Greetings, Brothers & Sisters in Christ!

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

As we enter the month of March, we continue our Lenten journey. Lent is considered a 40-day period that reminds us of the death of Christ on the cross to pay for our sins. But we also remember that this season ends with a celebration of his resurrection on Easter. We begin the season of Lent in the midst of winter when it is a dreary and dark, with short days and lack of sunshine. The cold temperatures make us want to hibernate and the lack of sunshine makes us lethargic and have a lack of energy. The weather matches the emotions of Lent as we think about the how devasting sin and death are to us; we want to hide from our sins and feel hopeless in our failure.

But now as we begin March, the snow has all melted and we've had more sunshine which has brought us some warm days and the hint of spring coming! As we have been reflecting on the sacrifice of Christ, we have also focused on the joy of the resurrection in our Lenten study and worship. We find the joy in knowing the love God showed and his intention to save us from our sins. The resurrection of Jesus on Easter morning not only affected the lives of those who witnessed his death, crucifixion and resurrection, but it is relevant and has teaching moments for all of us. This was a world-changing event that transforms lives, and the world was never the same because of what God has done through Jesus Christ. Suffering, sin and death no longer have the last word in our lives. There is always the opportunity for forgiveness, new beginnings, hope for the future and new opportunities to serve God in response to what God has done for us. We face the realities of our human condition and the brokenness of the world, but see things in a different


light – in the light of Christ – as we witness the unfailing presence of God's resurrection power, again and again. And now we know of the victory over death.

We have studied the story of Mary Magdalene, the first witness to the resurrected Jesus. Next, we hear from Simon Peter, who denied Jesus three times and was then called to the foundation on which Jesus would build the church. Then we hear from Thomas, who needed to see the resurrected Jesus face-to-face to believe in his resurrection. We walk with the disciples on the road to Emmaus who discover their companion is the resurrected Jesus. Then the story of Paul who went from the greatest persecutor of the early Christians, to being the greatest apostle. And finally, we hear words from Christ's teachings. "Turn to me and be saved, all you ends of the earth, for I am God, and there's no other."







February 12, 2024

Pastor Lisa began the meeting with prayer. The agenda was approved as presented. Minutes of the December 11, 2023 meeting were read and approved. (No meeting in January.)

Treasurer reported all bills were paid to date. Information on various church accounts is being gathered for auditing.

Pastor Lisa reviewed her activities.

Statistical Reports forms and year end reports were done. She had met with the custodian to review and amend his job description. Pastor also presented additional expenses paid to D. Vanwie for his help shepherding B. Krum to doctor's appointments and to the shelter in Waterloo. Lenten Study will being February 19 at 4pm in Strawberry and 6pm in Lamont. UMYF will consider doing an Easter breakfast at 8am on March 31st. Living Last Supper will not be done this year. Performances may be done every other year and could alternate with a Live Nativity. The Bishop will be hosting a Town Hall Meeting March 10 from 2-4pm at Waverly Trinity. Elaine Sheldon Akerly's funeral is planned for July 1st. We will be having a new District Superintendent. Moody Colorado is returning to regular ministry. The new D. S. is Scott Keele Kober. A Hunger Grant application for our food pantry has been applied for. The church as been asked to donate to the Starmont Post Prom Apportionment celebration. amounts for 2024 are \$8,108 for Lamont and \$2,663 for Aurora. Pastor Lisa proposed we combine SPRC and Ad Council meetings into one hour each month. Sensitive items would require a closed SPRC meeting. This proposal will be put on the agenda for our March meeting.

TRUSTEES: Older refrigerator in church kitchen has been replaced with a L new model. New outlet receptacle was installed to replace a faulty one. Root destroyer was put down the kitchen sinks.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH: New year beings this week and pledges will be taken. World Day of Prayer is planned for March 1. Garage Sale will be planned for the end of April. Scrap metal drive will also be arranged, if possible.

PARSONAGE: No results on radon testing.

YOUTH: Valentine party planned for February 21. The UMYF donated \$150 to Starmont's emergency clothing fund. A group photo appeared in the Press-Journal. Easter breakfast will be discussed.

MISSIONS: Report of 2023 statistics of our food pantry was given as follows: East boxes (27) including meat = \$1620 pounds; Thanksgiving boxes (27) including turkeys = 1674 pounds; Christmas boxes (26) including hams = 1508 pounds; regular orders given out (26) 710 pounds approx value \$1420. Our pantry gave out 4076 pounds of meat and extra grocery items to mobile food pantry persons. This last project

was made possible by the generous donations of Dollar Fresh Market in Dyersville and Casey's in Strawberry Point.

March 13 meeting lesson leader will be Carol Ellis, hostess will be Cathy Cardenas.



According to Matthew, Jesus was preaching to 5,000 people and dusk was starting to set in, supper was long overdue, stomachs were starting to growl, and all there was to eat were two fish and five loaves of bread. The disciples were aware of the



predicament. They said to Jesus, in effect, "This is a sticky situation, and we can't do anything about it anyway. Let's take what we have gathered and go away and eat!"

By nature there is some of that mentality in all of us. Whenever God places us in a situation that challenges us to use our time and talent, and to invest some of ourselves in finding a solution to someone's problem or need, our first response is to remove ourselves from the problem.

Matthew was an eyewitness to the event. Can you imagine the joyful satisfaction ... the uplift in faith Matthew experienced when he was able to write, "But everyone ate, and there was more than enough. They gathered twelve baskets full of leftovers!"

Do you think there could be any symbolic significance to the fact that there were twelve baskets full? One for each disciple? Enough to satisfy their needs for days to come? And all because they trusted God and had the joy and satisfaction that comes with being a partner with Jesus? A partner in his ministry of love and service.

For that matter, some of the most tired, worn out at times, almost burnt out disciples at every church have become that way because

they have a difficult time saying "no" when our Lord calls them to join hands with him in using their time and talent to serve their church. Tired? Yes! Weary? Yes! But then, you should be let in on a little secret: You should see their "baskets"!
