# Winfield Farmers Market Grows Through 3 Decades

In the summer of 1996, a young Rich Bysina was looking for freelance work in advertising and was hired by the former Winfield Chamber of Commerce to be a part-time administrator for \$9/hour. On the second day of the job, the Chamber

president, Barbara Bizzarri, said, "By the way, we run a farmers market in Winfield. We have five farmers' stands and running the market will be part of your job."

This summer, 27 years after taking that part-time job, Rich has grown the Winfield Farmers Market to more than 40 vendors. But with the growth, its four major farm-

ers have been there since back in the 1990s. Even back then, as it is today, the weekly farmers market was on Wednesdays, from 7am to 1pm, in the Prairie Trail Center parking lot.

2023 is the market's 30th anniversary! Rich does such a great job taking care of the vendors that almost 90% of them return year after year. The market has become a social event for Rich and the vendors, and many have become friends over the years. Rich enjoys treating them with root beer floats on the first day of summer, and with virgin peach margaritas with peaches from Gundersen Orchards and Noffke Family Farms on the July day when their peaches reach their ultimate flavor.

Rich encourages the vendors to be good neighbors to each other throughout their time at the market (6 hours every Wednesday, June through October). Everyone gets along and watches each other's tents when they need a break. Some of the produce vendors, particularly Stojan Family Farm, have begun donating leftover produce to local food banks through their relationship with GardenWorks Project.

A Vendors Directory with descriptions of the goods or services, along with contact information, is available in the main aisle of the market every week. Three of the weekly vendors have their storefronts located in Winfield: David Nelson's Farmers Insurance, Gracie's Petals Boutique, and Manbot Coffee's The Station. Three other vendors are Winfield residents: Juarez's Sewing Room,

Dave's Atomic Hot Sauces, and Julie Michelin's Mary Kay cosmetics. Any resident can reach Rich at *sezwhorich@gmail.com*.

If Rich could choose a mascot for the Farmers Market, it would be, without a doubt, Bugs Bunny. An absolute natural fresh produce promoter, Bugs loves carrots, which of course are sold at the market. Bugs also shares the exact same birthday with Rich...they are both 82 years young!

As repeat kids' promotions from 2022, Bugs will be featured on coloring sheets during his birthday month of July. And come October, Sparky the Fire

A time capsule is now tucked away inside the frontage wall of the new Northwestern Medicine Winfield Town Center Medical Office Building across from Village Hall. Village officials and Chamber of Commerce members were joined by representatives of Northwestern Medicine to dedicate the time capsule on May 2, 2023.


Centennial memorabilia and offerings from a spectrum of local entities have been sealed away for a future generation to discover. The box is full of items describing the world today. It includes articles about local development, COVID-19 and influential people. Middle school students wrote letters to the future citizens of Winfield.

Objects include a signed 12-inch softball from the June 2021 16U Girls League victory, a Winfit Criterium cowbell, a Winfield 2021 Centennial Token, a Casey's mug & Amazon shipping bag, banners honoring Winfield graduates and so much more. See the full list on page 2.

"It has been fantastic to gather all this information from the community to capture the flavor of Winfield at this moment in time," said Carl Sorgatz, president, Village of Winfield.

The capsule is protected by a decorative stone that reads "Elsen". It is a replica of the piece that adorned the top of the Elsen Building that previously stood on the same block. The building's earliest uses included a general store and post

office before it was purchased in 1947 for John's Buffet restaurant. After the restaurant closed in 2017, Northwestern Medicine purchased the property

"We have a strong partnership with the Village of Winfield to bring vitality and energy to downtown Winfield," said Kenneth Hedley, president, Northwestern Medicine Central DuPage Hospital. "This time capsule will preserve this milestone for future generations."

The Northwestern Medicine medical office building, which houses ophthalmology, allergy and urology services, is a significant development for Winfield Town Center, a partnership with the Village of Winfield to revitalize the downtown district. As part of the project, Northwestern Medicine also constructed a four-level parking deck with ground-floor retail and restaurant space; and developed Riverwalk Park, including new pathways, a band shell, picnic shelter, and a bean bag toss and bocce court.







## **Lisle Couple Share Stories of Country Estates in DuPage County**

Winfield Library successfully presented another fascinating Winfield Historical Society program

called "Gentleman Farmers of DuPage County -Their Country Estates" on May 9th. Mayslake Peabody Estate volunteer Linda Neff and her husband Drew mapped out and showed images of these experimental farms and rural retreats created in DuPage County.

Beginning in the 1890s, wealthy Chicagoans, who made millions of dollars selling

salt, coal, newspapers, or commodities, began buying property in DuPage County, piece by piece until they amassed upwards of 1,000 acres each. These vast estates became private summer retreats, experimental livestock breeding farms and places of employment for many within our county.



Each site offers much to explore, such as beautiful old mansions, flowering formal gardens, peaceful reflecting pools, equestrian buildings, and acres of exotic and an-

## Fire District Transformed by New Hires, Retirement, Promotion

2023 is a summer of change at the Winfield Fire Protection District.

June 1 was a special day for Lt. Pete Daly – it was the first day he hadn't carried a pager to alert him to fire alarms since he started as a volunteer firefighter in March of 1980. In 1984 he became a full-time firefighter and in 1988 was promoted to Lieutenant. He has outlasted at least 11 different fire trucks during his dedicated service to the community! His retirement is also significant because Lt. Daly is the first paid firefighter to retire from our fire district.

"Pete's knowledge and love for this community has been deeply appreciated and he will be missed by all of us. I thank him for his service and dedication to this community that he loves so much," said Chief Evans.

