Christ Hospital in Jersey City has been delivering quality healthcare to Hudson County for more than 140 years. Hoboken University Medical Center is a 303 bed acute care hospital located in Hoboken, NJ. The hospital was founded in 1863 as St. Mary Hospital and opened during the American Civil War as a location to treat the returning wounded and was the second hospital ever to open in the State of New Jersey. It operated under the name St. Mary Hospital until 2007. The name was changed to HUMC and was purchased by CarePoint Health in 2011. It is the longest operating hospital in NJ.

HUMC is where residents rotate for inpatient Pediatrics and OB/Gyn rotations.

Bayonne Medical Center is a 278-bed, fully accredited, acute-care hospital. Since opening its doors more than a century ago, it has provided quality, comprehensive, community- based healthcare services to more than 70,000 people annually. Bayonne Medical Center is committed to staying at the forefront of medical technology. A new cardiac catheterization suite complements the hospital's state-of-the-art cardiac services, while a fully renovated oncology suite includes PET/CT imaging.



Program Goals and Objectives

The overall goal of the Christ Hospital Family Medicine residency training program is to produce physicians who can competently and independently practice Family medicine and serve as a consultant to other physicians. The Family Medicine Residency at CarePoint Health- Christ Hospital is 36 months in duration. The program is hospital based and follows the Traditional FM Track as identified by the American College of Osteopathic Family Physicians and the ACGME. Patient volume and scope at the medical center is excellent and provides a superior environment for training in diagnosis and management of common and complex disease processes in a broad range of patients. Ambulatory experiences are structured, supervised, and adequate to develop excellent skills in ambulatory patient management in a continuity of care environment. Family Medicine Residents follow the requirements for training as established in their Training Manual.

Following completion of the Family Medicine residency training program, residents will be able to:

- Apply established and evolving knowledge in the biomedical, clinical, epidemiological and social behavioral sciences to the care of their patients.
- Provide compassionate, appropriate, and effective patient care by:
 - a) obtaining and using data about a patient (history, physical examination, laboratory and imaging studies) to create a differential diagnosis, plan for further evaluation, and comprehensively manage patients with a variety of disorders
 - b) developing a therapeutic relationship with patients and their families, identifying and addressing health care needs collaboratively in a patient-centered context.
- Improve the patient care that they provide by continuously assessing their performance, incorporating feedback and pursuing learning related to identified improvement opportunities.
- Function effectively within the health care system beyond the clinical encounter, utilizing available resources to provide optimal health care for patients with a variety of disorders.
- Conduct their professional life in accordance with the expectations of the profession of medicine and society, manifested through a commitment to carrying out professional responsibilities, adherence to ethical principles, and sensitivity to patients of diverse backgrounds.
- Pursue a career in medicine and developing as a leader in their chosen field, improving health in areas such as patient care, biomedical research, population medicine, health policy, or international health medicine.



Overall Goals for Rotations

Residents will evaluate and provide longitudinal care to patients in the outpatient continuity clinic setting. Duties will include health maintenance visits, acute care visits, and chronic disease management visits. Residents will assess and manage patients with acute illness on the inpatient hospital services, including the general medicine, medical subspecialty and intensive care rotations. Residents will also function as medical and specialty consultants to other hospital providers. The program will provide the resident with graded responsibility for planning the course of care and communication with the patient and family. Throughout their work, residents will apply medical knowledge, learn about patient problems through practice-based learning and optimize care venues through systems-based learning and problem solving. Residents will develop effective interpersonal and communication skills when interacting with patients, their families, and members of the health care team. In addition, residents will assume professional responsibility for their tasks, placing the care of the patient above other interests.

The objectives for each rotation, as well as program curriculum, rotation schedule for entire training period, teaching faculty roster including certification and academic appointment status, Core competency plan, sample trainee evaluation forms, work hours and leave policy and trainee remediation policy are included as separate documents as part of the pre-review document preparation.

Residency Highlights:

- 1. Dr. Tsompanidis becomes the Director of Medical Education and Program Director in July 2009 and revamps the entire program. At the time, the program consists of 15 residents with a large TRI class.
- 2. The AOBFP Board Exam pass rate was 82% in 2009. The pass rate becomes and has been 100% since Dr. Tsompanidis became the PD.
- 3. Christ Hospital is purchased by CarePoint Health in 2012 and becomes the third hospital in the system.
- 4. By 2012, the Family Medicine Residency changes and increases to 21 residents with a majority of residents in FM.
- 5. The Neighborhood Health Center opens in 2012 providing another site for outpatient continuity and provides health care to the community regardless of insurance.
- 6. In 2014, the AOA inspects the FM program, the TRI program and the institution and grants us a five year inspection approval and currently ACGME Initial Accreditation.
- 7. In 2015, a women's health emphasis track is started.



- 8. In 2016, Dr. Tsompanidis became the System Director of Medical Education for Christ Hospital and Bayonne Medical Center as well as the PD for the TRI program at Bayonne.
- 9. In 2017, one of our residents, Jessica Edwards, D.O. was named the ACOFP/AOA Family Medicine Resident of the Year.
- **10.** In 2017 Christ Hospital and Bayonne Medical Center were named by Leapfrog as Top Teaching Hospitals



- 11. In 2018, Dr. Tsompanidis became the Chief Academic Officer for Chris Hospital and Bayonne Medical Center. Christ's FM residency applies for ACGME accreditation and receives preliminary accreditation.
- 12. 4 of the Hospitalists/Nocturnists on staff are graduates of the program.
- 13. The Associate Program Director is a former graduate and chief resident of the program.
- 14. Graduates of the program are prepared for outpatient practice as well as inpatient or hospitalist practice.
- 15. Resident have successfully applied for Fellowships in Women's Health, OB/Gyn, Sports Medicine, and Geriatrics. Recently one of our graduates completed a 1 year Emergency Medicine fellowship. In addition, one of our graduates is in a World Health Organization fellowship overseas.
- 16. Our graduates succeed upon graduation. One of our graduates is the Medical Director for the NJ State Police while another oversees medical care for United Airlines in Newark. Others have become lead hospitalists or medical directors at systems around the country.
- 17. Many of our former TRI's became chief residents in their respective residencies.
- 18. Our hospital was an epicenter ground zero hospital during COVID-19. Multiple articles were written about our institution. Our hospital was at the forefront of treatment protocols providing remdesivir in April as well as ECMO for severe cases. A list of news stories and articles:
