MINUTES

Meeting of the Immokalee Beautification MSTU Advisory Committee on April 27, 2022. The Advisory Committee members, staff, and public appeared virtually and in person.

A. Call to Order.

The meeting was called to order by David Turrubiartez Jr., MSTU Chair at 8:39 A.M.

- B. <u>Pledge of Allegiance and Moment of Silence.</u>
 Mr. David Turrubiartez, Jr. led the Pledge of Allegiance and asked for a moment of silence.
- C. <u>Roll Call and Announcement of a Quorum.</u> Christie Betancourt opened roll call. A quorum was announced. <u>MSTU Advisory Committee Members Present</u>: David Turrubiartez Jr., Bernardo Barnhart (8:44 a.m.), Andrea Halman, Norma Garcia , and Ana Estrella. <u>MSTU Advisory Committee Members Present via Zoom</u>: Christina Guerrero. <u>MSTU Advisory Committee Members Absent/Excused</u>: Cherryle Thomas. <u>Others Present in Person</u>: Armando Yzaguirre, Victoria Peters, Aristeo Alviar, and Diana Mcgowen. <u>Others Present via Zoom</u>: Lupita Vazquez Reyes and Lorraine Lantz. Staff Present in Person: Debrah Forester, Christie Betancourt, Yvonne Blair, and Marilyn Gijon.
 D. Voting Privileges for Board Members via Zoom.

One member present via zoom.

Action: Ms. Norma Garcia made a motion to allow board members zoom privileges. Ms. Andrea Halman seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 4-0.

E. <u>Approval of Agenda.</u>

Staff presented the agenda to the boards for approval. Agenda was approved as presented.

Action: Ms. Norma Garcia made a motion to approve agenda as presented. Ms. Andrea Halman seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 5-0.

Staff announced the newest MSTU Board Member Ana Estrella, was present in person. Ms. Estrella briefly introduced herself as the Director of St. Matthews House. She explained that she hopes her peer board members can help in guiding her as the newest board member, and she is very excited to be a part of the board.

F. <u>Approval of Consent Agenda</u>.

Staff briefly went over Community Meetings and activities that involve Immokalee. Board meetings such as CCPS Regular Board Meeting, Collier County Parks & Recreation Advisory Board Meeting (PARAB), Immokalee Water & Sewer District Board Meeting, and the Immokalee Fire Control District Board Meeting are all included with location and time.

Action Ms. Andrea Halman made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Ms. Christina Guerrero seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 6-0.

- G. Announcements.
 - Public Comments speaker slips CRA Staff reiterated the public 3-minute speaker slip policy. The board will give more time if they feel it necessary.
 - 2. Communications Folder

Staff reviewed the communications folder with the board and members of the public. The folder contained the public notice for this meeting and community event flyers for upcoming events. Staff briefly discussed the flyers for the events Parks & Rec are hosting the rest of April and May. Florida Lions Eye Clinic will be hosting Free Eye Exams on May 22nd at iTECH.

3. CRA Annual Workshop on May 3, 2022, at BCC Chambers. Staff announced the CRA Annual Workshop will begin at 9:00 a.m. and the Immokalee CRA is predicted to be up for discussion at 10:00 a.m.

H. Other Agencies

- 1. Code Enforcement Updates (Enclosure 4) No updates, just listing of cases.
- 2. FDOT updates

Ms. Victoria Peters asked if there were any questions directed for FDOT in last week's CRA Advisory Board meeting (April 20, 2022). Ms. Victoria also asked for feedback on the roundabout in its current state. She also updated FDOT liaisons are currently working on TIP, which is the Transportation Improvement Program. FDOT is also starting to outline the new projects for the next cycle of the work program. Staff asked for an update on the traffic light located on Westclox Street and SR29.

Ms. Victoria responded they should be starting this week, according to the last update she got when she spoke to the Project Manager for Collier County. The scheduled time to begin was the last week of April and they anticipate to be done by the end of this summer. Mr. Aristeo Alviar asked what time of the day they are scheduled to be working. Ms. Victoria said she would find out the completion date and find out a work date and email. Ms. Victoria also mentioned the round-about on State Road 82 will technically be completed at the end of Summer 2022.



Mr. Aristeo Alviar mentioned there was some confusion with the two lanes located on the roundabout and staff suggested a directional sign, addressing which lane takes you to which road.

Staff also mentioned receiving questions on when the last section of State Road 82 that needs that needs to be four lanes will be completed.

