Wednesday Lunch Speaker

Colette Hirstius serves as President of Shell USA, Inc. and Executive Vice President of the Gulf of America. In her role as President Shell USA, she leads the strategic integration of Shell's diverse US businesses and represents the company in key energy policy and societal discussions. She is responsible for aligning Shell's US operations with its global strategy, overseeing a portfolio that spans the entire energy value chain—from exploration and production to trading to manufacturing, marketing, and power distribution. As EVP of the Gulf of America, Colette oversees Shell's offshore operations in the region, including ten production hubs and a vast subsea infrastructure network, driving performance, safety, and sustainability in one of Shell's most critical upstream assets. Colette holds a Bachelor of Science in Geology from Tulane University and a Master of Science in Geology from the University of Colorado. She began her career with Mobil Oil and ExxonMobil before joining Shell in 2003 as a Production Geologist in New Orleans. She progressed through Shell's Gulf of America portfolio before taking on international roles—including Strategy Advisor in the Netherlands, where she helped shape Shell's first Purpose-led Strategy; a business turnaround lead in Trinidad and Tobago; and Vice President of Exploration for Africa and the Middle East. In 2021, she returned to New Orleans to lead the Gulf of America through a transformative phase focused on low-carbon, competitive energy production.

Wednesday Dinner Speaker

Tyler Priest is an Associate Professor of History at the University of Iowa who studies the history of oil and energy. His research and teaching interests also include environmental history, the history of business and technology, the history of capitalism and globalization, and public history, which is a field that promotes the collaborative study and practice of history for a broader audience outside of academia. Tyler joined the University of Iowa in 2012 after eight years as Director of Global Studies in the College of Business at the University of Houston. He published a prize-winning book, *The Offshore Imperative: Shell Oil's Search for Petroleum in Postwar America*, that analyzes Shell Oil Company's technological quest to find and develop petroleum reserves in ever-deeper ocean waters. Tyler's most recent book, *Offshore Oildom: America's Energy Expansion into the Ocean* (LSU Press, 2026), tells the riveting story of the political battles in the United States over securing the oil riches of the sea. From the titanic struggle over the tidelands starting in the 1930s to Project Independence in the 1970s, the growth of offshore oil drilling required redrawing the territorial borders of the nation, renegotiating the federal division of power in society, reshaping the U.S. energy system, and testing the environmental limits of resource extraction.
