If not claimed by the parish, your tax component remains with Revenue and will be spent by them on other things. This in no way affects your own tax liability. The parish only advises Revenue of contributions made. It doesn't give or receive any other information. Grouped refunds come back from Revenue. The parish has no details of individual refunds.