Ms. Victoria responded that it is still in design, the design was pushed out for around a year. Staff asked if the freight video mentioned in previous meetings was available to share and educate the semi-truck drivers who may have a hard time maneuvering the roundabout, but Ms. Victoria said she would ask another project manager.

3. Other Community Agencies

Ms. Diana McGowen, Collier County Public Schools Community Liaison spoke on behalf of CCPS. Ms. McGowen addressed the questions that arose at last week's CRA Advisory Board meeting (April 20,2022) regarding the population ratios it takes for CCPS to put up a school. She explained there is a state law that states a school can't be built unless there are enough students to fill the school.

Mr. Bernardo Barnhart asked Ms. McGowen if she knew the exact count for the students currently? Ms. McGowen said the count for students is currently in the 1800s. Mr. Bernardo Barnhart said if there are nearly 2000 students, what other data is needed for a new school to be built?

Mr. Aristeo Alviar suggested to Ms. McGowen that when CCPS experts on the numbers do come for the next CRA meeting, they should be ready to answer all the questions being asked.

Mr. Bernardo Barnhart asked about the teacher's turnover rate and Ms. McGown responded the turnover rate is 30%.

I. <u>Old Business.</u>

- 1. Contractor Maintenance Report
 - i. A & M Property Maintenance Report & Schedule (Enclosure 5)

Staff provided board a copy of enclosure 5 which is a copy of the work completed in March and the upcoming landscape maintenance schedule for April and May. Mr. Armando Yzaguirre explained the extra trash pickup got approved, which will help with the trash throughout Main Street. He also brought up the issue of some pipes breaking while signs were being put up for an event and suggested putting signs somewhere else to prevent this from happening again.

Ms. Norma Garcia referred to the March MSTU meeting under Project Manager Observation Field Report and asked about the tree at the St. Matthews Thrift Store. Staff reassured the trees were replanted by St. Matthews at no expense to the MSTU Board.

Mr. Bernardo Barnhart suggested an idea of putting something as permanent display where events can be displayed long-term, so this issue doesn't keep happening.



Mr. Armando Yzaguirre suggested putting something on the right side because visitors are coming in through the right lane of SR 29 and the triangle is on the left so they would have to look across the street to see the signs. Staff explained the triangle is maintained by the MSTU Board, but the road is an FDOT road. Mr. Yzaguirre also mentioned he may have to cap some lines on the pipes so there may be some dryness in the plants until there is some rain.

2. TIGER Grant updates

Staff announced that the TIGER Grant public informational meeting will be held on May 25, 2022. Ms. Lorraine Lantz from Transportation Planning confirmed the meeting will be held Wednesday May 25, 2022, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at CareerSource in Immokalee, FL. There will be no presentation for this meeting.

Ms. Lorraine Lantz also announced the Immokalee Transportation Network Project and want to be more involved in the MSTU Board Meetings as interested parties, moving forward with that plan.

- J. <u>New Business.</u>
 - MSTU 2022 Priorities (Enclosure 6) Staff briefly discussed the Priorities for 2022. The priorities for MSTU 2022 will require partnership

funding with the CRA.

First Street Corridor: Staff applied and were awarded CDBG \$250,000 grant for the design portion of this corridor. The funds will be available in October 2023. MSTU funding will be needed mostly for construction after receiving the CDBG grant for design for First Street in Immokalee.

Lake Trafford: A direct select was issued to Jacob's Engineering and staff is working to get a proposal for a lighting study to be done to the Lake Trafford area, all the way to the lake. The study will go all the way to the lake, State Road 29, and a portion of Carson.

Sidewalk Phase III: Staff received 90% plans for Phase III of the South side portion of Immokalee Sidewalk project located on a portion of Delaware from South 5th to First Street and from Eustis to First Street. The MSTU paid for the design portion of the area and funds were just awarded for the construction.

Main Street Streetscape: A direct select was issued to Johnson Engineering and staff is working with them to get a proposal

MSTU will be funding Main Street streetscape design ending on Hancock and 2nd Street. Staff hopes to have completion plans within the next couple of weeks.

K. Staff Reports.

1. Project Manager Observation Field Report (Enclosure 7)

Staff provided board a copy of enclosure 7 which is the Project Manager Observation field report for the MSTU beautification area.



Staff discussed in detail key areas which include Zocalo Plaza, banners on Main Street, the Historical Cemetery on Main Street, and the plantings at the Welcome sign at the Triangle area.

The 8 wooden existing benches located at the Zocalo Plaza were sanded down and treated for a total of \$1,200. Work began on April 1 and the benches were refurbished within the week. A&M Maintenance trimmed the bougainvillea for the lighting improvements in the trellis area located at Zocalo Park.

