Hi Sharon,

All I can tell you is the facts that I know. Liam did not have a mask on until 11:30, so I had a clear view of his face. There were no marks or bruises. We had indoor recess (which I stayed in the room for) and nothing happened to him. After lunch, there were still no bruises or marks. We had snack at 2:15 (where he took off his mask) and still no bruises. At 2:30 the class had library. No one reported anything back to me about anything happening to Liam. The librarian and para only told me that Liam was rolling all over the floor and refused to sit in his chair. At dismissal I did not check his face under his mask since I had no reason to (since no one reported anything to me and Liam never said a word). So what I know is that from 9-2:30 there were no marks on his face. Like I said I didn't check under his mask at dismissal since I had no reason to. No children in my classroom put a hand on him, nor did they at indoor recess or lunch time. Where the bruises came from, I don't know as they were not on him during the school day up until at least 2:30. If something had happened during library time, I am sure that the librarian would have reported that to me.

Good Evening Ms. Degnan,

I tried calling your phone a few moments ago. It said the mailbox was full and could not take messages. I finished watching videos a short time ago. I can see when and how Liam may have hit his face and why it was not seen by staff. During lunch Liam was very active. Staff did go over to his table a couple of times. Nothing happened until Liam came back from clearing his lunch tray. He walked up to the trash can and disposed of his waste appropriately. However, after a few minutes the video showed him running toward his table and falling into a chair. He immediately got up, sat down and didn't act up like he had been doing. He did not tell anyone in the cafeteria. He sat there with his hands on both cheeks and waited calmly and appropriately. From the video's view point the way Liam had his hands I don't think people glancing at him would notice anything. Liam had a mask at the table. I don't know if he had it from home or not. I know that this morning when I saw him during breakfast he did not have a mask on. Nothing was visible on his face at that point. At the very end of lunch Liam put his mask on and was suddenly rejuvenated and acting rambunctious again.

I will check with the other staff tomorrow to see if and when he took his mask off. Liam did not report anything and did not go to the nurse. I have the nurse look at the area tomorrow. This is all the information I have at this time. I will now respond to Mr. Ocak's call.

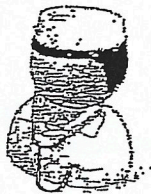



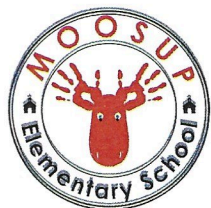
