**November 20, 2025**

President Marty Wright greeted the meeting members and called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. This is our holiday, Thanksgiving meeting, which provides members with another opportunity to attend a meeting. ## **NEW BUSINESS**

President Wright stated that we would go over any constitutional and by-law changes at the January meeting. Members were encouraged to ensure their email addresses were correct to facilitate the document being sent out for review. Members were told to either see Ray Nowden or to write their email on the sign-in sheet. It was also stated that we would be moving towards having all voting online. Chandria asked for clarification on the current voting method. It was suggested that we note the changes are proposed changes.

We previously discussed that we would only take 12 members to the Eastern Region Cabinet Meeting in Philadelphia. There are sixteen people interested in attending the meeting. The Executive Board will meet to determine who will attend, based on the eligible sixteen.

Alvin Butts, National President, Chuck Mulidore, Executive Vice-President, Richard Greene, Eastern Region Vice-President, and Troy Griffin, Capital Atlantic Area Vice-President, were in attendance. President Wright opened the floor for 10 minutes for any questions or concerns.

Troy Griffin stated that advocacy training would be held either around LTS (Legislative Training Seminar) or on Friday or Saturday before LTS. He also stated that elections will be held in September/October. Anyone interested in being an advocate should let Marty Wright know.

LTS, will be held in Washington DC, March 15<sup>th</sup> -18<sup>th</sup>.

President Butts spoke on the pay agreement. NAPS secured a 28% health benefit contribution. EAS salary indicates 18.24% medium. NAPS must continue to secure this at the very least. He also stated that USPS had announced \$9 billion in losses for the past two years. Mr. Butts reiterated that Chuck is consistently engaging our supporters on Capitol Hill. Chuck was highlighted for his effective legislative advocacy on Capitol Hill. Chuck Mulidore, emphasized the Supervisors Political Action Committee (SPAC), sharing their strategy for the 2026 midterm elections. SPAC is small but was able to give upwards of \$400K last year. He asked all members to continue to financially support SPAC. He explained that it may appear that NAPS is supporting Republicans who traditionally are not USPS supporters. Chuck stated that it is about the relationship between NAPS and the Congressmen and not political affiliation. It is our job to make the most out of the relationship. He also shouted out Bob Levy as a great asset for SPAC. More details will be provided at LTS. He encouraged everyone to get involved with the legislative process. Currently, postal workers and Federal employees are having a tough time.

Eastern Region VP Richard Greene spoke on the RIF (reduction-in-force). He stated that NAPS is currently working on Batch B, which includes Branch 135. He stated that Troy Griffin has been working with the HR Manager for MD, ensuring all members in the DC-Maryland district have already been placed. President Wright and VP Reggie Hughes worked alongside NAPS leadership to help plan and place Branch 135 members. NAPS is diligently working across the region with 235 RIFS happening across the country. Chuck is working at the HQ level to place anyone we have not been able to place locally. The ERCM will have a Jersey night and a banquet. The meeting will feature several senior leaders.