Staff provided the Electrical Contractor, Simmonds Electrical, (Simmonds) a Purchase Order for \$18,254.51. Simmonds advised that pole #29 has a mid-arm as seen in the photos at the site when the pole was knocked down, but the serial number tag that was provided references a pole assembly that does not have a mid-arm so one was not quoted. Simmonds provided a revised quote of \$23,493.92 including the mid-arm component. Staff prepared a PO Modification on April 4 in the amount of \$5,239.41 and is awaiting finalization of the PO modification to provide to Simmonds.

2. Project Manager Report (Enclosure 8)

Ms. Yvonne Blair reviewed the project managers report as shown in enclosure 8. Staff briefly discussed the Carver Street & South 5th Street Project, the Eustis Avenue & West Delaware Avenue Phase III Project, Trash Cans and Garbage Pickup, the Main Street Improvements and Lighting, Main Street Corridor Streetscape Design Plan, and the Zocalo Plaza improvement project. The damaged grates on Main Street have been repaired.

Staff updated that the Carver Street Project is now completed as a proposed post-project improvement, Staff has coordinated with Road Maintenance the paving of Carver Street in the 2022 Maintenance Overlay Schedule.

The target date for the design completion of the Immokalee Sidewalk Project, Eustis Avenue & West Delaware Sidewalk Phase III is June of 2022.

Staff announced after moving forward with an application for a grant funding the design for First Street Corridor, funding is granted for the design and will be available for FY 2023.

Staff announced additional funding is needed to finish the Welcome Sign Projects located at the Triangle area on SR 29 and New Market Road (refer to Enclosure 8, item 9). After having to change the channel lettering an additional \$2,786 is needed to complete the project. The total project cost will move up to \$57,600 of which \$52,772 has already been paid.

Action Ms. Andrea Halman made a motion to approve the additional funding of \$2, 786 to complete the welcome sign project. Ms. Norma Garcia seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 6-0.

Operations Manager Report (Enclosure 9)
 Staff provided the Operations Manager Report for review in Enclosure 9. Staff also provided brief updates on the Housing Development Projects in Immokalee.



The projects discussed were the Immokalee Foundation Learning Lab 18 home subdivision, the Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance proposed housing development, the Habitat for Humanity of Collier County

Kaicasa housing development, Casa Amigos, and the Casa San Juan Diego Multi-Family housing development.

Staff announced once the Redevelopment Plan gets adopted, the Commercial Façade Grant will be revisited, hoping to add residential while it currently is only for existing buildings with the ability of \$20,000.

Staff also announced that staff still meets monthly with the Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition Housing Subcommittee where housing updates are provided.

The Guadalupe Grand Opening ceremony for the Guadalupe Center van Otterloo Campus for Learning was held April 21, 2022, at 11:00 a.m.

The campus will accommodate up to 154 students in Guadalupe Center's Early Childhood Education Program, as well as 125 high school students in the college-preparatory Tutor Corps Program.

The Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance has moved forward with infrastructure for their housing which are planned to be 8 buildings with 16 apartments each. Their land clearing started in September and construction is now underway.

Habitat for Humanity have moved forward with Phase 1 of their Kaicasa Housing Development, they are moving forward with phase 2 and 3 of clearing the land but only with Phase 1 of Infrastructure.

The Seminole Trading Post is under construction and the ground breaking was held April 26 for the Health Center.

A&M:

A&M is cleaning the streets according to their schedule and their work continues to be satisfactory.

Project Manager Report 05/18/2022

1. Carver Street and S. 5th Street (funded with CDBG and CRA funds) Project #33588.1 Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase II

Coastal Concrete Products LLC d/b/a Coastal Site Development completed the project. On S 5^{th} Street there was a curb installed along the side of the sidewalk as directed by the County Inspector during the Final Walk Through in April 2021. Warranty Inspection was conducted on 3.17.22 and the Warranty Items have been completed with the exception of the installation of a handrail on the curb which is an unwarranted item. The Contractor is providing Staff with a quote for the handrail on S 5^{th} Street with the installation of a new footer. The existing curb is not substantial enough to support a handrail.

As a proposed post-project improvement, Staff has coordinated with Road Maintenance the paving of Carver Street in the 2022 Maintenance Overlay Schedule.

2. Trash Cans and Garbage Pickup

Staff is continuing cleanup efforts for weekends on Main Street utilizing the Weekend Warriors while our Maintenance Contractor picks up trash during the week. A&M is temporarily making additional trash pick-up and removing trash from bins. Additional services may only be utilized until end of May or early June when the population decreases, and trash decreases in the Summer.

