# Wonder Years Preschool – Parent Handbook

#### **Welcome to Wonder Years Preschool!**

We are delighted to partner with you in your child's growth and development. This handbook outlines our philosophy, policies, and procedures to ensure a safe, nurturing, and collaborative environment.

## Program Philosophy

At Wonder Years, we believe children thrive when they feel safe, valued, and supported.

- Our environment is welcoming, calm, and stimulating, with natural light, open spaces, and age-appropriate materials.
- Teachers foster positive relationships with every child, honoring their unique qualities and interests.
- We follow a holistic, child-centered approach that encourages independence, problem-solving, and creativity.
- Inspired by Reggio Emilia philosophies, our classrooms are set up for exploration and self-directed learning.
- Families are essential partners—we value open communication, diversity, and inclusion.

## Hours of Operation

- Monday–Friday: 8:00 AM 6:00 PM
- Program options: Full-Time, Part-Time, Before/After School

#### Attendance & Arrival Notification

- Please notify us by 9:00 AM if your child will be late or absent.
- This ensures proper staffing, meal planning, and safety.
- If we do not hear from you, we will follow up to confirm your child's well-being.

#### \$ Fees & Payment Policy

- Tuition is based on 10 equal monthly instalments consisting of 18 school days in each month. There are no charges for holidays.
- Tuition is based on enrollment, not attendance.
- A non-refundable registration fee secures your child's spot.
- Monthly tuition is due on the 1st of each month (e.g., January's tuition is due January
  1).
- Accepted payment methods: e-payment or check only.
- Late payments may result in fees or suspension of services.

## **Example 2** Celebrations

- Families may bring a small, healthy snack for birthdays.
- Holiday celebrations are observed in class—participation is optional.

# items to Bring

Please label all items with your child's name:

- Diapers or pull-ups, wipes, and diaper cream
- Complete change of weather-appropriate clothing
- Jacket and secure shoes (no flip-flops)
- Swimsuit and sunscreen (summer months)
- For full-time children: crib sheet + blanket (returned on Fridays for washing)
- Dress your child in play-friendly clothes—we love messy play!

#### Cleanliness & Hygiene

- Children wash hands before/after meals and throughout the day.
- Classrooms, toys, and surfaces are sanitized regularly.

#### Potty Training

- Training should begin at home and be consistent for at least 2 weeks before starting at school.
- Parents provide pull-ups and wipes.
- After 2 accident-free weeks in pull-ups, children may transition to cotton training pants.
- Ongoing communication ensures success.

#### Drop-Off & Pick-Up

- Keep drop-offs brief—a quick hug, cheerful goodbye, and reassurance work best.
- At pick-up, remain consistent and reinforce classroom rules.
- Only authorized individuals may pick up a child. Written notice is required and must include:
  - Full name
  - Phone number
  - o Physical description
  - Valid photo ID
- Without legal documentation, we cannot restrict parental access.

#### **☆** Open Door Policy

Parents are welcome to visit at any time. To avoid disrupting routines, frequent visitors are asked to follow classroom schedules.

## Wellness Policy

Keep your child home if they have had any of the following within 24 hours:

 Pink eye, fever, severe cough, vomiting, diarrhea, sore throat, infected rash, or unusual stool.

Children may return **24 hours after symptoms end** or with a doctor's note. If illness develops during care, you will be called for immediate pick-up.

#### 

Any single COVID-19 symptom requires testing. Children may return after:

- A negative COVID test (antigen or PCR),
- Doctor clearance, or
- A 10-day quarantine.

Positive cases: May return on **Day 6** with improving symptoms, fever-free for 24 hours, and a negative antigen test on Day 5 or later.

#### Nap Time

Full-time children bring:

- 1 fitted crib sheet
- 1 blanket

Bedding is sent home every Friday for washing.

#### Food & Nutrition

- We provide two daily snacks (milk included) at no additional cost.
- Lunch is available upon request for an additional charge.
- Parents must provide alternatives if their child has allergies, dietary restrictions, or religious needs (Doctor's note may be required).
- Menus are posted weekly, focusing on whole foods and balanced nutrition.

## 🏃 Outdoor Play

- Children play outdoors daily (weather permitting).
- We also visit nearby parks for physical activity and nature exploration.

# **↑** Accidents & Emergencies

- Parents are notified immediately of any incidents.
- Staff complete an incident/accident report (signed by parent and director).
- Emergency contact information must always be up to date.

#### **Termination & Withdrawal**

- Parents must provide a 30-day written notice when withdrawing. Tuition is due through the notice period.
- Enrollment may be terminated immediately in extreme cases (safety concerns or unresolved disruptive behavior).

## Photo & Video Consent

Parents will receive a separate consent form regarding the use of children's images for:

- Internal documentation
- Newsletters and updates
- Website, social media, or promotional materials

Consent may be withdrawn in writing at any time.

Parents will be asked to sign an acknowledgment stating that they:
