalee.

iii. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase II

Carver Street and S. 5th Street (funded with CDBG and CRA funds) Project #33588.1

The CRA received a total of \$676,365 of HUD funding allocation for CDBG projects. The Immokalee Sidewalk 2018 Improvement Project will allow the CRA to complete sidewalk improvements along a portion of Carver Street & South 5th Street. The CRA has allocated \$100,000 for design in fiscal year 2019 and \$60,000 for construction in fiscal year 2020. The total project cost is estimated at \$860,000. Depending on cost estimate the CRA may have to use additional funds to complete the project.

This project is part of a sidewalk implementation program in Immokalee, which will provide many benefits including safety, mobility, and healthier communities. The sidewalks will make the community more attractive to potential businesses to come to the community, thus will increase job opportunities.



Action Plan:

- 90% Plans were submitted for review which ended on December 31, 2019.
- A couple of reviews came back with responses. We received commend from CAT and the ISWD.
- We need to schedule a meeting soon.
- Also, ABB will send-out our survey crew to survey the improvements associated with 125 Carver Street. Hopefully, the finish in a timely manner once they start.
- ABB has used the proposed design information provided from the County to act as the existing drainage conditions for the 90% plan submittal.
- Once we have the review comments back, we can schedule another meeting to discuss them and any other plan changes you might want to see.
- ABB anticipates 30-45 days to turn around the final 100% plans. We can look at your grant schedule at that point if we need to fine tune the delivery date.

iv. Blue Light Poles

Light poles inspection and mapping. Staff is conducting an assessment and inventory of existing light poles in district area. Staff will determine if poles in the project area can be reconfigured into knockdown areas or other areas that need lighting. Staff will investigate options for storage of the poles and bring forward to a future meeting.

Status of Insurance Claims:

- Claim #50-09011909629 for Pole #11 is pending SR29 & New Market Rd West.
- Claim #53-03101808019 for Pole #20 is being paid in installments so it's not listed and pending.

Total reimbursed this fiscal year is \$53,778.97 to MSTU funds (\$52,878.97 fund 162 and \$900 fund 111).

2. Trash Cans & Garbage Pickup

Staff is continuing cleanup efforts with our Maintenance Contractor, Waste Connections and our Community Taskforce to keep Immokalee clean.

3. Zocalo Plaza

- i. Parks & Recreation Monthly Maintenance
 - Staff is doing monthly maintenance of plaza. Monthly reports are being provided to CRA staff on a quarterly basis.
 - Staff is billing CRA & MSTU funds quarterly.
 - Cleaning, Painting, trimming, mulch installation, and Decorating assistance.

 - Staff is seeking better option for decorating at the plaza.
 - New lighting and decorations
 - o 5-year contract for installing Holiday Decorations

4. Beautification Enhancements

- i. Welcome Signs (Monuments)
 - 1. Repairs to Monument Sign on SR 29 (Triangle Area) & Monument on 1st Street and Eustis Avenue. Update: Lykins was awarded the contract to do repairs and replacement totaling \$48,815.
 - 2. Replacement/New Monument Sign on 1St Street and SR29 (Farm Workers Village) Update: Pending easement access.

5. Roadway Improvements

i. SR 82 Road Widening Project Gator Slough Lane to SR 29 (Project # 430849-1.

The Florida Depart of Transportation (FDOT) held an information session for the community to illustrate plans and renderings for the up and coming four lane roadway widening project which is to include a roundabout. Improvements will be made to a stretch of 3.2 miles of roadway. The community outreach manager is Lisa Macias. The Project Manager is Dennis Day.



Roundabout added features:

- Shoulder (5 feet wide)
- Bike Lanes on south side
- Sidewalk (5 feet wide) on north side
- Median (54 feet wide)
- Multi-use Trail (10 Feet) along south side

Project Outline:

- Scheduled to begin towards the end of 2019
- Construction ending in 2022
- Estimated cost of \$29 million
- Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida

6. Panther Path Pedestrian Crossing Bridge

Bridge was pressure washed and painted. Road Maintenance Division provided the materials to Collier County Public Schools. School volunteers painted the vertical walls at the end of each ramp.

Update: More areas need painting. Need to coordinate with school and county to get a skilled volunteer artist to finish the unpainted areas. CRA Board provided a letter to Commissioner McDaniel's be included in the discussion when SR29 is expanded along the bridge area.
