A gathering of the Parish Pastoral Councils from the dioceses of Achonry and Elphin, which will be held in the Abbey Hotel, Roscommon on Sat., Nov. 8<sup>th</sup>, starting at 10.00 a.m. and finishing with lunch. The day will be facilitated by Gráinne Doherty, who has previously facilitated the Achonry PPC members at our gathering in Kiltimagh, over a year ago.