The Immokalee CRA, Collier County Parks & Recreation, The Immokalee Foundation, Immokalee High School, Immokalee Library, and the Botanical Gardens participated in the Earth Day Event held on April 22 from 9-11 AM. Trash was picked up along Main Street from $1^{st} - 9^{th}$ Street and on Roberts Avenue. The Botanical Gardens planted at the Immokalee Library and the Immokalee Community Park.

3. Main Street Improvements

Grates: On 4.7.22 FDOT advised their Engineer provided two solutions to the grate breakage: #1 remove the non-rectangular or shorten grate and segments at the return or #2 welding the two end grates together (which was done and did not work).

Ferrovail Services, FDOT's subcontractor, repaired the three damaged grates with welded in support legs at the end grates within the radius on N 3rd St, S 2nd St and S 4th St grates. They are monitoring how well they hold up. No damage has been noted as of the 5.9.22 MSTU Walking Tour.

4. First Street Zocalo Plaza (107 N. 1st Street)

i. Parks & Recreation Monthly Maintenance

Park staff continue doing monthly maintenance (painting, trimming, cleaning, and mulch) of plaza; and Staff is billing CRA & MSTU quarterly. Staff is monitoring the quality of maintenance services being provided.

ii. CRA

<u>Palmettos</u>. The palmettos on the east side of the stage are overgrown and needed to be trimmed back to help reduce the occupation by the homeless and chickens. The work was completed on 5.9.22 by Facilities Management.

<u>Bird of Paradise</u>. A claim was submitted for the damaged bird of paradise logo sign. Lykins Signtek provided a proof and a \$660 quote for the repairs. Repair work is being scheduled.

<u>Fencing</u>. On 4.1.22 Request for Quotes were sent to vendors to fence in the electrical panel boxed area. Quotes were due 4.22.22 and a 2^{nd} Request was resubmitted with s due date of 5.10.22. No responses and Staff seeking instruction from Procurement on how to proceed.

<u>Lighting</u>. Three (3) Scopes for Work were sent to Simmonds Electrical on 3.30.22 for Quotes. An emergency Purchase Order was issued to Simmonds on 5.6.22 to trouble shoot no power to all lights and the park is dark. On 5.10.22 Simmonds reported contactor is not engaging all the way and needs replaced. As a temporary repair, only lights working, bypassed the receptacles to not overload system until a new contactor is installed. Awaiting quote for repairs.

Scopes of Work:

- 1. Need to get all lights operational on the band shell, trellis, and string of lights over the diagonal walk.
- 2. An analysis on the replacement of light fixtures versus the replacement of bulbs on the existing fixtures located on band shell, the trellis and overhead string of lights.
- 3. Installation of two lights for the exterior rear of the band shell as recommended by the Landscape Architect when Zocalo was built, but never installed.

<u>Memorial Benches</u>. Two 6' memorial benches delivered to the CRA on 5.5.22. A Request for Quotes for the installation of the benches under the trellis was posted on 5.2.22 with a due date of 5.16.22.

Power Wash. The stage was power washed on 5.6.22.

<u>Container</u>. Staff temporarily put on-hold the raising of the storage container 6" and adding a vent until Parks & Recreation moves the existing fence at South Park to accommodate Parks & Recreation's utilization of their field.

5. SR 82 Road Widening Project Gator Slough Lane to SR 29 (Project #430849-1) No Update.

FDOT's contractor, Ajax Paving, has been working to widen SR 82 from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, while allowing for a future six-lane. The estimated completion of the project is the end of Summer 2022.

1. Immokalee Area Master Plan (IAMP) Restudy

(PL201880002258) Approved by BCC for final adoption on 12/10/2019.

 - Implementation schedule was provided at the November 2020 Meeting.
 - County staff discussed IAMP Policy 6.1.3 Downtown Ped Amenities and 3.1.4 Central Business District at the March 17, 2021, CRA Meeting.
 - First LDC Workshop was held on May 19, 2021, following the CRA meeting.
 - County staff if finalizing Scope of Work for consultant.

2. CRA Office

CareerSource SWFL building is open with mask requirements. Job Bank Assistant – staff is continuing to use KeyStaff temp service until further action is taken.

3. <u>Redevelopment Plan</u>

Staff issued Notice to Proceed to Johnson Engineering on December 1, 2020, to provide planning support services for the Immokalee Community Redevelopment Plan. This effort is specific to Section 4 of the Collier County Community Redevelopment Agency Community Redevelopment Plan, amended May 2019. The Immokalee Community Redevelopment Plan will be prepared consistent with the policies of the Immokalee Area Master Plan adopted as part of the County's Growth Management Plan on December 10, 2019. Change Order #2 was approved for additional funding and more days. Completion of this project is now set for May 31, 2022 (546 days).

From February 16, 2021, through August 2021, staff conducted online survey with a variety of questions to solicit public input on the following topics: Cultural Survey, Recreation Survey, Housing Survey, Economic Development Survey, and Transportation Survey. All surveys were available in English, Spanish, and Creole. A Community Kick-off Hybrid Meeting was held on March 31, 2021. Focus Group meeting were held the month of April and May. Smaller Focus Group Meetings were held with Guadalupe Staff, RCMA parents, RCMA staff, Chamber Board Members, Coalition of Immokalee Farm Workers (Spanish), Church of the Nazarene (Creole), and the Rotary Club.

On October 20, 2021, staff provided CRA & MSTU board a copy of the Section 4 language and the Immokalee Sidewalk Master Plan for review. Staff requested the board and public to review and provide comments prior to next meeting.

At the November 17, 2021, Joint CRA & MSTU Meeting staff announced that final public comments were submitted, and a presentation would be held on December 14, 2021.

Staff presented at the CRA Advisory Board meeting at 9:00 a.m. on December 14, 2021, and at the Community Input Meeting at 6:00 p.m. at the CareerSource on the same day. Presentation highlighted the goals, objectives, and strategies. Goals included Celebrating Culture, Economic Development, Housing, Infrastructure, and Plan Implementation/Admin.

Staff presented a draft Amendment to the Redevelopment Plan on February 16, 2022. CRA board approved the plan with two additions.

Collier County Planning Commission approved the proposed plan amendment on April 7, 2022.

On May 10, 2022, the of Collier County Board of County Commissioner (BCC), acting as the Community Redevelopment Agency Board (CRA), approved a Resolution recommending approval to the BCC an amendment to the Collier County Community Redevelopment Area Plan.

- 4. Infrastructure Projects (County) in Immokalee (Not funded by CRA/MSTU)
 - 1) Carson Road Project-Eden Park Elementary Safe Routes to School
 - 6' Sidewalk on the south and west side of the road.
 - Construction costs \$663,000.
 - Funded with Safe Routes to School funds in FY 21/22.
 - Construction in FY 22/23
 - Adding time to the contract Stop work issued until CO is approved.





Design of bicycle and pedestrian features on Lake Trafford Road from Little League Road to Laurel Street. The project length is approximately 1.850 miles. Specifically, the design will provide for bicycle lanes on each side of the roadway within the project limits and design of a 6' sidewalk on the south side of the roadway from Carson Road to Krystal Lane and from North 18th Street to Laurel Street. Includes adjustment or relocation of the existing signalization at the intersection of Carson Road and 19th Street, if required. Constrained right-of-way at 19th Street intersection may require bike lane tapers to sidewalks and minor incidental intersection improvement at this location. Project 3 is discussed under Stormwater projects. No update

3) Stormwater Improvements

The original Immokalee Stormwater Master Plan (ISWMP) was prepared by H.W. Lochner (2005). Camp Dresser & McKee (CDM) was contracted in 2010 to prepare construction plans for the Downtown Immokalee and Immokalee Drive projects plus update the ISWMP. A draft update document was prepared but not finalized. On November 28, 2018, county staff presented the follow-up analysis.

2) Lake Trafford Road
Immokalee Stormwater Project updates: North 3^{rd.} Street Stormwater Improvements:

The North 3^{rd.} Street Drainage proposed project is located on North 3^{rd.} Street between 2nd Avenue and Roberts Avenue West. The project would include roadside swales, installation of inlets on 3^{rd.} Street, construction of a storm drainpipe system to alleviate ponding and allow conveyance southward to the storm drain system on West Main Street. Cost for repairs is estimated at \$600,000. The grant funding contract is now finalized, and the project is entering the contractor bidding phase. The project manager is Brittany Lazo with Collier County Stormwater Management. No update.

Madison Avenue Channel project:

On the northeastern side of Immokalee, county staff obtained Board of County Commissioners approval to purchase a 6-acre parcel just to the east of the Immokalee Foundation Career Path Learning Lab site. That site will provide a pond site to improve stormwater quality from the outfalls along Madison Ave. Additionally, county staff is working with FDOT's design firms to coordinate the alignment of the SR-29 bypass loop so they can avoid having to route the stormwater from the Madison Avenue channel all the way around the north and east sides of the airport.







