Greetings, Brothers & Sisters in Christ!

We turn the page to January and invite a new year to begin. The Christian tradition for New Year's Eve or New Year's Day is a "watch night" service to review the past year and prepare for the year ahead by making plans for ways to be a faithful disciple in the coming year. Normally included in this service is the Wesley Covenant Prayer which renews our commitment to God. This prayer helps us remember what a life of being a Jesus-follower looks like and what loving God with all our heart, soul, mind and loving our neighbor as ourselves requires of us. It describes a mission life devoted to following Jesus and serving as Christ's representative in the world he loves and is working to redeem. This prayer tells us that being a Christian is more a way of life than a system of beliefs. This way of living and loving is possible only in a community centered in the life and mission of the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. We will pray this Covenant Prayer several times as we begin the year and is also included in this newsletter for you to pray and meditate on.

Our January celebrations don't end with New Year's Day! As we come to the end of the Christmas Season (12 days of Christmas) we find Epiphany on January 6, which we celebrate on Sunday, January 7. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek word which means to "manifest" or "show." We also call it a "revelation" as "the revealing of Christ to the Gentiles is represented by the Magi, or three kings or three wise men" in Matthew. The Son of God is "revealed" to outsiders and shows Christ is not only for those of the Jewish faith. This Messiah came to save us all, Jews and Gentiles! These magi are believed to be priests from Persia, who studied the

stars since they followed the star to find Jesus. We normally display three of them, since there were three gifts given: gold, frankincense and myrrh. But scholars tell us there may have been more than three, and women may have been among them. We are all invited to participate in and experience this revelation of Christ to the world.

An "epiphany" in today's terms is defined as a "moment of sudden revelation or insight." We see it as a grasp of reality or clarity that brings a perception or meaning that has been missed before and brings new attitudes and perceptions. It is a moment in time when you suddenly feel that you understand, or become conscious of, something that is very important to you. In this time of finishing one year and beginning another, we are called to deny ourselves and take up our cross to follow Jesus. May we find new insights, see the light of Christ leading us, and become renewed in our passion to be conscious of God's purpose and plan for each of us which may give us new opportunities and ideas! We are called to turn our hearts toward Jesus, keeping the light of the world at the center of our lives and of all that

Ad Council

December 11, 2023

Pastor Lisa began the meeting with prayer. The agenda was approved as presented. Minutes of the November 13, 2023 meeting were approved as read.

Treasurer reported all bills paid to date. Year end reports will be completed soon.

Pastor reviewed her November activities. A new circuit for pastoral support has been formed. An event for all churches will occur on January 13. This will include lay people as well as pastors. A limited number of postcards had been sent out highlighting Christmas activities in all three churches.

SPRC: The SPRC recommends the Ad Council approve a \$50 per month raise for the secretary. End of year forms will be completed. Another Set of Eyes forms will be done. Notice had been received that the church may pay all yearly apportionments at one time.

TRUSTEES: LED conversions had been done in the toy room, senior Sunday School room and tech room off the sanctuary. Eventually all florescent lights will be placed with LED's.

UWF: United Women in All 2023 obligations Faith. have been met. Additional funds will be given to Women at the Well Prision Ministry; Families Forward (Des Moines are mission projects); United Methodist Camp Ministry Fund; Coats for Kids, a Strawberry Point Community Mission project. Giving Tree tags will be taken by the group, so that all children will receive Christmas Four Special Mission Recognition pins will be presented.

<u>PARSONAGE:</u> No results on radon testing

YOUTH: Christmas program will be December 17 in Lamont. UMYF Christmas party December 20th. UMYF fundraiser of Cookies in a Jar is ongoing.

MISSIONS: Dollar Fresh, Dyersville, donations have been received. December 18 the Christmas Food boxes will be packed.

MEMORIALS: Light repair bill will be paid. Balance in accounts is \$5,209.83.

AUDIO/VISUAL: Grant proposal has been sent. Jarrod may meet with a person who has had a system installed to review how it works.

ADM. ASSISTANT: An email has been received about the death of Elaine Sheldon Akerly and inquiry about services and reception June 28-July 5 time frame.

OLD BUSINESS: Ad Assistant estimates 30-40 hours a month spent on various tasks. Motion was made by JoAnn Crow, seconded by John Richmond to give the secretary an additional \$50 per month Approved. Custodian raise. Steve Hutchinson has been doing an excellent job. After discussion, the council agreed to offer him additional hours of work. He may also assist in snow shovelings if needed.


