## Not Just Any Cat

The jaguar weighs between 100 and 250 pounds. It can be as long as 6 feet! This is not your ordinary house cat!

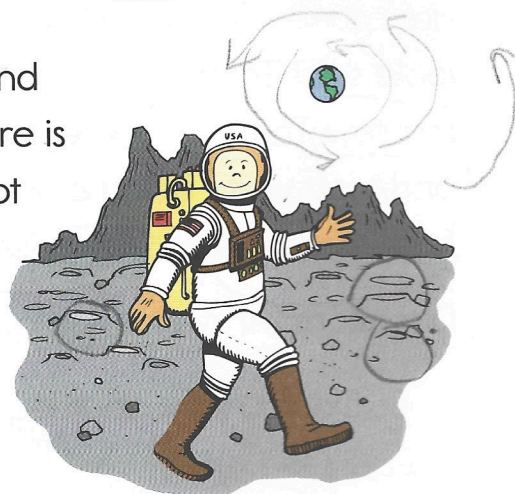
