

Luxury Apartments Coming Soon

The northside landscape will look different when the Snyder Building is demolished to make way for a new apartment complex. Developers are expected to break ground sometime late Summer. The following is an excerpt from the December Winfield Word newsletter, Letter from the President, Carl Sorgatz –

I am very pleased to announce another big step forward for our Town Center revitalization plan. Synergy Construction & Development Company delivered a concept presentation at the November 16 Village Board meeting for a 147-unit luxury apartment complex. The development would be built on a 2.4-acre site southeast of the intersection of Jewell Road and Church Street, currently occupied by CDH's Snyder office building and a Metra parking lot. Named "Winfield Reserve," the building will include a mix of studio, one-bedroom, two-bedroom and three-bedroom rental apartments. Residents may remember Synergy as the developer of the successful Winfield Station complex, built on the former Winfield Fuel & Material site just south of the railroad tracks. Synergy hopes to break ground in August 2024 and open to residents in early 2026.

Tony's Steamers was inducted into the Vienna Beef Hot Dog Hall of Fame in 2006 and has been written about in numerous newspapers across the suburbs. Steamers is famous beyond the borders of Winfield!

Tony's Steamers loves giving back to the community, saying "that's how you grow together". You can see it on the walls when you visit, sponsorships of local teams. The restaurant serves hot lunches to local schools, churches, and scout organizations, on a regular basis.

The 2020 pandemic almost closed their doors and Tony wondered how they would survive, but he refused to give up because he had a family and employees to support. Tony always disliked the front windows in the restaurant, but they saved the day when he was able to serve food out the windows to customers waiting on the sidewalk. 

Fire District Calls Decrease; New Engine In Service

For the first time since 2016, the number of emergency calls for

emergency calls for service in 2023 dropped slightly (4.4% decrease) from their peak in 2022, according to DuPage Public Safety Communications (Du-Comm). Only York Center (13.5%) and Oakbrook Terrace (9.1%) had larger year-over-year decreases.

Residents of the Winfield Fire Protection District have begun to notice that the new fire engine is finally in service! The 2023 Sutphen Monarch Severe-Duty fire engine was put into full-time service in January. Crew members that operate the engine are very pleased with

After many years of operating equipment which had exceeded its useful life, both the ambulance and fire engine are now mechanically reliable and allowing first responders to do their jobs without worrying about their vehicles breaking down.

An additional replacement ambulance is on order and scheduled to be delivered in early 2025. This will replace the 2005 International ambulance in front-line service, and the 2005 will become a



On April 4th, the new Women In Business group will host Jennifer Speaker who will talk to members about cyber security.



Inspired by employee donations, Northwestern Medicine makes its largest gift to area food banks

Inspired by the generosity of its employees, Northwestern Medicine is donating \$200,000 to area food banks. The Greater Chicago Food Depository and Northern Illinois Food Bank will each receive \$100,000. Health system leaders thanked staff and surprised them with the total gift amount during Team NM employee volunteer events at four food bank locations on Saturday, Feb. 24.

Northwestern Medicine leadership was inspired to dedicate more funds to the food banks after more than 5,000 employees opted to donate the grocery gift certificates they would have received as part of their holiday gifts. Thanks to those donations, employees raised more than \$76,000. Leadership made the decision to increase the overall donation to further support employees' dedication to the food banks.

80th Anniversary Commemorative Stamp Sheet Update for 'It's a Wonderful Life': Déjà vu All Over Again

You are looking at the four 25-cent stamps the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) issued in 1990 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of four feature films released in 1939.

The announcement was made by Postmaster



General Anthony M. Frank during the fanfare of the 1990 Academy Awards, which honored movies released in 1989.

Frank stated, "If these were the only films produced that year, it still would have been an incredible year. ... If there is the emotional feeling that I think there will be for these stamps, we'll do more."

Shortly thereafter, I thought a movie that should be so honored on its 50th anniversary in 1996 was the 1946 Frank Capra classic, "It's a Wonderful Life" ("IAWL"), starring Jimmy Stewart and Donna Reed. What a tribute it would be for Stewart (who would be turning eighty-eight that year), not only one of Hollywood's most popular actors, but a World War II bomber pilot veteran as well.

So, in 1993 I got a number of friends, family members, even a few of WGN Radio's Wally Phillips' listeners, to sign a couple petitions to help get this - what I thought was a "slam dunk!" - proposal into the hands of the USPS folks who make such decisions.

The Chicago Sun-Times even ran a nice article about this, and I made an appearance on Fox News Chicago to help promote the idea right before Christmas 1993.

Shortly after the holidays, I received a form letter from the USPS, stating among other things, "This topic was recently reviewed by the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee, and after careful deliberation, was not recommended at this time."

Crushed...I decided not to end it all and went on with my suddenly demoralized life. Fast forward 30 years.

"IAWL" will be celebrating its 80th anniversary during America's Semiquincentennial in 2026. While "80" is not usually a popular celebration number like "25" or "50", the USPS nevertheless issued a commemorative stamp sheet in 2020 to celebrate the 80th birthday of a cartoon character.

Drum roll, please. Take a bow...

Bugs Bunny!

Please fast forward another three years. I made another proposal for "IAWL" in 2023, including a flyer containing a photo of the late PG Anthony M. Frank, along with his words, "We'll do more" of these stamps.

The form letter sent to me this past January, stated among other things, "This topic was recently reviewed by the Committee and after careful consideration and deliberation was not recommended at this time."

Déjà vu...all over again.



tried on was too snug and made me look even heavier than I felt. At 17 years old, I felt defeated, overweight and insecure. My energy levels were low, and I was extremely uncomfortable. I would frequent the local fast-food chain with my friends - and I would super-size it.
