St. Maria Goretti (October 16th 1890 – July 6th 1902)

Born in 1890 in Corinaldo, Italy the third child in a very impoverished family.

By the age of 10 she had lost her father.

By the age of 12 she had died a martyr's death.

Beatified in 1927 – just 25 years after her death.

Canonised in 1950 – a mere 48 years after her death, with her mother present for the Canonization. It is also said that her repentant and reconciled murderer, Alessandro Serenellis, was present too.