June 1 was also the date that Firefighter/Paramedic Matt Smith was promoted to Lieutenant. He began serving Winfield in November 2009. He is an Army veteran and served in Afghanistan before his time in Winfield.

Trustees, community members, fire fighters and their families also celebrated the swearing in of five new members. Leah Berrisford, Kai Pavlick, Carl Michalek, Nicolas Nichols, and Robert Wangles were joined by their families for a swearing-in ceremony. These five new firefighter/paramedics have already begun working on shift. Three of the people hired are "new" positions; each shift will receive one new crew member. There are now six crew per shift.

Fire Chief Evans points out, "The hiring of these new firefighter/paramedics allows us to better serve our community with the growing number of calls that we have as we implement the plan that we outlined during the referendum."

Federal grant funds were awarded in May to cover most of the cost of the three additional new staff members for three years. Our representative in Congress was instrumental in obtaining the funds which are anticipated to save local taxpayers about \$682,500.







# Winfield Park Dist. awarded IDNR-OSLAD Grant for Founders Park

The grants represent the largest round of Open Space Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) grants in the 36-year history of the program.

The redevelopment of Founders Park aims to refurbish the existing sports fields while providing new opportunities to satisfy community demand for new recreational equipment to follow the Winfield

Park District's vision as identified in the 2019-2024 Capital Development Plan. "After we completed the expansion of the C.R.Begg Activity Center in 2022, we immediately turned our attention to improve the adjacent park site " stated Executive Director, Mark Pawlowski. He added, "The IDNR support for the \$1.3mil project will be a long-lasting benefit to the Winfield community".

The redevelopment of Founders Park aims to create accessible paths to all existing and new recreational elements, while creating a trail loop. New recreation features include a new challenge course for kids, pre-teens and teens, two pickleball courts, a new shelter area with picnic

tables, a beginner fitness area for adults, and a gaga ball pit. The current playground is well past its useful life and is inaccessible. A new and exciting playground will be built as a central feature of the new amenities and adjacent to the new shelter. A new futsal field will be created, and one existing baseball field will be renovated. Finally, the introduction of a rain garden to this site will help manage runoff and act as an educational resource for park guests. Construction of the project is expected to be completed by late Spring of 2024.


#### RUTH MARIE MALAY

### Mobile Apps Offer New Ways to Move your Money

Peer-to-peer payment, also known as P2P, is gaining popularity because it lets you transfer money to friends and family without knowing account details; simply search under someone's name or phone number. The P2P payment system eliminates the need for physical cash as the transactions are done using an app on your phone. First, download the app on your phone (Zelle, Venmo, Cash App, and PayPal are the most widely used). Second, set up an account on the app. Third, link your bank, credit card or debit card to the new account.

Here's a common example - you're having dinner at a restaurant with friends and one of them offers to charge the entire bill to their card. To pay for your share, you open your P2P money transfer app, find the name of the friend from your contacts list, input the dollar amount of your share, and send money to the recipient.

Nerdwallet found that – among those who already use mobile payment apps - 53% are using them primarily to pay for online purchases through retailers. Paying back friends or family members was the second most common reason at 43%, followed by paying bills at 40%.

Most transactions, such as payments to friends and family, are free, but there are some fees for added services. When transferring a balance to a bank account, there's a choice to transfer within one to three business days or instantly. Instant transfer comes with a 1% fee on PayPal, while Venmo charges a 1.5% fee. Similarly, payments involving cash - either from a balance in your P2P account or cash

from your bank account - are free, but payments using a credit card come with a transaction fee.

Beyond paying a friend, there may be trusted vendors in which using P2P apps make sense, such as an electrician or babysitter. But using it with a merchant you don't know, and just hoping the merchandise will show up, is risky.

Venmo offers the opportunity to check a "goods and services" button when paying and requires the seller to pay a small transaction fee. This can become more important if making a purchase with a vendor you don't know, haven't used before, and it is not coming from a credit card account tied to your P2P app.

Likewise, be wary of people you don't know asking for money via P2P payment systems. Payment apps have also made it easy for scammers to prey on unsuspecting users.

Increasingly, people are using mobile payment apps as de facto bank accounts. In their study, Nerdwallet found that two-thirds of mobile payment app users maintain an average balance of \$287. However, mobile payment apps, unlike banks or credit unions, are not FDIC insured. If anything ever happened to the company, your money would be gone.

Many apps are offering more traditional banking services. Some, like PayPal and Venmo, offer credit cards. You can now get your paycheck deposited into a mobile payment app. Through Cash App and PayPal, it's possible to buy and hold cryptocurrency. Cash App allows people to file taxes through Credit Karma Tax and PayPal offers a line of credit.

Consumer Reports recommends a number of steps consumers can take to help minimize potential risks:

Confirm the recipient's identity before sending money. Do that with a phone number, email address, or a QR code. Cash App, Venmo and Zelle give users the ability to scan a QR code that appears on the recipient's device.

Send a \$1 test payment and confirm it was received by the right person. That's especially important if you are sending a lot of money.

Move money from your P2P account to your bank account as soon as possible. That ensures your funds are FDIC insured in your bank.

Turn on all identity verification options available in the P2P app. With those features activated, anyone trying to use the account will have to go through additional security measures, such as two-factor authentication.

Frequently monitor your P2P accounts. You may be able to catch problems early enough to report it to companies and not be on the hook for unauthorized payments.

Delete any P2P app you don't use. It's not enough to simply remove the app from your phone; instead, to make sure you've closed and deleted the account, select the "delete account" option within


