

MANAGEMENT/TREASURER'S REPORT

Financial report was presented for April, 2019, itemizing checks, deposits, and balances. A motion was made by Marcy Metz, seconded by Charlotte Arnold to approve the financial report as presented. The motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Review budget needs 2019-20

The Board continued to review and discuss projected budgetary needs for the next fiscal year July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020. Last fiscal year, the special assessment was placed at \$44 per lot. Without an assessment, the Association will not be able to pay the minimum bills. Based on the current needs of the Association, reducing operating expenses, and

continuing to put some monies into the Reserve Account each year, a lower assessment in the amount of \$36 per lot will be recommended to property owners for their vote during the annual meeting.

Review annual meeting plans

Different from previous years, registration along with a brunch will begin at 9:30 am. The meeting will begin at the normally scheduled time at 11:00 a.m. Food items for the brunch were discussed. Prices will be obtained. A motion was made by Fay Earls, seconded by Roger Biedanski to budget \$300 for the brunch food items.

<u>Other</u>

The Association asked for input from property owners recently regarding street lights. A Board committee is trying to determine where all of the street lights are located that are being paid for by the Association, and which ones are being paid by property owners. During the development stages of the subdivision in the 1988's, some property owners had street lights installed before other homes were added on the street, and they continue to pay for the light. Those will be considered a priority.
