Safety Officer - My input for the July newsletter is very long but I will be very short (relatively speaking) and give details at the meeting.

On the evening of June 13, I started having chest pains. Although it was painful to breathe, I was not having difficulty breathing nor did I display other signs of a heart attack. Tuesday morning the pain was still there so I contacted my doctor. She advised me to rest and gave the option of coming in Wednesday morning or going to an emergency health clinic. I opted for the visit to my personal doctor the next day. After a battery of tests, a heart attack was ruled out. The pain was caused by muscular/skeletal abnormalities.

I give you those details to tell what the results were. I was given an antibiotic steroid. I had never taken this medication so I did not know how I would react. The list of side effects was long and varied. I started the regimen on June 16 (my birthday). By evening the next day, I was experiencing 4 of the listed side effects. In my 74 years, I have never experimented with psychedelic drugs. Had I done so, I'm guessing it would have been similar to what I went through.

That being said, here my advice to you. If you are prescribed a medication you have never taken before, read the list of side effects and be ready when they happen. It may save your life.
