
TITLE 1 PART C MIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM





PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a Title 1 Part C program designed to meet the unique needs of students whose seasonal relocations may disrupt their education. The MEP provides supplemental services to children from the ages of 3 through 21 to help ensure that all children have equal and significant educational opportunities.

PROGRAM GOAL

The goal of the Migrant Education Program is to ensure that all migrant students reach challenging academic standards and graduate with a high school diploma or complete a High School Equivalency Diploma (HSED) that prepares them for responsible citizenship, further learning, and productive employment.

ELIGIBILITY

WHAT JOBS AND ACTIVITIES QUALIFY?

Temporary or seasonal employment or personal subsistence in agriculture and fishing.

Personal subsistence the worker and the worker's family, as a matter of economic necessity, consume, as a substantial portion of their food intake, the crops, dairy products, or livestock they produce or the fish they catch.

Agriculture work the production or initial processing of crops, dairy products, poultry, or livestock, as well as the cultivation or harvesting of trees. It consists of work performed for wages or personal subsistence. **Fishing** is the catching or initial processing of fish or shellfish, as well as the raising or harvesting of fish or shellfish at fish farms, that is performed for wages or personal subsistence.







WHO AND WHAT MOVES & RELOCATIONS QUALIFY?

Children younger than 22 years of age;

- including American Indian and Alaska Native students, whose treaty-protected, migratory lifeways in seasonal locations for fishing and gathering are recognized.
 who
- migrate as/with an agricultural worker or parent; move or have traveled **across state or school districts boundaries** at any time in the last 3 years in order to seek work or
 personal subsistence in crops, dairy products, fishing, livestock, poultry, trees, or plants.
