Greetings, Brothers & Sisters in Christ!

May Day, Cinco de Mayo, Mother's Day, Armed Forces Day, Graduations, Memorial Day and Ascension Day are the celebrations on the calendar for May. It will be a busy month as we complete a school year for the students and teachers and a program year in the church. I begin the month of May with a much-needed vacation. There are times when life just explodes and pretty much sucks the life right out of you and you need to refuel before you crash and burn! And even on vacation, we have three funerals/visitations, a work event for Scott and an appointment for my father-in-law in Iowa City. I'm at a loss on how to tame down my calendar and start living a life that allows for some down time. Do you struggle with this too? It has just been non-stop for several months, and as I look back, it has been too busy for several years. When I return from vacation, or maybe even while I'm on vacation, I'm going to spend some time praying about how I can get life under control. It might mean saying no to some things and delegating other things. Maybe we all need to do this. Before you start cutting all your church activities, remember that they should be at the top of the list of what you need to keep doing, and letting go of other things.

The month of April was a sacred and meaningful time, finishing up our Lenten journey with the devotional "Sanctuary for Lent" and remembering the events of the triumphal entry on Palm Sunday, the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the public condemnation and crucifixion on Good Friday and the mystery of the awesome gift of resurrection on Easter Sunday. Lent is a time when we contem-

plate and confess our sins and meditate on and give thanks for the great sacrifice of Christ who died on the cross for us. Then we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and the gift of forgiveness and everlasting life that we receive because of his obedience to God. It is the high point of the Christian calendar. Where do we go from here? How do we take up our cross and follow Christ from this day forward? What does God expect from us to be faithful disciples and witnesses of the resurrection and live a resurrection life? Each of us must discern what God is calling us to do to live out the commandment that Jesus gave when gathered in the Upper Room with his disciples:

³⁴ "I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other. ³⁵ This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other." John 13:34-35 Common English Bible

I hope that drawing close to God, reading a devotional and spending time in prayer will become a daily habit for you and will not just be a Lenten discipline you tried for a time. This time each morning grounds and centers me, reminding me that "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." But also reminds me that there are things that I need to set aside so I can do the things God wants me to do. Let us all spend time thinking about what God wants us to hang on to and what God wants us to let go of. This allows us to show love for ourselves and have more quality time to show love to others.

Administrative Council April 2025 Minutes

April 14, 2025 - Pastor Lisa offered prayer to begin our meeting. Pastor reviewed March and April activities. Ragbrai organizational meeting dates are April 17 and May 21.

Minutes of the March 10, 2025 meeting were read and approved with the correction that Leon Goedken will make a shelf for the new equipment cabinet.

TREASURER gave her report with all bills paid. It was again noted that offerings have been decreasing. We have been giving the interest earned from two small trusts to Starmont Schools Dollars for Scholars. We have no functioning financial committee and have not made an effort to explain the church finances to the general congregation.

TRUSTEES are waiting for D&S Portables to come to root out the plumbing. A lamp shade in the sanctuary was broken and will be replaced.

PARSONAGE nothing to report.

MEMORIALS have a balance in account is \$2,250.87.

UWF Grief Support Group has had an attendance between 9 and 11 people. The group has met three times and continues to invite new people. Garage & Bake Sale dates are April 24, 25 & 26. Goodwill truck will pick up items on Tuesday, April 29. Time not known yet for the truck to be at the church. The group

has made donations for three children to attend camp. We also made a \$250 donation to cover the cost of two solar light kits to be sent to the Ukraine. The district UWF Shepherdess for our group is scheduled to come to the May meeting. Two quarters of our pledge to the district UWF has been paid.

MISSIONS March Mission Madness event was attended and reported on by JoAnn Crow. The UMYF donated \$125 for one solar light kit. Thirty East food boxes were filled on April 14. Several were delivered.

YOUTH UMYF will go the Aurora Youth Program on Wednesday, April 16. Sunday School and UMYF will be ending for the season at a date yet to be determined.

AUDIO/VISUAL Updated instructions have been left for operation when the Lamphier's are gone.

ADMIN ASSISTANT Paper plates and napkins have been ordered for church use. Replacement refills for the foil and plastic film dispensers are being sought. SIPS Downtown Lamont (Lamphier's business), has donated \$200 to our food pantry from a fundraiser.

OTHER Discussion occurred about possible Ragbrai participation.

RAGBRAI will come thru town July 26.


Pastor will be on vacation Apr. 28-May 12.

In Memory of Betty Opitz


