Upcoming Feast Days – as we leave behind the month of January, a number of important Feast Days beckon us into the month of February:

Sunday, February 1st Feast of St. Brigid – Blessing of St. Brigid's Crosses.

Monday, February 2nd Candlemas Day (40 days after Christmas) – Blessing of candles for use during the year.

Tuesday, February 3rd Feast of St. Blaise – Blessing of Throats.

Volunteers - are needed to continue the age-old tradition of making St. Brigid's Crosses for blessing and distribution on February 1st. Any help you can give to make a few would be greatly appreciated.

Parishioners - are also welcome to bring candles to the churches to be blessed, either for use in the church throughout the year or to be brought home for use there. Offertory Boxes for 2026 – are available at the exit doors in both churches. Many thanks for your generous support in 2025. All contributions (no matter how little or large) are equally welcome. If you pay income tax (PAYE or Self Employed) and do not use the Offertory Envelope system **please consider doing so**. For every €1 contributed, *Revenue* will add €0.45 to it from the tax you have **already paid** on your contribution from your taxed income. If not claimed by the parish, your tax component remains with *Revenue* and will be spent by them on other things. This in no way affects your own tax liability. The parish only advises *Revenue* of contributions made. It doesn't give or receive any other information. Grouped refunds come back from *Revenue*. The parish has no details of individual refunds.

St Nathys Cemetery - Significant work has been achieved by the local cemetery committee in keeping the area to a high standard and during 2025 two different schemes that were applied for, resulted in much needed resurfacing works, both outside and inside the grounds. The Cemetery Committee wish to acknowledge the help of Sligo County Council, and the local area councillors that participated in assigning some of their annual discretionary funding to the fantastic work achieved.

The next project that is hoped to be achieved is to lay tarmac on each of the side paths in the new area of the Cemetery. However this will require significant work behind the scenes and with sixteen paths to be done will need a lot of co-operation in gathering the funding to attain this goal. The ask is to gather €1200 per path so if we could get contributions of €50 to €100 per Gravestone it would be really appreciated. The intention is to ask a volunteer from each row to spearhead their respective paths in order to make this project manageable.