Eden Gardens project:

The Eden Garden **Bypass** Drainage Improvement proposed project is located is the area south of Westclox St., east of Boxwood Dr., west of Carson Rd., and generally north and northeast of Eden Gardens. The project would construct a new ditch along the northern boundary of Eden Gardens, install a 24" pipe under Boxwood Dr. to tie into the existing ditch along the northwest boundary of Eden Gardens to convey flows further west. Cost for repairs is estimated at \$602,786.32. The county applied for CDBG-DR grant funding for this project.

Lake Trafford Road Area:

The single negotiated contract for designing both a stormwater treatment facility in the SE corner (Tract 3) of Arrowhead Reserve and drainage improvements along Lake Trafford Road from Little League Road to Tippins Terrace was applied for by the Board of County Commissioners in 2021. County staff is looking at phasing the construction, with Phase 1 being the Arrowhead Tract 3 site and Phase 2 being the pathway and drainage west of Little League Road. Design for Phase 1 was completed in 2021 and construction is tentatively scheduled to bin in the last quarter of 2022. Phase 2 design is anticipated to begin in 2022.



5. Commercial Façade Grant Program

In accordance with objective 1.2 in the Immokalee Area Master Plan, the CRA continues to provide financial incentives to business in Immokalee via the Commercial Facade Improvement grant program. The CRA implanted the Program in October 2008.

Since that time, 17 façade grants have been awarded to local businesses for a total of \$294,621.67.

Eligible applicants may receive grant funding up to 20,000 as reimbursement, using a one-half (1/2) to 1 match with equal applicant funding for funding for façade improvements to commercial structures.

Program is in place and being reviewed for revisions.

6. FHERO

Florida Heartland Economic Region of Opportunity – updates Staff continues to attend monthly meetings.

The CRA was awarded through FHERO a Site Improvement Plan DEO Grant totally 13,540 for Professional Services for Airpark Blvd. The Proposed scope of work include general consulting, engineering, planning, and survey services to evaluate the subject site for commercial development.

The CRA was also awarded through FHERO a Retail Demand Analysis DEPO Grant totally \$7,700 for Professional Services for assessment of retail demand in the Immokalee Community. Retail Demand Analysis has been finalized.

On June 28, 2021, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 21-149 which re-designated the South-Central RAO for another five-year term with an expiration date of June 28, 2026.

Staff attend monthly FHERO board meetings via Zoom or in person . The last meeting was held in person on March 14, 2022, in Sebring.

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7. <u>Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition</u>

The Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition (IUNC) is a long-term recovery group that formed in the fall of 2017 as the result of Hurricane Irma. This group is composed of non-profits, faith based, local, state, or national organizations who work together to meet the unmet of Immokalee residents impacted by disaster. They plan to have an annual meeting in June 2022.

The Housing Committee is updating the Immokalee Disaster Recover Resiliency Plan and funding options for future projects on a quarterly basis.

The Housing committee meetings are held the second Friday of every month via zoom at 10:00 a.m. The next meeting is scheduled for June 10, 2022 @ 10:00 a.m. via Zoom. 8. <u>Development in Immokalee</u>

1) Guadalupe Center van Otterloo Campus for Learning - 3655 Westclox Street

The Guadalupe Center broke ground on October 30th for a new educational campus that will create lasting, transformational change for students in Immokalee. The van Otterloo Family Campus for Learning will feature two academic buildings with multiple classrooms, a library, learning lab, cafeteria and kitchen, playground, administrative offices, mentor lounges, commons areas, a medical and dental suite, outdoor gardens, and a student wall of fame.

The campus will accommodate up to 154 students in Guadalupe Center's Early Childhood Education Program, as well as 125 high school students in the college-preparatory Tutor Corps Program. Guadalupe Center named the campus in honor of Rose-Marie and Eijk van Otterloo, whose generous \$5 million matching gift helped launch the project and inspired others to give. Within the campus, Brynne & Bob Coletti Hall will become the new home for the Tutor Corps Program. Barron Collier Companies donated 9.5 acres for the new campus. 2) Immokalee Foundation Learning Lab 18-home subdivision

The Immokalee Foundation Learning Lab 18-home subdivision is currently under construction. Collier Enterprises donated the 8.3 acres of land for a housing subdivision that will serve as a hands-on learning laboratory for student in the foundation's program., Career Pathways: Empowering Students to Succeed. BCB Homes, is serving as the general contractor.

