# 56th Annual Good Old Days-'Growing Our Community'

"Growing Our Community" is the theme of this year's 56th Annual Good Old Days festival September 8th thru 10th. See the schedule of events on page 3. Winfield has a long history of farming so we thought it appropriate to honor our farming roots with this year's theme. Good Old Days is a community collaboration organized by local not-forprofit Knights of Columbus Council 8002, Winfield Historical Society, Winfield Lions Club; as well as the Village of Winfield, Winfield Police Department, Winfield Fire District, Winfield Park District, Winfield School. These groups spent months meeting and planning activities and events for our community.

The weekend-long festival takes place at the intersection of Church Street and Beecher Avenue where you'll see big white tents, lots of tables and chairs, and a stage for bands. We have a terrific line up of live entertainment scheduled all weekend starting with our own Sammy & The Knights on Friday at 5:30pm opening for Chicagoland's premier cover band 7th Heaven at 8:30pm. On Saturday we'll kick off the music with a Youth Talent Showcase with performers from the Jerry Evans School of Music and the School of Rock providing live music from 11am to 2pm. Then at 3pm, Fueled by Emo gets the crowd rocking as warm up for Sealed with a Kiss who come on stage at 5:30pm. A group called Hello Dave takes the stage at 8pm to entertain the crowd with its 'Chicago Twang' style of music. The music continues Sunday with another local band Vital Signs performing fan favorites.

Of course we'll have a good variety of food and drink options! The Tony Reyes Family Foundation Beer Tents will be offering cold beverages for sale. Proceeds from the sales go towards the Foundation's charities many of them local such as Ronald McDonald House Charities including the new gardens at the House near CDH, Winfield In Action, Disabled American Veterans, and CASA, just to name a few. The Knights of Columbus will be firing up their wood burning grill to cook their famous cheeseburgers, hot dogs, sausages, deep fried pork chop sandwiches, corn on the cob, and pizza slices. # High Lake Condo Fire Kills 1, 5 Rescued

One person was killed and five people were rescued from a 4 a.m. fire that destroyed eight units in the 0N100 block of Windemere Road in the High Lake Condominiums on Friday, August 18th.

An 81-year-old woman, whose name will not be released, had lived in High Lake for decades and was an accomplished quilter and loved to sew. Her long-time neighbors were devastated by her death

single building.

The residents of the eight units estimate that they will be displaced for at least a year while the building is rebuilt. Local fundraising efforts are under way. John Karwoski, a former volunteer fireman who lives across the street from the fire, woke from the sirens at 4 a.m. and saw the flames. Many neighbors came out to comfort the victims and offered help and clothing. Six additional fire departments responded to the fire, which was contained to a

# Prosek's Greenhouse Grows with the Community

Nestled between Winfield Mounds Forest Preserve and Shelburne Farms, Prosek's Greenhouse offers a wonderful array of mums, asters, pumpkins and more, just in time for Autumn. Located at 28W140 High Lake Road, Prosek's is west of Winfield's Town Center. Look for their cleverly designed sign in the shape of an oversized watering can.

In 1962, Charles and Ann Prosek created a wholesale business that sold cut flowers, like carnations and snapdragons, to the markets in Chicago. By 1970, they opened a retail cut flower shop and greenhouse here in Winfield. In 1975, Charles Prosek added a Hobby Shop business that sold model kits, board games and military figures. In the 1980s, their son, Chuck Prosek, took over the management of the greenhouses, and their daughter Cathy Palazzetti joined the business in

Today Chuck and Cathy oversee 22 hoop heated houses and three heated greenhouses on their five-acre family business site. In February and March, they prepare cuttings and plug trays for new plants. By April, Prosek's Greenhouse is blooming with all sorts of annual flowers, vegetables, and

learn therapeutic gardening skills. And in turn, the harvested produce provides fresh vegetables to area food banks.

Prosek's Greenhouse also helps community groups achieve their fund-raising goals. For example, schools, church groups or even fraternal

organizations can buy Prosek's plants at wholesale

rates. In turn, such groups sell the plants at retail and use the modest profits for their organizational goals.

# **Expanding Fresh Food Access in Winfield**


Project is maintaining food growing gardens at the

There's something new blooming at the Ronald McDonald House® near Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital.

This season, The GardenWorks Project, a local

501(c)(3) nonprofit organization improving food security and food access throughout the western suburbs, began a 3-year long project to strengthen the health and wellness of the Winfield community. With funding generously granted by the Tony Reyes Family Foundation,

going great. Families spend more time in the yard admiring it and love the fresh produce."



GardenWorks staff member, Jackie Pierucci, has been providing kid-friendly, healthy recipe ideas based on what's growing. These recipes are offering House staff and families fresh options and creative ideas for meals and snacks. Staff recently made homemade pesto with garden basil, a colorful blueberry-basil lemonade, and a grandma harvested and cooked with swiss chard. A North-

# Winfield Fire District Updates

It's been a whirlwind summer at the Winfield fire station! I'll provide some brief highlights of what has been happening.

