Greetings, Brothers & Sisters in Christ!

January was a rollercoaster of a month -no snow, then lots of snow, warmer temperatures than usual, then below zero for
a week or so, and then 30's-40's and rain!
Yet, it was a fun-filled month with the
celebrations of Epiphany, the Baptism of
Jesus, the Calling of the Disciples, Human
Relations Sunday and a worship service
with our lowa Annual Conference Bishop
Kennetha. We celebrated baptisms in
Aurora and reaffirmed our baptisms in all
three churches. Now prepare for the
month of February!

We never know what the weather will be like in February, but at least we can count on celebrating lots of love during the month with Valentine's Day on February 14! This year the day is especially unique because Ash Wednesday is on the same day! Valentine's Day is celebrated with candy, cards, special dinners and the warmest of feelings. Ash Wednesday is somber, putting ashes on our foreheads and remembering our sin and mortality. Seems like quite a contrast, doesn't it? Yet, as we look at those crosses smeared in ash on our skin, we remember the darkness of our sins taken away by the sacrifice of Christ on a cross on another dark day later in Lent, Good Friday. In our sins and death, we also remember our new life and resurrection through Jesus Christ. Ash Wednesday service will be offered on February 14 at 6:00 in Strawberry and we will incorporate sharing ashes on Sunday, February 18 at 9:00 Lamont and 10:30 in Aurora.

Our journey during the Lenten Season is a time to reflect on our sins in the light of the love Christ shows in dying in our place and reconciling us with God, making the way for our forgiveness and our resurrection from death. Our Lenten Study will

focus on a book written by Bishop Tom Berlin, who serves in the Florida episcopal area. Berlin provides a fresh insight not just into how the Resurrection affected the lives of those at the time, but how it is relevant to ours as we reflect on this world-changing, life-transforming event that literally changed everything. What a way God shows his love to us!

Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. The exclusion of Sundays from the 40-day count is rooted in the traditional Christian belief that Sundays are a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Since Sundays are considered a day of joy and not a day of fasting or penance, they are not included in the calculation of the 40 days of Lent. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and an opportunity to go deeper with God. These 40 days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord; to read the Bible more, and to pray more often. The purpose of Lent is to fully recognize our brokenness as humans and the need for a Savior. The time period of Lent allows us to reflect and open our hearts to Jesus. As you spend time with God in the coming days of the Lenten Season, be sure to express your love for God and give thanks for God's mercy and love to you!



Are You A Disciple of Jesus?

A pastor transformed himself into a homeless person and went to the church that he was to be introduced as the head pastor at that morning. He walked around his soon to be church for 30 minutes while it was filling with people for service. Only 3 people said hello to him, most looked the other way. He asked people for change to buy food because he was hungry. Not one gave him anything.

He went into the sanctuary to sit down in the front of the church and was told by the ushers that he would need to get up and go sit n the back of the church. He said hello to people as they walked in but was greeted with cold stares and dirty looks from people looking down on him and judging him.

He sat in the back of the church and listened to the church announcements for the week. He listened as new visitors were welcomed into the church that morning but no one acknowledged that he was new. He watched people around him continue to look his way with stares that said you are not welcome here.

Then the elders of the church went to the podium to make the announcement. They said they were excited to introduce the new pastor of the church to the congregation. "We would like to introduce you to our new Pastor." The congregation stood up and looked around clapping with joy and anticipation. The homeless man sitting in the back stood up and started walking down the aisle.

That's when all the clapping stopped and the church was silent. With all eyes on him....he walked up the altar and reached for the microphone. He stood there for a moment and then recited so elegantly, a verse from the bible....

"Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord,

when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?'

"The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for the least of my brothers and sisters, you did for me.'

After he recited this, he introduced himself as their new pastor and told the congregation what he had experienced that morning. Many began to cry and bow their heads in shame. "Today I see a gathering of people here but I do not see a church of Jesus. The world has enough people that look the other way. What the world needs is disciples of Jesus that can follow this teachings and live as he did. When will YOU decide to become disciples?