On July 13, 2021, BCC board meeting (Agenda item 16.F.10) board approved a recommendation to direct staff to develop a workforce development grant agreement with The Immokalee Foundation, to offset development costs on the housing subdivision for the Career Pathways Learning Lab, in the amount of \$500,000.



The Immokalee Foundation sold its first home in December 2021. They also had a celebration for the Career Pathways program and the subdivision on Friday, January 14th from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. They sold the second home in May 2022.



3) Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance (IFHA)

The Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance proposed housing development consist of 8 buildings with 16 apartments each or 128 Units in all. Construction will progress in phases. Housing units will be two- and three-bedroom apartments ranging in size from about 750 to 950 square feet. For more information, please visit <u>http://www.ifha.info/</u>. Revised rendering will be provided at a future meeting. IFHA received final county approval of Site Development Plan (SDP) and they are currently out for bid. Land clearing started in September 2021. Groundbreaking was held on November 10, 2021 @ 10:00 a.m. Construction is under way. The infrastructure is scheduled to be complete in June. IFHA had subcontractor delays. IFHA is continuing to fundraise for the construction of the buildings which is set to start in July.



4) Habitat for Humanity of Collier County Kaicasa Housing Development

Kaicasa will be located at the Southeast corner of Immokalee, on state road 29 as you enter the agricultural village from the south. The new affordable community will sit adjacent to the existing Farm Workers Village: subsidized housing built in the 1970s for local and migrant farm workers that is often criticized for its conditions. Many Habitat Collier partner families have lived there prior to purchasing their homes. Once complete, this neighborhood will boast nearly 280 homes, making it the largest Habitat subdivision in the country. Construction is set to start in August 2022 due to a concrete shortage. Habitat is taking in applications. First phase may be reduced to 65 homes because of the supply shortage.

5) Redlands Christian Migrant Association (RCMA) Childcare Development Center and Community Hub

The RCMA proposed childcare center and community hub consist of Childcare classrooms, Area office, and playground. The development will accommodate 234 children and 30 employees. Approximately 8 acres will be designation for housing. Q. Grady Minor presented updated plan for the RCMA Immokalee MPUD (PL2020001827) at the CRA June 16, 2021, Board Meeting. CRA Board supported the proposed development. At the February 16, 2022, H&F Architects provided updated renderings of the proposed development.





6) Casa San Juan Diego Multi-Family Affordable Housing Development National Development of America, Inc.

The proposed Casa San Juan Diego Multi-Family affordable housing development in Immokalee is a partnership between the National Development of America, Inc., and the Diocese of Venice to develop 80 affordable rental units on 9.6 acres of land adjacent to Our Lady of Guadalupe Church. National Development of America, Inc. applied for grant funding but didn't receive. They will continue to look for other funding to build Casa San Juan Diego development in Immokalee.



*Casa San Juan Diego will only be 2 story units



7) Casa Amigos – Farmworker units at Esperanza Place A 96-bed, 24-unit rental community at Esperanza Place. The shared-housing model enables unrelated adults to share rental apartments through individual rather than household leases. Residents enjoy landlord-paid utilities, basic furnishings and service-enriched living at a monthly cost ranging from \$225 to \$250 per month per person. This is Rural Neighborhood's 4th shared housing venture. Completion date is scheduled for October 2022. The small community center is set to start construction in July.

The original proposed development was approved by the CCPC on May 6, 2021. PUD was approved under Zoning Ordinance 21-22 and Resolution 21-116 for 4,650 SF store, 1,000 sf car wash and 16 unleaded and 4 diesel fueling positions. 7 Eleven is requesting to amend PUD to add a drive through and remove car wash.

At the October 20th CRA meeting the advisory board voted unanimously to support requested changes to remove car wash and add drive thru. The proposed development went to the CCPC on February 17, 2022 and was approved with some contingencies. No outdoor music, no Alcohol can be sold from drive thru, and some changes were made to the SIC code. The development was approved by the BCC board on March 22, 2022. Creighton Construction help a pre-construction meeting in March and started clearing property in April.



10) Dollar General. Main Street and S. 2nd

Land clearing has started on Main St.



11) Seminole Trading Post

The Immokalee Trading Post will feature 10 gas pumps, five electric vehicle (EV) charging stations and a 7,200-square-foot convenience store. The dispensers will offer regular, mid-grade, premium, diesel and Rec90 fuel. The plans include two canopies: one in the front for regular vehicles and small trucks, and one in the back for semi-trucks and recreational vehicles. The trading post will work with the nearby Seminole Casino Hotel and accept players' points for gas and items inside the store.