Every month our fire fighters attend joint training with neighboring agencies so they can improve their

coordinated responses. Our alliance trainings are considered in the fire industry to be some of the best in the nation. Topics include:

July: long hose lays (water source a long distance from the fire) and dive rescue operations from a boat

August: multiple casualty incidents and low-angle rescues

September: multifamily dwelling fires

Interviews are now complete in the hiring for the additional crew position (which is com-

prised of three people) that was promised with the passing of the referendum. Fortunately, we found out this Spring that we were awarded a federal grant to cover most of the cost of this position for three years. New crew members will complete their training and join their shifts in September.

Planning and design remains on schedule for the new fire station to be built on County Farm Road. It will replace the downtown station. Financing will be finalized in September and construction bids will be

released in October. If the weather cooperates this fall, construction might begin before the new year with a tentative completion date by Labor Day 2024.

Our new fire engine is in the final stages of production. It is expected to be in service in November, so be on the lookout!





# It's Finally Coming Together: Winfield Town Center and a Casey's Update

Winfield Town Center (0N036 Church St.) is a gorgeous 3-story medical office building with long-anticipated first floor retail space that has been marketed since it opened January 30, 2023, by



commercial broker Jones Lang LaSalle on behalf of owner Northwestern Medicine. According to the JLL website, all 12,595 SF of retail space is still available as of 8/14/23. Great news, though: Jose Gonzalez, the Executive VP who's heading the leasing effort, reports prospective interest has been steady, and several deals are now in the late stages. They won't report details of who's moving in until the leases are executed but look for updates on this soon. The yard signs went up recently, and the property is listed on JLL's leasing website and commercial leasing sites Co-Star and Loop Net. "While speed of lease is important, our long-term goal is to lease space to strong and healthy tenants which will be embraced by the community," said Gonzalez.

For a better understanding of the current commercial leasing climate, I contacted a local Realtor who has both commercial and residential expertise, and also happens to be the President of the Greater Winfield Chamber of Commerce, Dan Czuba.

"You need to understand that real estate is no longer just a building in a busy location; it's a bundle of legal rights and layers of rules enforcement from the building owner (Northwestern), village, county, state, health department (if it's a restaurant) and so on. While a small business has always needed to worry about attracting enough customers to turn a profit, there's a tighter margin of error between success and failure now. For example, Portillo's couldn't open today on the budget they did. You're covering payroll before your open and you're very unsure when you'll get the final go ahead from everyone. It's still a great time to own a business, but it's also not so simple," said Czuba.

Turning to Casey's, the big story here is that this parcel is about to produce positive retail tax receipts. With so many fits and starts from different developers, a multitude of types of hurdles and delays, the focused, can-do engagement of village leadership got this to the finish line this time around. Passers-by can see the final touches being applied to the car wash and landscaping of this handsome brick fueling station. Tenants on the strip will be added after opening. Hopefully this new momentum in Winfield development continues to spread.

Andy Warhol came to Winfield this summer as part of a public art project in conjunction with the Andy Warhol Exhibition at the McAninch Arts Center at the College of DuPage and the Cleve Carney Museum of Art. Winfield offered four notable members of our community to have their headshots reproduced in a colorful Warhol-styled outdoor art installation.

The banner stylings were done by artist Geoff Bevington, a Glen Ellyn artist and cartoonist, who also painted a Frida Kahlo mural in downtown Glen Ellyn. The banners have been hanging at Berger Bros Pub and Giagnorio's Deli on Winfield Road since their unveiling on Thursday June 1st. The Andy Warhol Exhibit at the MAC runs through September 10th.

1. Eleanor Himmelfarb was an American painter and Winfield resident from 1942 until her death in 2009, Eleanor Himmelfarb's prolific career spanned 60 years. Her work is in private and public collections throughout the U.S.

2. Kevin Streelman was born in Winfield and grew up in Wheaton. Kevin recorded his first PGA Tour victory in 2013 at the Tampa Bay Championship, and a second win in 2014 at the Travelers Championship. He has recorded 50 top 10 finishes in the 16 years of his PGA Tour career and continues to pursue his passion for high performance golf.

**3.** Bill Brach is a longtime Winfield resident who owned and operated Brach's service station at the corner of Winfield Road and Highlake and is still in operation today. Bill contributed to the town as a fireman and the Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus.

4. John Karwoski is a lifelong Winfield resident. John is well known in Winfield as the owner of John's Buffet. He also made major contributions to Winfield as a founder of the Bank of Winfield and the Lions Club, along with serving on the Winfield Fire Department for 40 years.

The art installations across DuPage were sponsored by the College of DuPage and the JCS Fund of the DuPage Foundation.