12) Seminole Tribe medical and public safety facility

On April 26, 2022, a groundbreaking ceremony was held for a medical and public safety building on the Immokalee Reservation. The ceremony featured current and past tribal leaders as well as one of the founding mothers of the Immokalee reservation, Nancy Motlow.

13) Immokalee Fire Control District

Groundbreaking was held on September 27, 2021, for Fire Station 30 located at 510 New Market Road. The state-of-the-art firehouse will feature three apparatus bays and be equipped with bunker gear storage and a shop area. The building also will feature a lobby, conference room and two offices. Fire Station No. 30 will replace the existing firehouse located at 502 New Market Road. Construction started in December 2021 and is expected to be completed in December 2022.



14) Budget Inn (PL20220001199 CU)

On March 16, 2022, a pre-application meeting was held with county for a proposed conditional use for the Budget Inn located at 504 E Main Street. Owners are proposing to demolish the existing hotel and potentially do a two or 3 story hotel. They are in the early preliminary stages and don't have a conceptual plan yet.



15) Pathways Early Education Center of Immokalee

Pathways held a pep rally on April 5, 2022, to remove the existing building at 410 Colorado Avenue. Fundraising is underway to construction an additional facility.



9. <u>The Face of Immokalee</u>

On December 12, 2018, Michelle Tricca, a local Artist, presented The Face of Immokalee, a proposed outdoor photography installation celebrating the soul of Immokalee. CRA board supported the project and have formed a subcommittee to move the project forward.

The subcommittee last met on December 9, 2019, to discuss the art wall options for the old McCrory's building (S&O Grocery), Lipman Produce (trucks/building), site on 1st Street (Gadsden blue building), and the Zocalo plaza. Committee supported rendering provided by artist with minor changes.

On October 22, 2020, CRA staff and Lipman staff met with Michelle Tricca to discuss project status. On October 29, 2020, WGCU did a story on Ms. Tricca's public art installation for the Phase 1 portion of the project. On November 18, 2020, both the CRA and MSTU board supported The Face of Immokalee project and made a motion to allow the use of Zocalo Plaza Art Wall as a canvas for the project.

In May 2021 Ms. Tricca provided project updates to staff and announced that the project has started to receive donations via her fiscal sponsorship with ASMP Foundation. She also noted that the project was featured in <u>Florida Weekly</u>.

12. Collier County Opportunity Zone Program

Low Tax Opportunity Zones, established by the federal Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017, encourage long-term investment and job creation in targeted communities by reducing taxes for many job creators. They enhance the ability to attract businesses, developers, and financial institutions to invest in these targeted areas — distressed communities — by allowing investors to defer capital gains taxes through investments Low Tax Opportunity Zones, established by the federal Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017, encourage long-term investment and job creation in targeted communities by reducing taxes for many job creators. The zones enhance local communities' ability to attract businesses, developers, and financial institutions to invest in targeted areas by allowing investors to defer capital gains taxes through established Opportunity Funds.

To become a Qualified Opportunity Fund, an eligible corporation or partnership self-certifies by filing Form 8996, Qualified Opportunity Fund, with its federal income tax return.

- SR82/SR29 Final Walkthrough date is May 19th, and the anticipated completion date is late June 2022. Outstanding items includes the Traffic Monitoring System Loops and final punch list . (such as a cracked sidewalk type of item) The directional arrows / signs are placed to help the mobility through the roundabout.
- SR29/Westclox Intersection-new signal anticipated completion date is end of June to beginning of July 2022. Collier County Traffic Ops is installing. I relayed the CRA's request to have left turn lanes installed with our FDOT Design team who is designing this portion of the SR29 project.
- A few months ago, I also related the CRA's request/suggestion to add dedicated left turn lanes for both the NB and SB turns off of SR29 and Oil Well Rd intersections. It was conveyed to me that this should be prioritized and programmed through the MPO process.
- SR82 final section from Hendry County line to Gator Slough; Project LET Date is: 04/20/2023 & the anticipated completion date is TBD
- Brief Update on I-75 Southwest Connect Studies: The Southwest Connect™ I-75 South Corridor Master Plan is evaluating improvements to I-75 in both Collier and Lee counties. The project team has completed the traffic analysis and currently evaluating alternatives along the corridor. The range of improvements under consideration include widening, managed lanes, modifying existing interchanges, and evaluating the need for new interchanges. The Master Plan tentative schedule includes public outreach in the fall and will draft the Master Plan by the end of this year. <u>Attached</u>
